#### Administrator Discusses Sales Tax Increase



Our program on March 2nd was presented by Verdenia C. Baker, the Palm Beach County Administrator. The administrator has

executive powers to implement the policies and procedures set forth by the Board of County Commissioners.

The county administrator manages an annual budget of approximately \$4 billion and oversees some 6,100 county employees in more than 30 departments, divisions and offices. Together, they must work in concert to provide quality services, programs and information to Palm Beach County's 1.32 million residents.

Supervising the day-to-day

workings of one of the fastest growing and geographically largest counties in the nation is extremely challenging. Among the issues discussed was the county considering a 1 percent or a half-percent sales tax increase for repairs to roads, bridges and buildings. The county faces a backlog of \$650 to \$750 million in infrastructure improvements. The county is compiling a list of highpriority capital projects, with life safety issues taking precedence, Baker said. If approved by the Board of County Commissioners, the increase could be on the ballot before voters in November. For more information, go to http:// www.pbcgov.com/administration.

Our program on March 30th was presented by Sara Dayne Reich, the Executive Administrator for the Shuzz (promounced "Shoes") Foundation. SHUZZ (pronounced shoes) is a non-profit organization that functions off of support from volunteers, existing to provide new shoes to children in poverty-stricken areas around the world.

They distribute thousands of shoes free of charge to children – regardless of race, religion, class or any other criteria – who are in need of a very basic tool to prevent them from risk. Their needs are simple: a pair of shoes that fit properly. This helps protect from injury and prevent disease, enhancing safety when playing, doing chores and going to school.

Their programs include: Back-2-School Program - Provides new sneakers for children in need to go back to school with new shoes. This program focuses majority on

South Florida in the Tri-County area. Medical Outreach Program - The goal of the medical outreach program is simple: provide a healthy foot. They want the child



they fit into shoes to be able walk in them without pain. Youth Athletic Program - Provides children across the United States with new athletic shoes so they have the opportunity to participate in sport programs. And, International Shoe Distribution Program - Provides shoes to children in developing countries around the world to prevent disease, and more simply to allow them to go to school, work and play.

# IRS - Five Easy Ways to Spot a Scam Phone Call

Since this is Tax Time, be ready for this!
Your Editor recently got one of these phone calls.....

The IRS continues to warn the public to be alert for telephone scams and offers five tell-tale warning signs to tip you off if you get such a call. These callers claim to be with the IRS. The scammers often demand money to pay taxes. Some may try to con you by saying that you're due a refund. The refund is a fake lure so you'll give them your banking or other private financial information.

These con artists can sound convincing when they call. They may even know a lot about you. They may alter the caller ID to make it look like the IRS is calling. They use fake names and bogus IRS badge numbers. If you don't answer, they often leave an "urgent" callback request.

The IRS respects taxpayer rights when working out payment of your taxes. So, it's pretty easy to tell when a supposed IRS caller is a fake. Here are five things the scammers often do but the IRS will not do. Any one of these five things is a sign of a scam.

#### The IRS will never:

- 1. Call you about taxes you owe without first mailing you an official notice.
- 2. Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the chance to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- 3. Require you to use a certain payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card.
- 4. Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- 5. Threaten to bring in local police or other lawenforcement to have you arrested for not paying.

If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS and asking for money, here's what to do:

- If you know you owe taxes or think you might owe, call the IRS at 800-829-1040 to talk about payment options. You also may be able to set up a payment plan online at IRS.gov.
- If you know you don't owe taxes or have no reason to believe that you do, report the incident to TIGTA at 1.800.366.4484
- If phone scammers target you, also contact the Federal Trade Commission at FTC.gov. Use their "FTC Complaint Assistant" to report the scam. Please add "IRS Telephone Scam" to the comments of your complaint.

Remember, the IRS currently does not use unsolicited email, text messages or any social media to discuss your personal tax issues. For more information on reporting tax scams, go to http://www.irs.gov and type "scam" in the search box.



#### **Don't skip breakfast**

Not hungry first thing in the morning? Pushed for time? Trying to lose weight? There are many calorie-counted treats that will tempt you to rediscover the

pleasure of breakfast. From energy-boosting "apple pie" porridge and protein-packed scrambled eggs, to a nutrient-rich green smoothie and granola bars, there's something for everyone.

"Creating the habit of eating in the morning is something you can build towards," says dietitian Alison Hornby. "Start off with a light bite, such as a piece of fruit or a low-fat yoghurt. "After a while, your morning appetite will naturally increase and you'll probably find you eat less throughout the day, including snacks."

Research suggests people who eat breakfast are slimmer because they tend to eat less during the day, especially high-calorie snacks. If you're short on time in the morning, think about ways of gaining time by keeping your breakfast choice simple, either by waking up 10 minutes earlier or getting other chores out of the way ahead of time.

#### Frank discussions

Ohio resident Mike Nichols had no intention of joining Kiwanis when he attended the Berea Arts Fest in the fall of 2010. But when hunger pangs struck, he



stopped by the concession stand run by the Kiwanis Club of Beria, Ohio, for a hotdog and a bit of information about the organization selling them. He got both, courtesy of former Berea Kiwanis Club President Jodee Ward, who happened to be handling customers that day. "She's got an outstanding personality," Nichols says of his Kiwanis sponsor. "I said to her, 'This looks like fun...what does Kiwanis do?' She described to me some of the club's activities, and I asked what it took to join."

The deal was sealed before Nichols got his hotdog (with extra mustard and onions). Ward invited him to a meeting, and shortly thereafter he joined. Now that he's been in Kiwanis for a few years (and is his club's president-elect), he's got some advice for other Kiwanians seeking to bolster membership: always keep an eye peeled for folks who might be interested, and never miss an opportunity to approach them in a friendly, low-pressure way. "I like to say that all of our members are on the membership committee," Nichols says. "I think it's a lot more effective to draw people in rather than try to push them."

Ward—herself a former club president and current member of the Ohio District membership committee—couldn't agree more. The trick, she says, is simple for some but difficult for others. "You have to learn to talk to people," Ward advises. "You have to open your mouth and ask. And to me, 'ask' stands for 'Always Say Kiwanis.' One way or another, always mention Kiwanis. Plus, in my sales career I've learned that you can say almost anything if you do it with a big smile on your face.

Ward certainly isn't timid about singing Kiwanis' praises, having chatted up candidates everyplace from her grocery store meat counter to, of course, the group's charity concession stand. Nichols credits her sunny personality and gift for gab with turning him into a Kiwanian. "I was interested in doing something," he recalls. "I was ready. The ground in the garden was prepped for planting, and Jodee just poured the seeds right in." Ward is the sort of gardener who never misses a chance to plant those seeds. Sometimes they prosper, sometimes not. She never knows until she tries. And tries again.

"A hundred percent of the people you never ask are never going to join," she says.
