








In Memoriam



Our fellow Kiwanian Allan E. Chamberlin, 73, died peacefully on January 21, 2025, after battling Alzheimer's for several years. He leaves behind Debbie, his wife of 44 years, his sons Chris (wife Amy) of Bowling Green and Mark (wife Kathleen) of Lyndhurst, five grandsons, and a sister and a brother. He was preceded in death by his son Jeff, his brother Jay, and his parents.

Allan graduated from the University of New Hampshire in 1974 and worked as Assistant Sports Information Director at UNH. He moved to Bowling Green in 1979 to become the Sports Information Director at BGSU, a role he also served in with the Mid-American Conference from 1983-1991. He earned his CPA from BGSU in 1998 and worked at several accounting firms in the area.

Allan was the official scorer for the BGSU Women's Basketball team for many years and worked in the BGSU Football press box. An accomplished golfer, he won the NH State Championship as a young man and continued weekly golf outings until this past fall. He was an avid walker and enjoyed jigsaw puzzles and Sudoku.

Allan was active in Kiwanis for over 20 years. A member of First United Methodist Church, he served as its Treasurer for many years and was a founding member of the FUMC Investment Club. He was an avid Ohio State fan and enjoyed traveling.

A Celebration of Life is planned for Saturday, May 24, 2025, at 11:00 a.m. at First United Methodist Church, 1526 E. Wooster St. Bowling Green, Ohio. Visitation will be held from 10:00 a.m. until the time of the service at 11:00 a.m.
