

In 2009 she took over the arts beat at the *Statesman Journal*. She enjoys covering the arts scene in Salem including live theater, film, music & books.

She told us how she remembers when she was 11 years old her father took her to a live performance of *The*  Music Man staring Robert Preston on Broadway. Ever since then, she has been interested in the arts and when she was in high school she started playing the french horn which she still plays today with the Willamette Valley Concert Band.
