Red Dress Day Community Walk with the Hub – Mid-Scarborough by Mary McDermott and Joan-Mary Spencer

On May 3, four of our Kiwanis Club members joined the Mind and Spirit Youth Leadership Program (MSYL) and community members at The Hub to remember missing and murdered indigenous women, girls, 2S+ people, and men (MMIWG2S+). The youth group had prepared a very thoughtful reflection of many missing or murdered women and girls, which was followed by a smudging ceremony. The Hub's manager Charangit Singh and the students presented the Indigenous community members with a plaque to commemorate the occasion. The member spoke about the injustice and the loss of her young cousin and the pain her family continues to experience by not knowing what happened.

We began our 3 kilometer walk along Eglinton Avenue East in solidarity with all the community members who came out in the rain to show their support. In past years, candles were lit and carried along the walk to raise awareness for the murdered and missing and to support their families.

We concluded our walk by forming a circle in front of The Hub. Our drummer recited a prayer and a song.

West Hill Safety Committee Meeting by Frederica Joseph

Representatives from various community organizations assembled at the East Scarborough Boys and Girls Club on May 22nd to talk about safety issues in the West Hill community. Two mothers from the Danzig community were also present. You may recall that in July 2012, a gang-related shooting occurred at a block party on Danzig Street in West Hill. Two people were killed and 24 people were injured including two of the perpetrators. For more background on this incident, see this <u>link</u>.

The main topic of discussion was gun violence in the Danzig community.

A new basketball court has been installed and has engaged some children and youth in basketball. Frederica suggested getting kids to ride bicycles on some of Scarborough's great trails. One of the organizations represented at the meeting stated they have 50 donated bicycles.

Frederica has connected with a therapist counseling youth in the community about the gun violence there to see if there is a role that the Kiwanis Club of Scarborough can play in engaging kids in positive activities this summer.

A walk in honour of Joshua, one of the victims of shooting in the Danzig community, has been planned with hopes to change the gun violence pattern still emerging. This walk has been announced for Saturday, May 25th.

Woburn Cedarbrae Safety Committee Meeting by Mary McDermott

As President Frederica had another commitment on Wednesday, May 29th, I attended the Woburn Cedarbrae Safety Community Meeting in her stead. Representatives from various stakeholder groups including City of Toronto, Toronto Community Housing Corporation, local community police services officers, our city councilor's office, and our MPP's office met with local community leaders to share recent activities and concerns.

The discussion reinforced our understanding as Kiwanians that we must do what we can to help our youth. The pandemic disrupted learning, students have fallen behind, and many need significant help.
