Lots Going On At The South Florida Fair

Our program on July 14th was presented by Victoria Chouris, the President & CEO of the South Florida Fair & Palm Beach County Expositions, Inc.

The South Florida Fair & Palm Beach County Expositions, Inc is a private, non-profit corporation whose expectation is to preserve and promote the agricultural, trade, entertainment, and historical heritage of our community.

Approximately 135 acres comprise the real property commonly referred to as the "Fairgrounds". The main event on the Fairgrounds is the annual South Florida Fair which occurs over a 17 day period, generally in the last two (2) weeks of January each year. One of the greatest aspects of the annual fair is its agricultural and livestock exhibits which clearly provide the greatest variety of such exhibits anywhere within Palm Beach County. The annual fair attracts over 500,000 people

through its turnstiles.

However, 650,000 people will attend various events on the Fairgrounds on an annual basis. Besides the 128,000 ft.

Expo Center, there are 10 other smaller exhibit buildings along with the iTHINK Financial Amphitheatre, Agriplex and Yesteryear Village. These events constitute 250 event days. For more information go to www.southfloridafair.com.



Our Public Defender & Bail Reform



Our program on July 21st was presented by Daniel Eisinger, Chief of Felony Division for the Public Defender's office.

The PD provides high quality representation to poor people who are charged with crimes. Effective and efficient work by the PD office supports our pursuit of equal justice.

Mr Eisinger briefed us on all the services provided by the PD Office. However, the main topic dealt with Bail Reform. Currently our jails are at

capacity, with a large percentage of inmates awaiting trial are being held because they cannot afford bail. The goal is to establish a new system for determining a defendant's custody status while they are awaiting trial - based not the defendant's ability to pay, but instead on an assessment of their public safety risk and other factors. The defendants will be held only if they are a risk to public safety or a risk to flee or miss their court date.

Opposition to any reform is coming from bail bondsmen and their associations. Stay Tuned!

Our program on July 28th was presented by Pat Stidham, the Assistant Director of Dress For Success of the Palm Beaches.

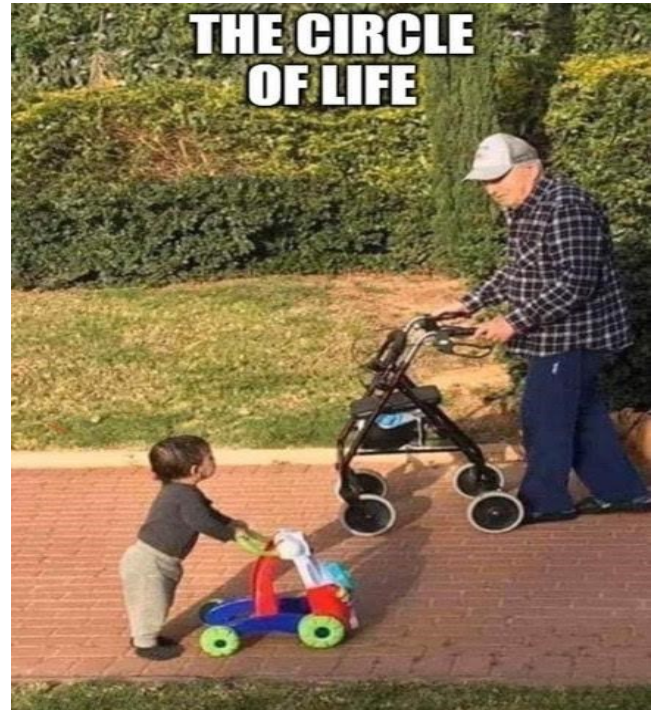
The mission of Dress for Success is to empower women to achieve economic independence by providing a network of support, professional attire, and the development tools to help women thrive in work and in life.

DID YOU KNOW?

Kiwanis Education

1. The first Kiwanis club was organized in Detroit, Michigan, USA, in 1914. The group received a charter from the state of Michigan on January 21, 1915—the day that is regarded as the birth date of Kiwanis. The club’s name is Detroit Kiwanis Club No. 1 in recognition of its heritage.

2. Kiwanis was created by a professional organizer named Allen Simpson Browne. His concept for the new organization included the exchange of business among the members. However, the Detroit club had been organized only a few weeks when the members became involved in their first service project. During the next five years, Kiwanians would debate the basic purpose of the organization: mutual business exchange or community service.

3. The first name suggested for the organization that became Kiwanis was "Benevolent Order Brothers." But Oattie Robertson, a charter member of the Detroit No. 1 club, didn't like it. "It seems to me," he said, "that Benevolent Order Brothers is a mighty peculiar name for an organization of businessmen. Who wants to be a BOB?"

4. The name "Kiwanis" was coined from an expression of the American Indians in the Detroit area, which was found in Bishop Baraga's dictionary of the Otchipew language. The expression "Nunc Kee-wan-nis" meant, broadly, "we trade" or "we share our talents." As a coined word, however, "Kiwanis" has no meaning except as the name of a leading international service club.

