 At the old ball game.



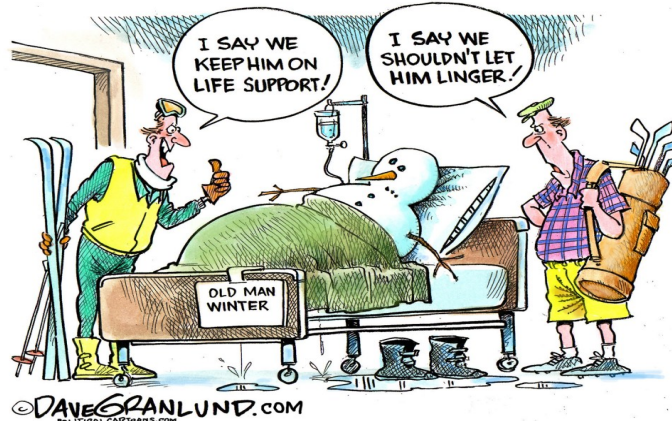
