## PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

### Testing for COVID-19

Two kinds of tests are available for COVID-19: viral tests and antibody tests.

- A viral test tells you if you have a current infection.
- An antibody test might tell you if you had a past infection. An antibody test might not show if you have a current infection because it can take 1-3 weeks after infection for your body to make antibodies. Having antibodies to the virus that causes COVID-19 might provide protection from getting infected with the virus again. If it does, we do not know how much protection the antibodies might provide or how long this protection might last.

If you test positive or negative for COVID-19 on a viral or an antibody test, you still should take preventive measures to protect yourself and others.

### How to get tested for current COVID-19 infection

To learn if you have a current infection, viral tests are used. Most people have mild illness and can recover at home without medical care. Contact your healthcare provider if your symptoms are getting worse or if you have questions about your health.

Decisions about testing are made by state and local health departments or healthcare providers. You can visit your state or local health department's website to look for the latest local information on testing.

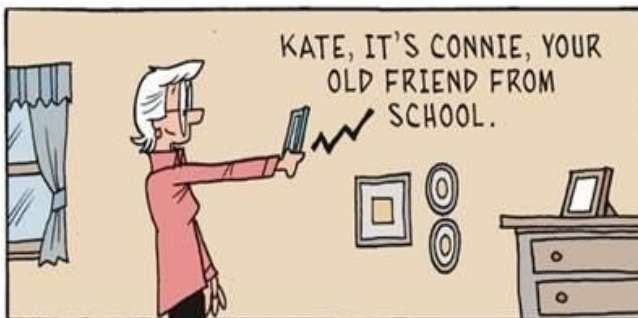
If you have symptoms of COVID-19 and want to get tested, call your healthcare provider first. If you have symptoms of COVID-19 and are not tested, it is important to stay home. Learn what to do if you are sick.

**Results:** If you test positive for COVID-19 by a viral test, know what protective steps to take if you are sick or caring for someone.

--If you test negative for COVID-19 by a viral test, you probably were not infected at the time your sample was collected. However, that does not mean you will not get sick. The test result only means that you did not have COVID-19 at the time of testing. You might test negative if the sample was collected early in your infection and test positive later during your illness. You could also be exposed to COVID-19 after the test and get infected then.

## Mindful Eating Part- 5

The following exercise can help you discover how different food combinations and quantities affect your well-being:

### Mixing and matching different foods.

Begin to experiment with your food:

Try eating less food more often, or less food, period.

If you're a meat-eater, spend two or three days excluding meat from your diet.

Or perhaps exclude red meat, but include chicken and fish.

Remove certain foods from your diet: salt, sugar, coffee, or bread, for example, and see how this affects how you feel.

Play with food combinations. Try eating solely starch meals, protein meals, fruit meals, or vegetable meals.

Keep a record of everything you observe in yourself as you experiment with your eating habits. The question you're trying to answer is: "Which eating patterns add to the quality of my life, and which detract?"

Continue experimenting with different types, combinations, and amounts of food for two or three weeks, tracking how you feel mentally, physically, and emotionally.

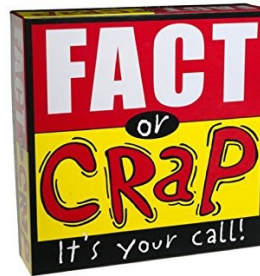

## Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on **"This Date in History"**. Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



### July 1:

1863, the pivotal, three-day Civil War Battle of Gettysburg, resulting in a Union victory, began in Pennsylvania.  
 1867, Canada became a self-governing dominion of Great Britain as the British North America Act took effect.  
 1944, delegates from 44 countries began meeting at Bretton Woods, New Hampshire, where they agreed to establish the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank.  
 1946, the United States exploded a 20-kiloton atomic bomb near Bikini Atoll in the Pacific.  
 1963, the U.S. Post Office inaugurated its five-digit ZIP codes.  
 1966, the Medicare federal insurance program went into effect.  
 2010, California lawmakers approved a \$20 million settlement with the family of Jaycee Dugard, who was kidnapped as a girl and held captive in a secret backyard for 18 years by a paroled sex offender.  
 2015, Episcopalians voted overwhelmingly at their General Convention in Salt Lake City to allow religious weddings for same-sex couples.  
 2019, Fifteen-year-old Coco Gauff, the youngest player to qualify at Wimbledon in the professional era, defeated 39-year-old Venus Williams in the first round, 6-4, 6-4.