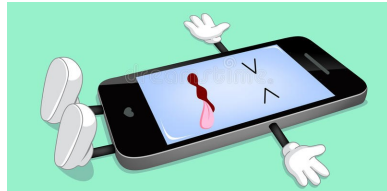

Kids need healthy fats—and plenty of them—in their diet. Healthy fat helps kids fill up (and stay full), concentrate better, and improves their mood.

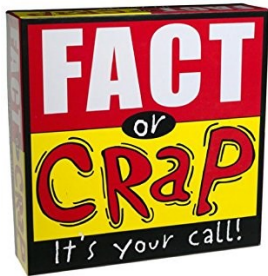
Healthy fats

Monounsaturated fats, from olive oil, avocados, nuts (like almonds, hazelnuts, and pecans), and seeds (such as pumpkin, sesame).

Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on **"This Date in History"**. Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



July 8:

1776, Col. John Nixon gave the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence, outside the State House (now Independence Hall) in Philadelphia.
1889, The Wall Street Journal was first published.
1911, cowgirl "Two-Gun Nan" Aspinwall became the first woman to make a solo trip by horse across the United States, arriving in New York 10 months after departing San Francisco.
1947, a New Mexico newspaper, the Roswell Daily Record, quoted officials at Roswell Army Air Field as saying they had recovered a "flying saucer" that crashed onto a ranch; officials then said it was actually a weather balloon. (To this day, there are those who believe what fell to Earth was an alien spaceship carrying extra-terrestrial beings.)
2000, Venus Williams beat Lindsay Davenport 6-3, 7-6 (3) for her first Grand Slam title, becoming the first Black female champion at Wimbledon since Althea Gibson in 1957-58.
2019, billionaire financier Jeffrey Epstein was charged with sexually abusing dozens of underage girls (Epstein was found unresponsive in his jail cell a month later; the medical examiner ruled his death a suicide.)
2020, Brooks Brothers filed for bankruptcy protection; the 200-year-old company became the latest major clothing retailer to be toppled by the coronavirus pandemic.

July 14:

1789, in an event symbolizing the start of the French Revolution, citizens of Paris stormed the Bastille prison and released the seven prisoners inside.
1798, Congress passed the Sedition Act, making it a federal crime to publish false, scandalous or malicious writing about the United States government.
1865, the Matterhorn, straddling Italy and Switzerland, was summited as a seven-member rope party led by British climber Edward Whymper reached the peak. (Four members of the party fell to their deaths during their descent; Whymper and two guides survived.)
1881, outlaw William H. Bonney Jr., alias "Billy the Kid," was shot and killed by Sheriff Pat Garrett in Fort Sumner in present-day New Mexico.
1914, scientist Robert H. Goddard received a U.S. patent for a liquid-fueled rocket apparatus.
1980, the Republican national convention opened in Detroit, where nominee-apparent Ronald Reagan told a welcoming rally he and his supporters were determined to "make America great again."
2009, disgraced financier Bernard Madoff arrived at the Butner Federal Correctional Complex in North Carolina to begin serving a 150-year sentence for his massive Ponzi scheme. (Madoff died in prison in April 2021.)
2014, the Church of England voted overwhelmingly in favor of allowing women to become bishops.

1980, draft registration began in the United States for 19- and 20-year-old men.
1999, Navy divers found and recovered the bodies of John F. Kennedy Jr., his wife, Carolyn, and sister-in-law, Lauren Bessette (bih-SEHT'), in the wreckage of Kennedy's plane in the Atlantic Ocean off Martha's Vineyard.
2011, the 30-year-old space shuttle program ended as Atlantis landed at Cape Canaveral, Florida, after the 135th shuttle flight.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

Hurricane Safety Checklist

Hurricanes are strong storms that cause life- and property threatening hazards such as flooding, storm surge, high winds and tornadoes. Preparation is the best protection against the dangers of a hurricane.

Know the Difference:

Hurricane Watch—Hurricane conditions are a threat within 48 hours. Review your hurricane plans, keep informed and be ready to act if a warning is issued.

Hurricane Warning—Hurricane conditions are expected within 36 hours. Complete your storm preparations and leave the area if directed to do so by authorities.

What should I do?

Listen to a NOAA Weather Radio for critical information from the National Weather Service (NWS).
Check your disaster supplies and replace or restock as needed.

Bring in anything that can be picked up by the wind (bicycles, lawn furniture).

Close windows, doors and hurricane shutters. If you do not have hurricane shutters, close and board up all windows and doors with plywood.

Turn the refrigerator and freezer to the coldest setting and keep them closed as much as possible so that food will last longer if the power goes out.

Turn off propane tanks and unplug small appliances. Fill your car's gas tank.

Talk with members of your household and create an evacuation plan. Planning and practicing your evacuation plan minimizes confusion and fear during the event.

Learn about your community's hurricane response plan. Plan routes to local shelters, register family members with special medical needs as required and make plans for your pets to be cared for.

Evacuate if advised by authorities. Be careful to avoid flooded roads and washed out bridges.
