Water Resources Mitigation Plan

Our program on March 8th was presented by Ronnie Heen, The Emergency Program Coordinator for PBC.

The mission of the PBC Division of Emergency Management is to minimize the impact of emergencies and disasters to our community through education, planning, and response by coordinating information and resources.

The Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) is a unified, coordinated effort among County and municipal governments to reduce the county's vulnerability to the impacts of identified natural and man-made hazards. LMS projects cover a range of topics including

major drainage improvement projects, hardening of public structures, Emergency Operation Center purchases, etc. At any particular time, the LMS has approximately 100 community mitigation projects on its Prioritized Project List. While some of these projects may eventually be self-funded by sponsoring communities, many will require outside financial assistance in order to be completed.

The Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) Program is a mitigation initiative to help communities identify and implement measures to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk of flood damages. For more information, go to <https://discover.pbcgov.org/publicsafety/dem/>

City Water Meets All Standards Set By FDOH

Our program on March 22nd was presented by Hassan Hadjimiry, the Utilities Director for the City of Delray Beach. We saw a presentation on the City's water system. Currently serving over 68,000 customers, the city has 1,500 miles of pipeline and 5 storage tanks.

The City withdraws water from the east coast surficial aquifer, a 75 to 195 feet deep under-ground aquifer. There are 30 raw water wells located throughout the City from which water is drawn and piped to the water treatment plant.

The sources of all drinking water, including tap water and bottled water, come from rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. The drinking water is safe to drink and is tested daily, meeting all of the primary standards set by the Florida Department of Health.

In addition, the City owns 129 waste water pump stations throughout the City's service area. These stations collect and pump wastewater through the collection system to the South Central Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant (SCRWWTP) for ultimate treatment and disposal.

Reclaimed water plays an important role in water resource, wastewater and ecosystem management. When reclaimed water is used, it eases the demand on traditional, often limited, sources of water. By recycling or reusing water, communities can still grow while minimizing or even reducing their impact on the water resources around them. Delray Beach has been using reclaimed water since 2008.

Safeguarding & Restoring South Florida's Water

Our program on March 15th was presented by Dave Colangelo, the District Grant Manager for the South Florida Water Management District.

The mission of the SFWMD is to safeguard and restore South Florida's water resources and ecosystems, protect our communities from flooding, and meet the region's water needs while connecting with the public and stakeholders.



The South Florida Water Management District is a regional governmental agency that manages the water resources in the southern half of the state, covering 16 counties from Orlando to the Florida Keys and serving a population of 9 million residents. It is the oldest and largest of the state's five water management districts. Created in 1949, the agency is responsible for managing and protecting water resources of South Florida by balancing and improving flood control, water supply, water quality and natural systems.

A key initiative is restoration of the Everglades - the largest environmental restoration project in the nation's history. The District is also working to improve the Kissimmee River and its floodplain, Lake Okeechobee and South Florida's coastal estuaries.

The District's work fits broadly into five categories:

- * Flood control - Throughout the year, Operations and Maintenance staff oversee approximately 2,200 miles of canals and 2,100 miles of levees/berms, 84 pump stations, 778 water control structures and weirs and 621 project culverts.

- * Water supply planning - essential to meet the growing demand on limited water resources of 9 million residents, millions of visitors, businesses and the environment.

- * Water quality improvement - efforts are removing excess nutrients that have altered South Florida's ecosystems.

- * Numerous ecosystem restoration projects - are being planned, built and operated to protect and preserve South Florida's unique ecosystems, including the Everglades, the Kissimmee River, Lake Okeechobee and a diverse array of coastal watersheds.

- * Finally, the District's resiliency efforts - The District is making significant infrastructure adaptation investments that are needed to successfully implement its mission of safeguarding and restoring South Florida's water resources and ecosystems, protecting communities from flooding, and ensuring an adequate water supply for all South Florida's needs.

Managing Our Water Resources



Our program on March 29th was presented by Tommy Stroud, The Executive Director and District Engineer for the Lake Worth Drainage District.

The Lake Worth Drainage District manages the water resources for much of southeastern Palm Beach County, providing comprehensive flood control, water conservation, and water supply protection for more than 800,000 residents and thousands of acres of agricultural land. Our employees monitor and control a complex system of approximately 500 miles of canals and 1,000 miles associated rights-of-way, 20 major water control structures, and numerous minor structures.

Services provided by Lake Worth Drainage District include: Stormwater management and operation of the regional flood control system; Permitting of structures discharging stormwater into District canals; Maintenance of canals and rights-of-way; Aquatic weed control; and Participation in community outreach and educational programs.

The Lake Worth Drainage District encompasses approximately 200 square miles in southeastern Palm Beach County. They are bordered on the west by the Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge, on the east by Interstate 95, on the north by Okeechobee Boulevard and on the south by the Hillsboro canal.

Included within their boundaries are all or portions of 13 municipalities from West Palm Beach, Wellington and Royal Palm Beach to Delray Beach and Boca Raton. For all your questions, the main issues at hand and more information, go to www.lwdd.net.

