"Very often, a child with special needs doesn't have a best friend. The ponies do not judge or laugh; they seem to understand and a trusting friendship develops. Personal Ponies promotes an "I CAN" attitude by allowing the child to interact through tasks such as grooming, handling, stall maintenance and feeding the pony. It is our goal this "I CAN" attitude will carry over to school, family and social settings."



# Reeve Bright's 4th of July Program - Facts About the Declaration



On July 4th, 1776 the Continental Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence, which announced that the 13

colonies were independent sovereign states and not a part of the British Empire any longer. Instead, these 13 states were a new nation called the United States of America. The Declaration of Independence was adopted more than a year after the Revolutionary War had begun. The war started because the British Empire tried to impose taxes on the colonies to pay off their debts and because of disagreement as to the British Parliament's authority in the colonies. The Declaration of Independence formally declared the independence of the United States of America. This historical document now sits at the National Archives in Washington, D.C.

Interesting Declaration of Independence Facts:

July 2, 1776 is the day that the Continental Congress actually voted for independence. John Adams, in his writings, even noted that July 2 would be remembered in the annals of American history and would be marked with fireworks and celebrations. The written Declaration of Independence was dated July 4 but wasn't actually signed by the delegates until August 2. John

Until August 2. John Hancock was the first and only person to sign the Declaration on July 4, 1776. Fifty-six delegates eventually signed the document, although all were not present on that day in August. The names of the signers were released publicly in early 1777. So that famous painting showing the signing of the Declaration on July 4, 1776, is a bit of an exaggeration.

Thomas Jefferson is considered by many to be the author of this important document but he was a member of five-person committee consisting of Benjamin Franklin, Roger Sherman, Robert Livingston, John Adams and himself.

Robert Livingston did not sign the Declaration of Independence even though he contributed to its creation. He didn't agree with the timing of declaring independence.

The Declaration of Independence was signed by 56 men representing 13 colonies.

8 of the 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence were from Britain.

The Declaration suffered from a lack of early respect. The Declaration (and celebrating its signing) was stuck in a feud between the Federalists (of John Adams) and the Republicans (of Thomas Jefferson). The Declaration and its anniversary day weren't widely celebrated until the Federalists faded away from the political scene after 1812.

After the adoption of the Declaration of Independence, the "Committee of Five"—Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Roger Sherman and Robert R. Livingston—was charged with overseeing the reproduction of the approved text. This was completed at the shop of Philadelphia printer John Dunlap. On July 5, Dunlap's copies were dispatched across the 13 colonies to newspapers, local officials and the commanders of the Continental troops. These rare documents, known as "Dunlap broadsides," predate the

o broadsides," predate the engrossed version signed by the delegates. Of the hundreds thought to have been printed on the night of July 4, only 26 copies survive. Most are held in museum and library collections, but three are privately owned.

Who Signed and In What Order? John Hancock signed first, with a large hand right in the middle because he was the President of the Congress. The others signed by state delegation, beginning in

the upper right in one column, and then proceeding in five other columns, arranged from the northernmost state (New Hampshire) to the southernmost (Georgia).

George Washington did not sign the Declaration of Independence because in July 1776 he was in New York preparing to defend Manhattan against the British.

New delegates joining the Congress were also allowed to sign. Eight men signed the Declaration who did not take seats in Congress until after July 4: Matthew Thornton, William Williams, Benjamin Rush, George Clymer, James Smith, George Taylor, George Ross, and Charles Carroll of Carrollton. Matthew Thornton did not take a seat in Congress until November. By the time that he signed it, there wasn't any space for his name next to the other New Hampshire delegates, so he placed his signature at the end of the document.

1608 The city of Quebec was founded by Samuel de Champlain.




# This Month's Sudoku Puzzle....