### July 8:

1776, Col. John Nixon gave the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence, outside the State House (now Independence Hall) in Philadelphia.  
 1889, The Wall Street Journal was first published.  
 1947, a New Mexico newspaper, the Roswell Daily Record, quoted officials at Roswell Army Air Field as saying they had recovered a "flying saucer" that crashed onto a ranch; officials then said it was actually a weather balloon. (To this day, there are those who believe what fell to Earth was an alien spaceship carrying extra-terrestrial beings.)  
 1950, President Harry S. Truman named Gen. Douglas MacArthur commander-in-chief of United Nations forces in Korea. (Truman ended up sacking MacArthur for insubordination nine months later.)  
 1989, Carlos Saul Menem was inaugurated as president of Argentina in the country's first transfer of power from one democratically elected civilian leader to another in six decades.  
 2000, Venus Williams beat Lindsay Davenport 6-3, 7-6 (3) for her first Grand Slam title, becoming the first Black female champion at Wimbledon since Althea Gibson in 1957-58.  
 2012, Roger Federer equaled Pete Sampras' record of seven men's singles titles at the All England Club and won his 17th Grand Slam title overall, beating Andy Murray 4-6, 7-5, 6-3, 6-4.

### July 15:

1799, French soldiers in Egypt discovered the Rosetta Stone, which proved instrumental in deciphering ancient Egyptian hieroglyphs.  
 1834, the Spanish Inquisition was abolished more than 3 1/2 centuries after its creation.  
 1870, Georgia became the last Confederate state to be readmitted to the Union.  
 1913, Augustus Bacon, D-Ga., became the first person elected to the U.S. Senate under the terms of the recently ratified 17th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, providing for popular election of senators.  
 1975, three American astronauts blasted off aboard an Apollo spaceship hours after two Soviet cosmonauts were launched aboard a Soyuz spacecraft for a mission that included a linkup of the two ships in orbit.  
 1996, MSNBC, a 24-hour all-news network, made its debut on cable and the Internet.  
 2010, After 85 days, BP stopped the flow of oil into the Gulf of Mexico using a 75-ton cap lowered onto the well earlier in the week.

### July 22:

1862, President Abraham Lincoln presented to his Cabinet a preliminary draft of the Emancipation Proclamation.  
 1933, American aviator Wiley Post completed the first solo flight around the world as he returned to New York's Floyd Bennett Field after traveling for 7 days, 18 and 3/4 hours.  
 1934, bank robber John Dillinger was shot to death by federal agents outside Chicago's Biograph Theater, where he had just seen the Clark Gable movie "Manhattan Melodrama."  
 1957, Walter "Fred" Morrison applied for a patent for a "flying toy" which became known as the Frisbee.  
 1975, the House of Representatives joined the Senate in voting to restore the American citizenship of Confederate Gen. Robert E. Lee.  
 1991, police in Milwaukee arrested Jeffrey Dahmer, who later confessed to murdering 17 men and boys (Dahmer ended up being beaten to death by a fellow prison inmate).  
 2019, Equifax agreed to pay at least \$700 million to settle lawsuits over a 2017 data breach that exposed the Social Security numbers and other private information of nearly 150 million Americans.

### July 29:

1914, transcontinental telephone service in the U.S. became operational with the first test conversation between New York and San Francisco. Massachusetts' Cape Cod Canal, offering a shortcut across the base of the peninsula, was officially opened to shipping traffic.  
 1957, the International Atomic Energy Agency was established. Jack Paar made his debut as host of NBC's "Tonight Show."  
 1958, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed the National Aeronautics and Space Act, creating NASA.  
 1965, The Beatles' second feature film, "Help!," had its world premiere in London.  
 1967, an accidental rocket launch on the deck of the supercarrier USS Forrestal in the Gulf of Tonkin resulted in a fire and explosions that killed 134 servicemen. (Among the survivors was future Arizona senator John McCain, a U.S. Navy lieutenant commander who narrowly escaped with his life.)  
 1981, Britain's Prince Charles married Lady Diana Spencer in a glittering ceremony at St. Paul's Cathedral in London. (The couple divorced in 1996.)  
 1986, a federal jury in New York found that the National Football League had committed an antitrust violation against the rival United States Football League. But in a hollow victory for the U-S-F-L, the jury ordered the N-F-L to pay token damages of only three dollars.  
 2015, Microsoft released its Windows 10 operating system, an upgrade of Windows 8.  
 2019, Britain's weather agency confirmed that the country had seen its highest temperature on record, 101.7 degrees Fahrenheit, during the heat wave that broke temperature records across Europe in the preceding days.

## This Month's Sudoku Puzzle....

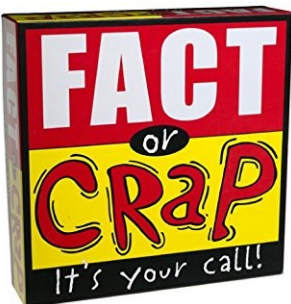