Don't fall for these federal tax refund myths

Once people complete and file their tax return, many of them eagerly await any refund they may be owed. No matter how a taxpayer plans to use their tax refund, knowing fact from fiction can help manage expectations as they wait for their money. This tip dispels some federal tax refund myths that many people believe are fact, but they are pure fiction.

Myth: Calling the IRS, a tax software provider or a tax professional will provide a more accurate refund date.

Many people think talking to the IRS or to their tax software provider or tax professional is the best way to find out when they will get their refund. The best way to check the status of a refund is through the "Where's My Refund?" tool or the IRS2Go app.

Taxpayers can also call the automated refund hotline at 800-829-1954 to get their refund status. This hotline has the same information as "Where's My Refund?". There is no need to call the IRS unless "Where's My Refund?" says to do so.

Myth: "Where's My Refund?" must be wrong because there's no deposit date yet

Updates to "Where's My Refund?" and to the IRS2Go mobile app are made once a day, usually overnight. Even though the IRS issues most refunds within 21 days, it's possible a refund may take longer. If the IRS needs more information to process a tax return, the agency will contact the taxpayer by mail. Taxpayers should also consider the time it takes for the banks to post the refund to the taxpayer's account. People waiting for a refund in the mail should plan for extra time.

Myth: "Where's My Refund?" must be wrong because the refund amount is less than expected.

There are several factors that could cause a tax refund to be less than expected. The IRS will mail the taxpayer a letter of explanation if it makes adjustments. Some taxpayers may also receive a letter from the Department of Treasury's Bureau of the Fiscal Service if their refund was reduced to offset certain financial obligations. Before calling, taxpayers should check the "Where's My Refund" tool or wait for the letter to understand why the change occurred. This can help taxpayers know how to respond.

Myth: Getting a refund this year means there's no need to adjust withholding for tax year 2023.

To avoid a surprise next year, taxpayers should make changes now. One way to do this is to adjust their tax withholding with their employer. The "Tax Withholding Estimator" tool can help taxpayers determine if their employer is withholding the right amount.

Taxpayers who experience a life event such as marriage, divorce, or the birth or adoption of a child, or are no longer able to claim a person as a dependent, are encouraged to check their withholding. Taxpayers can use the results from the "Tax Withholding Estimator" to complete a new Form W-4, Employee's Withholding Certificate, and submit it to their employer as soon as possible. Withholding takes place throughout the year, so it's better to take this step as soon as possible.

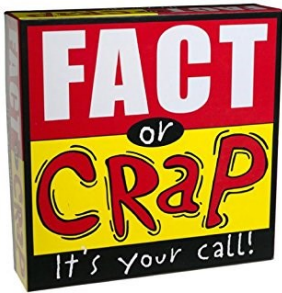

Add water and blend again before straining if your juice is too thick.

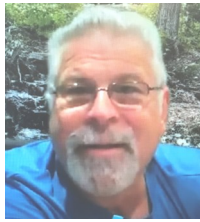
Carrot Juice

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History". Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



March 2:

1861, the state of Texas, having seceded from the Union, was admitted to the Confederacy.
 1877, Republican Rutherford B. Hayes was declared the winner of the 1876 presidential election over Democrat Samuel J. Tilden, even though Tilden had won the popular vote.
 1932, the 20th Amendment to the Constitution, which moved the date of the presidential inauguration from March 4 to Jan. 20, was passed by Congress and sent to the states for ratification.
 1939, John Ford's classic Western "Stagecoach," starring Claire Trevor and John Wayne, opened in New York.
 1955, nine months before Rosa Parks' famous act of defiance, Claudette Colvin, a Black high school student in Montgomery, Alabama, was arrested after refusing to give up her seat on a public bus to a white passenger.
 1962, Wilt Chamberlain scored 100 points for the Philadelphia Warriors in a game against the New York Knicks, an NBA record that still stands. Philadelphia won the game, 169-147.
 1985, the government approved a screening test for AIDS that detected antibodies to the virus, allowing possibly contaminated blood to be excluded from the blood supply.
 1990, more than 6,000 drivers went on strike against Greyhound Lines Inc. (The company, later declaring an impasse in negotiations, fired the strikers.)
 1995, the Internet search engine website Yahoo! was incorporated by founders Jerry Yang and David Filo.

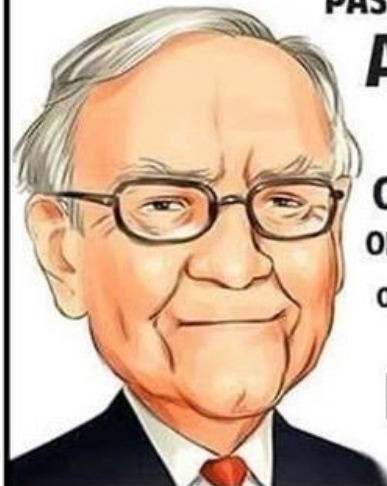
