

April 20: A Spring Cleanup for The Meadoway by Michelle Nguyen

The warm spring air brought a sense of renewal, inspiring members of the **Kiwanis Club of** Scarborough to roll up our sleeves and contribute to a local environmental initiative. On Saturday, April 20th, just in time to celebrate Earth Day, six of our dedicated Kiwanis members joined forces with staff and volunteers from the Toronto and Region **Conservation Authority** (TRCA) to help clean up The Meadoway.



. The location of our clean up was in Scarborough at 139 Marcos Boulevard (Southwest of Brimley Road & Lawrence Avenue East).

Our efforts paid off as our team of volunteers successfully removed an impressive 94 pounds of lightweight plastic and other litter from the area, helping to restore the natural beauty of this urban greenspace. The cleanup was not only productive but also provided an opportunity to build connections with fellow community members passionate about improving the city, including TRCA placement students and Meadoway Ambassadors.

This event was part of TRCA's broader plan to transform The Meadoway into a 16-kilometer stretch of urban greenspace and meadowland that will become one of Canada's largest linear urban parks. In the near future, it will include multi-use trails, parks, walking and cycling paths, as well as public spaces within the hydro corridor. The Meadoway will provide a connection between downtown Toronto and Rouge National Urban Park, linking 7 river systems, 15 parks, 13 neighbourhoods, 200 hectares of meadow, and over 1000 species of flora and fauna (https://themeadoway.ca/). By expanding access to green spaces, the project aims to promote exercise, enjoyment, and community connectivity for residents of neighbouring Scarborough communities.

The area that our team cleaned up for Earth Day began restoration initiatives last spring, while construction on the trail connection for the area is still in the process of being confirmed. Updates about the work being done throughout the corridor to transform The Meadoway into an oasis in the heart of Scarborough can be found at <u>https://themeadoway.ca/</u>.

I have been blessed with the opportunity to travel to Grenada for the 3rd time, to volunteer with Smiles Grenada, Carriacou, and Petit Martinique (GCP) on their 4th annual dental mission.

Smiles GCP was founded in 2017, with its first mission in 2018. Smiles, provides the highest quality dental service possible to hundreds of Grenadians every year. Teeth cleaning, fillings and extractions are the dental services provided. Blood pressure and blood sugar monitoring as well as diabetic and hypertensive teaching are nursing services provided. Registered message therapists, who provide massages, are also part of the team that provide free services.

The organization does its own fund raising. Dental chairs, portable chair side dental delivery systems, sterilization equipment and dental X-ray machine are some of the equipment bought and shipped to Grenada in order to provide the top quality care.

All of the volunteers, dental hygienists, dental assistants, dentists, nurses, massage therapists and administrators are very hard working individuals. They are also very passionate about their work and community service. This year a lot of very hard work was done from Sunday April 21 to Friday April 26 in order to serve over 400 very happy, grateful and satisfied Grenadians.

The pristine Grand Anse beach on which my room opened up to was to beautiful to resist. To make full use of one the Caribbean's greatest beaches many of us walked, ran and/or swam at 5:30 am. Breakfast was always at 6:30, and off to work at 7:00.

There was always about 25 people waiting at the clinic when we arrived, some had been waiting since 6:00 am. Smiles was unable to treat all who showed up. Chances are that if you showed up at clinic at 1:00 were told they would not be seen today. This service was a first come first serve service. In all over 400 Grenadians received and were very grateful for this service. We were well supported by the Grenadian Ministry of Health who provided us with our accommodations, and transportation on this mission.

A special shout-out to Vanessa Felix, a dental hygienist, who is the president and founder of Smiles GCP, and Dr. Sheridan Cyrus, dentist, who built this great team of dedicated volunteers. The volunteers of this mission were and are so greatly appreciated, its impossible for us to forget the difference we made.

April 26 Retired Teachers of Ontario (RTO) by Mary McDermott

On a lovely sunny spring morning, Retired Teachers of Ontario Scarborough & East York district hosted a Connect and Learn with MPP Andrea Hazell at the Clark Centre for the Arts.

Andrea is alarmed that the Ford government is pushing forward with privatizing health services in Ontario. Due to a personal experience, she knows all too well how troubling privatized healthcare can be and how it can have a negative toll on a family's circumstance, changing things for them in an instant.

Ontario's budget for fiscal year 2024-2025 is 214.5 billion.

- Bill 124 did a lot of damage, the Ontario government has to pay out 8 billion in retroactive salaries.
- There was nothing to help to reduce administration work that doctors have to do.
- There was nothing to reduce hospitals' reliance on private nursing.
- 2.3 million Ontarians do not have a family doctor.
- Vital services have been closing, the Ontario Health Coalition reported that there were 1,199 closures in emergency rooms, obstetrics, clinics and more.
- Cataract surgery costs \$ 400 in a hospital, \$ 600+ in private clinics.
- Hip and knee replacements cost \$ 10,000 in public hospitals, and cost \$ 20,000 \$ 28,000 in for profit centres.
- We have public operating rooms that are shuttered because they lack staff, yet we have foreign trained doctors driving cabs

Liberals and NDP were hoping for more money to go into healthcare and education. The Ford government is defunding public healthcare and supporting private, for profit healthcare.

Andrea is planning to hold more meetings and would like to include all seniors in future discussions.
