Come to the Wooster Green Dedication on August 16!

At last, two plaques honoring the donors who made Wooster Green possible will be dedicated, as Mayor (and Kiwanian) Mike Aspacher cuts the ribbon in a ceremony emceed by Kiwanian Jerry Anderson.
