




Twin City Kiwanis Club Speaker Information

Thank you for being a speaker at our weekly meeting. We meet Wednesdays at Centenary Methodist Church in downtown Winston-Salem. You should use the 4 ½ Street entrance and will find a Church parking lot across the street.



We typically have between thirty (30) and thirty-five (35) members and guests in attendance. The meeting officially lasts from 12 Noon to 1:00 PM with, depending on the business at hand, a prayer being offered, a group song sung, and the Pledge of Allegiance recited about 12:20 or so. Normally, the program starts at about 12:30 and finishes at 1:00 PM. Members tend to arrive between 11:30 and 11:45 for networking and you would be very welcome to join both in the networking and participate in any setup needed.

The meal is served buffet style and is typically available starting between 11:50 and Noon.

WIFI is available with CUMC0819 as the password.

Typically, speakers use their own computer if one is needed. If you need to have one provided, please let us know in advance so we can bring one to the meeting.

A large screen, wall mounted LCD screen is available for slides or videos. The screen is available by casting to it via the WIFI connection. If an Apple computer is used, the Apple Airdrop system works well. If a Windows computer is used, pressing the Windows key and "k" key simultaneously will instruct the computer to search for Samsung screen. Note that the computer should be connected to the local WIFI, the LCD screen should be powered on, and the source should be PC to TV. Once the link is started, the TV will ask for approval to complete the link. There is a remote available to control the TV.

After the link is set, you can control how the large screen is used. Typically, the computer recognizes the TV as a second monitor, and it can be set up as either a mirror of the primary monitor (typical arrangement) or as an extension. Those settings are on your computer.
