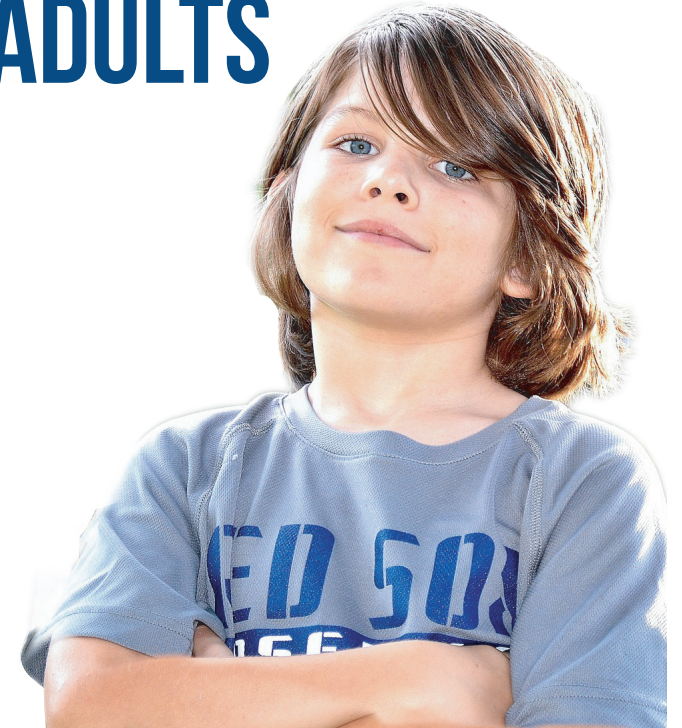

# THE CHAMPION FOR CHILDREN

Since 1956 the Twin City Kiwanis Club has united adults of all ages, backgrounds, occupations and interests who want to make our community a better place for children.

We are devoted to evaluating children's needs in Winston-Salem, and to conducting innovative service projects and fundraising initiatives that respond to those needs.

Our signature fundraising event is our annual Pancake Jamboree (PanJam) that raises money for local organizations that serve children. Other annual projects include:

# SERVING YOUTH AROUND THE WORLD

Kiwanis International, founded in 1915 and headquartered in Indianapolis, Indiana, is a thriving organization with more than 14,000 adult and youth clubs in 85 countries, totalling more than 445,000 members.

Kiwanis clubs view their role in their communities with a great sense of responsibility.

This includes:

- Evaluating children's issues and community needs on an ongoing basis;
- Conducting service projects that respond to those needs; and
- Maintaining an active membership roster of community-minded people who have both the desire and the ability to serve.

Service projects often are linked to the Kiwanis program "Young Children: Priority One." This initiative focuses on the needs of children in pediatric trauma, safety, child care, early development, infant health, nutrition and parenting skills.

Service projects also can address other needs within the community, such as working to stop substance abuse, promoting literacy, supporting youth sports and responding to disasters.
