Guest Speaker

Mark Oldencamp is a modern day egg farmer. And he pointed out that in the 33 years he has been in the



business of farming, many many things have changed. Technology has had a huge impact on agriculture. Mark is chair of the Animal Welfare Committee in Oregon. He operates an egg producing facility in Woodburn. The facility has 780,000 hens that produce eggs for about 2

years. Eggs are a good source of complete protein, vitamins B12, D & E and do not contain any hormones. They also are less caloric than other protein foods such as chicken, pork and beef. The average cost per serving of

eggs is 16¢.

The future of housing for hens is moving toward Enriched Colony Housing as shown below. Cage free hens have issues including sanitary and health issues.
