COVID-19 Affects All Of Us, Kiwanis Meetings Cancelled

Bracing the nation for a grim death toll, President Donald Trump on Sunday, March 29th, extended the voluntary national shutdown for a month, bowing to public health experts who told him the coronavirus pandemic could claim over 100,000 lives in the U.S., perhaps significantly more, if not enough is done to fight it.

Palm Beach County has one new death and 383 cases as of Sunday.

As the seriousness of the Corona Virus escalates, it's important that we all adhere to the current health protection initiatives including social distancing, not shaking hands and not enter any public place if a the person exhibits any flu or COVID-19 like symptoms or has a fever over 99.9 degrees F.

Furthermore, The City of Delray Beach has issued a "stay at home" order and overnight curfew to stop the spread of the deadly coronavirus (effective Monday March 30th and will remain in effect until Thursday, April 16, 2020 at 11:59 p.m.). The City's new order requires that all residents of the City of Delray Beach stay at home and within the entirety of their owned or rented property. Delray Beach fears an influx of people from Broward and Miami-Dade counties, where nearly 2,000 confirmed cases of the coronavirus have led to restrictions on movement.

All city properties have been closed to the public including the Delray Golf Club, our meeting place. As of now, it's safe to assume we will not be meeting at the golf club or Finnegan's for at least another month, perhaps even until June.

We will keep everyone updated by email as to when we might be able to resume our weekly Kiwanis meetings.

Until then, stay safe.

Mindful Eating

Mindful eating is maintaining an in-themoment awareness of the food and drink you put into your body, observing rather than judging how the food makes you feel and the signals your body sends

about taste, satisfaction, and fullness. Mindful eating requires you to simply acknowledge and accept the feelings, thoughts, and bodily sensations you observe—and can extend to the process of buying, preparing, and serving your food as well as consuming it.

For many of us, our busy lives make mealtimes rushed affairs or we find ourselves eating in the car commuting to work, at the desk in front of a computer screen, or parked on the couch watching TV. We eat mindlessly, shoveling food down regardless of whether we're still hungry or not. In fact, we often eat for reasons other than hunger—to satisfy emotional needs, to relieve stress, or cope with unpleasant emotions such as sadness, anxiety, loneliness, or boredom. Mindful eating is the opposite of this kind of unhealthy "mindless" eating.

Mindful eating isn't about being perfect, always eating the right things, or never allowing yourself to eat on-the-go again. And it's not about establishing strict rules for how many calories you can eat or which foods you have to include or avoid in your diet. Rather, it's about focusing all your senses and being present as you shop, cook, serve, and eat your food. While mindfulness isn't for everyone, many people find that by eating this way, even for just a few meals a week, you can become more attuned to your body. This can help you avoid overeating and make it easier to change your dietary habits for the better and enjoy the improved mental and physical well-being that comes with a healthier diet.

Are Clubs Covered from Coronavirus?

Planning is what Stu Peterson does as Kiwanis International's corporate risk officer. He's been

answering a lot of guestions since the coronavirus pandemic changed the way Kiwanis clubs around the globe operate.

"This is a situation you could never plan for," he says. "We're in uncharted waters."

Peterson has answered dozens of phone calls and emails during the past few weeks. Most guestions have come from club presidents who want to know whether the Kiwanis insurance policy will cover their club if someone gets COVID-19 at a Kiwanis meeting or event.

Peterson's answer is simple: clubs are covered. But, he adds, the person who is sick will need to prove they were exposed to the virus at the Kiwanis event before the insurance company would pay out a benefit to cover health expenses or loss of income.

"It would have to be proven that they didn't have the virus before the event and then had it after the event," he said. "That would be very difficult to do unless they were tested before and after the function."

Peterson says the best option for clubs is to follow the advice of local health leaders.
