



In Memoriam

It was a sad autumn for Bowling Green Kiwanis, as we had to say goodbye to three beloved members, **Bud Dennis**, **Denise Niese**, and **Marc Simon**. They will be dearly missed by the club and the community.



Wallace E. (Bud) Dennis (1926-2024)

Our fellow Kiwanian **Wallace E. (Bud) Dennis**, 98, of Bowling Green, Ohio passed away on September 26, 2024. Bud was born in La Crosse, Wisconsin, in 1926. He married Marian Fahey February 7, 1953, and she survives in Bowling Green. Also surviving are their children Kathleen Dennis, Mary Julia Dennis, and Timothy John Dennis; eight grandchildren and eleven greatgrandchildren; and his sister, Camille Julia Vetrano. He was preceded in death by his parents, his son Patrick Joseph Dennis, and eight siblings.

Bud was Director of the Wood County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) and a Deputy for the Wood County Sheriff, retiring in 1995. He then worked under the direction of FEMA, traveling the country to assist with disaster relief. His final assignment was at Ground Zero after 9/11/2001. Bud was a member of the St Aloysius Catholic Church, the BG Kiwanis Club, and Friends of the Wood County Library. In his younger years, he volunteered with the Special Olympics, and at Christmastime he rang the Salvation Army bell at the BG Kroger well into his 90s. During WWII, he proudly served his country aboard the destroyer USS Owen and recently received the 2023 Veteran Congressional Commendation from the US Congress. He was a ham radio operator and a gifted woodworker.

Denise E. Niese (1961-2024)

Longtime BG Kiwanis member **Denise C. Niese**, 63, passed away on November 29, 2024. She was born on February 13, 1961. Denise was committed to enhancing the lives of individuals in the community, especially seniors. Her career culminated with her serving as the Executive Director of the Wood County Committee on Aging.

Denise graduated from Vermilion High School, the University of Toledo, and Spring Arbor University. She enjoyed reading, serving on various community groups, and hosting family and friends at her family's cabin in Northern Ontario.

Denise was preceded in death by her father, Thural Williams, and brother, Thural Jr. She is survived by her husband, Dale; sons, Benjamin and Andrew; mother, Gladys (Hawkins) Williams; brother, Warren; sisters, Linda Moyers, Marlene Minney, and Ruthann Jacobs, and many in-laws, extended family members, and friends.

Her obituary states: "Denise could establish a close, personal connection upon first meeting. Whether your acquaintance to Denise was as family, or friend or a member of the community in her service, invariably, see saw you as each. She had the ability to convince you to do what needed to be done, because you knew she would do anything for you." Those of us who knew her as a Kiwanian can confirm this wholeheartedly.

Marc V. Simon (1963-2024)

Marc V. Simon, 61, passed away on December 5, 2024. He is survived by his wife Maria, three children, Anne-Marie, Genevieve, and Martin; his brother, John-Paul Simon (Asha); and his mother, Maria Porter. Marc was born in 1963 in South Bend, Indiana. He held a BS in mathematics and a Ph.D. in political science from Indiana University.

Marc was Associate Professor and Chair in Political Science at BGSU. He coordinated Peace and Conflict Studies and advised the International Relations Organization and Model United Nations. His teaching and research focused on international relations, foreign policy, peace studies, and conflict resolution. He taught twice at the University of Salzburg, Austria, and as a Fulbright Lecturer at the Diplomatic Academy in Vienna. He spoke frequently about international issues on local and regional television and radio.

Marc loved baseball and outdoor sports. He coached his kids' t-ball, softball and Little League teams. Marc supported the Black Swamp Arts Festival and was a member of St. Aloysius Catholic Church, BG Kiwanis, the Democratic Party of Wood County, and BG Town and Gown.

Marc was dedicated to his family and was most proud of his three kids. His fellow Kiwanians and the entire Bowling Green community will remember him for his legacy of love for his family, his work on the power of peace, and his passion for education and advocacy for students.
