KI Makes History, Elect First Female President

Susan A. "Sue" Petrisin will be the first female president-designate of a major international service organization following elections at the 100th Annual Kiwanis International Convention held in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA. Kiwanis celebrated 100 years of service to children of the world with a pancake lunch and birthday celebration, a playground dedication and a business meeting.

Petrisin, of East Lansing, Michigan, USA, will assume her duties on October 1, 2015. She is associate director of alumni programs for the Michigan State University Alumni Association and has been involved in Kiwanis for nearly 25 years as a member of the Kiwanis Club of East Lansing. She also has held multiple leadership roles with Kiwanis youth programs.

Also elected were Jane Erickson, Bellevue, Nebraska, USA, president-

elect, and James "Jim" M. Rochford, Peoria, Illinois, USA, vice president.



Erickson, a Kiwanis member for 25 years and past governor of the Nebraska-Iowa District, has served in nearly every club leadership role and as president of Kiwanis International Foundation. Rochford, an international trustee and past governor of the Illinois-Eastern Iowa District, has been an active member of Kiwanis since 1979.

"Kiwanis will concentrate on serving the children of the world in our 101st year," Petrisin said. "Our mission is serving the children of the world, wherever we have a Kiwanis club, and we'll focus on how to best serve our communities as we launch our next century of service."

A Visit To Jordan With Jay



Our program on July 15th was a terrific slide show of **Jay Alperin's** trip to Jordan & Petra. The Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan is a small country with few natural resources, but it has played a pivotal role in the struggle for power in the Middle East.

Jordan's significance results partly from its strategic location at the crossroads of what Christians, Jews and Muslims call the Holy Land. It is a key ally of the US and, together with Egypt, one of only two Arab nations to have made peace with Israel.

Unlike Arab states to the south and east, Jordan has no oil of its own. Its resources are limited to phosphates and agricultural produce. The economy depends largely on services, tourism and foreign aid, of which the US is the main provider. Jordan prides itself on its health service, one of the best in the region. 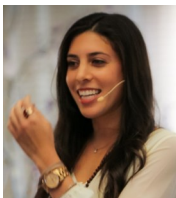

Healthy breakfasts (for people who hate breakfast)

Get into the habit of eating breakfast with these simple breakfasts designed to whet the appetite of even the most habitual breakfast skipper. Not hungry first thing in the morning? Pushed for time? Trying to lose weight? These calorie-counted treats will tempt you to rediscover the pleasure of breakfast.

From an energy-boosting "apple pie" porridge and protein-packed scrambled eggs, to a nutrient-rich

green smoothie and sugar-free granola bars, there's something for everyone. "Creating the habit of eating in the morning is something you can build towards," says dietitian Alison Hornby. "Start off with a light bite such as a piece of fruit or a low-fat yoghurt. "After a while, your morning appetite will naturally increase and you'll probably find you eat less throughout the day, including snacks."

Research suggests that people who eat breakfast are slimmer because they tend to eat less during the day, especially high-calorie snacks. If you're short on time in the morning, think about ways of gaining time by keeping breakfast simple, either by waking up 10 minutes earlier or getting other chores out of the way ahead of time.

Join CERT & Help Protect Your Neighborhood

Our program on July 29th was presented by Ken Thompson and Bob Hersy representing CERT in Delray Beach. The City of Delray Beach Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) organization consists of twenty-

two independent community teams that are coordinated through the Fire Department, under the leadership of Firefighter/Paramedic Kenneth Thompson.

The CERT program has trained approximately three hundred and fifty volunteers, of which one hundred and fifty have graduated from an abbreviated refresher program. The basic course consists of an eight-week

program, which covers the following subjects: Disaster Preparedness, Disaster Fire Suppression, Disaster Psychology and Radio Communications, Disaster Medical Operations (two parts), Light Search and Rescue Operations, Terrorism and Team Organization and Disaster Simulation Exercise.

Basic equipment is issued to the volunteers, and most communities have augmented their equipment to meet their specific needs, such as Medical, Search and Rescue, and Communications. Radio equipment is issued to communities prior to an impending hurricane. This radio system puts communities into direct communication with the City of Delray Beach's EOC at Fire Headquarters; thus providing the EOC with rapid impact assessment at the community level.

July 2:

1776 The Continental Congress passed a resolution that "these United Colonies are, and of right, ought to be, Free and Independent States."

1890 Congress passed the Sherman Antitrust Act.

1937 Aviator Amelia Earhart and navigator Fred Noonan disappeared over the Pacific Ocean while attempting to make the first round-the-world flight at the equator.

- Each horizontal row has every number only once.
- Each vertical column has every number only once.
- Each 3 by 3 region has every number only once.

International President's Corner

Dr. John Button, *President of Kiwanis International*

Community

One of my Kiwanis "aha" moments occurred in Jamaica in March 2005. Moneague is a small town tucked away in the island's Blue Mountains. The Kiwanis club is a thriving club. If it happens in Moneague, Kiwanis makes it happen. It is vital to community life.

In September 2004, Hurricane Ivan decimated the economy and social fabric of Jamaica. The entire banana crop—the country's major export—was lost and 1,500 elementary schools were destroyed. The country was on its knees. That Christmas, the tsunami with its devastating human toll struck Southeast Asia.

As governor of the Eastern Canada and the Caribbean District, I visited Jamaica in March 2005. The country was still reeling from the effects of Ivan. On my arrival, Moneague Kiwanis Club President David James handed me US\$300. "This," he said, "is my club's contribution to tsunami relief." When I asked why, he responded, "Those poor people live in our community."

"I was stunned. The Moneague Kiwanians had gone door-to-door selling T-shirts to raise money to send halfway around the world to help people they didn't know but whom they firmly believed were members of their community. For them, their backyard is the globe.

For me, that moment was a Kiwanis moment. No service to the people of Moneague was sacrificed to this global view of community. Members continued to plant gardens, paint school crosswalks and assist with hurricane relief. They just dug a little deeper.

Our peer organizations went global decades before Kiwanis did. Their membership is 30 percent North American and 70 percent international while Kiwanis' numbers are exactly the opposite. They've grown by creating a global need for what they offer. I can't help but wonder if a narrow definition of community has held us back when we have so much to offer our global neighbours.

In my Kiwanis travels, I've frequently been confronted by a narrow view of community: that "community" doesn't extend beyond the city limits. Whenever this happens, I remember David James and tell the story of the Kiwanis Club of Moneague.
