deserve equity of opportunity and that strong supportive relationships promote change in individuals, organizations and systems. The EJS Project acknowledges racial discrimination and the barriers it has created in communities of color. They are dedicated to teaching truth, challenging systems, and fighting for its youth's access to opportunity. It is their aim to surround our youth with as many positive and forward thinking adults as possible.

Mayor Weinroth Gives Us an Overview

Our program on July 20th was presented by Robert Weinroth, Palm Beach County Mayor.

Palm Beach County (PBC) was recently identified as the top county in the state for growth and over the past few years, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) has approved more than \$3.4 million in economic incentives. This past year, approximately 30 companies have relocated or expanded in PBC creating over 3,000 high salary jobs, and generating over \$152 million in capital investment and \$1 billion in economic impact.

The BCC approved a lower tax (millage) rate for the first time in 15 years. The 2023 rate will be reduced from 4.78 to 4.71 per \$1,000 of taxable value.

Over the next few years, nearly \$18 million will be spent on major road projects in District 4, including bridge

refurbishments, resurfacing and intersection improvements. Expect to see road crews on South County roads!

The county requires all new residential development to provide a certain percentage of homes at workforce prices, and there are multiple opportunities for developers to meet this obligation.

In 2021, the BCC invested over \$39 million from CARES Act funds to support our local food system, including farmers, pantries and food banks. The food shortage allocation for 2022 is approximately \$10 million (federal ARPA funds) in conjunction with a comprehensive Hunger Relief Plan for seniors and individuals experiencing homelessness.

Whitfield Seeking Re-Election To School Board



Our program on July 27th was presented by Erica Whitfield. Erica currently serves on the Palm Beach County School Board (PBCSB). Since her election to the PBC School Board in 2014, Erica has worked to increase funding, raise standards, expand technology, improve efficiency and raise teacher pay.

Erica is running for re-election to continue building on our progress in Palm Beach County. The Palm Beach County School District recently received an A rating, and in 2020, had a 95.9% graduation rate. Erica will continue to advocate for every child to have access to a high-quality education regardless of their ZIP Code.

Erica supported the plan to make critical investments in education, including \$56 million a year for mental health and school safety services, \$56 million for arts, music, physical education, and choice programs, and \$112.5 million to increase teacher pay.

Since becoming a School Board member, Ms. Whitfield

has championed public health issues. She worked to implement the first policy requiring Hands-Only CPR be taught to every student before graduation. For the past several years, she has served as the Chair of the United Way's Childhood Hunger Action Committee – Childhood Subcommittee, and implemented Backpack and Food Pantry programs throughout the District, bringing in many community partners. She is championing improved academic success at private early learning centers in Lake Worth and Delray Beach through Community Collaborative sponsored by the Early Learning Coalition. She is building connections between the principals and City Commission in Lake Worth through the Education Advisory Board and at City Commission meetings. She serves on the American Heart Association Palm Beach County Market Board, the PBC Homeless Advisory Board, the Early Learning Coalition, Greater Florida Consortium of School Boards, Pine Jog Board of Directors, the Healthcare District of Palm Beach County Board and is a member of Leadership Florida, Leadership Palm Beach County and the Forum Club of the Palm Beaches. Ms. Whitfield lives in Lake Worth Beach with her husband and two children, one of whom is a current student in our schools and a younger child who is a future student. Unhealthy or "bad" fats

Trans fat. Small amounts of naturally occurring trans fats can be found in meat and dairy products but it's

artificial trans fats that are considered dangerous. This is the worst type of fat since it not only raises bad LDL cholesterol but also lowers good HDL levels. Artificial trans fats can also create inflammation, which is linked to heart disease, stroke, and other chronic conditions and contributes to insulin resistance, which increases your risk of developing Type 2 diabetes.

In the U.S., the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has effectively outlawed the use of artificial trans-fats in commercially prepared food and the World Health Organization (WHO) has called on other governments around the world to eliminate the use of trans fats by 2023. However, products made before the FDA ban may still be available for sale. Since products can be listed as having "zero trans fats" even if they contain up to 0.5 grams of trans fat per serving, it's still important to carefully read food labels. Look for ingredients referred to as "partially hydrogenated oils." These hidden sources of artificial trans fats can add up quickly.

Trans fat – primary sources include: Commercially-baked pastries, cookies, doughnuts, muffins, cakes, pizza dough; Packaged snack foods (crackers, microwave popcorn, chips); Stick margarine, vegetable

shortening; Fried foods (French fries, fried chicken, chicken nuggets, breaded fish); Anything containing hydrogenated or partially hydrogenated vegetable oil, even if it claims to be "trans fat-free".

Saturated fat. While not as harmful as trans fat, saturated fat can raise bad LDL cholesterol and too much can negatively impact heart health, so it's best consumed in moderation. While there's no need to cut out all saturated fat from your diet, most nutrition experts recommend limiting it to 10% of your daily calories.

Saturated fat – primary sources include: Red meat (beef, lamb, pork); Chicken skin; Whole-fat dairy products (milk, cream, cheese); Butter; Ice cream; Lard; Tropical oils such as coconut and palm oil.

What studies highlight is that when cutting down on saturated fats in your diet, it's important to replace them with the right foods. For example, swapping animal fats for vegetable oils—such as replacing butter with olive oil—can help lower your cholesterol and reduce your risk for disease. However, swapping animal fats for refined carbohydrates—such as replacing your breakfast bacon with a bagel or pastry—won't have the same benefits. That's because eating refined carbohydrates or sugary foods can have a similar negative effect on your cholesterol levels, your risk for heart disease, and your weight.

Limiting your intake of saturated fat can still help improve your health—as long as you take care to replace it with good fat rather than refined carbs.

In other words, don't go no fat, go good fat.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

Knowing how the IRS contacts taxpayers can help protect people from scammers

Scammers often pose as the IRS to steal taxpayers' personal information. They may reach out through fraudulent phone calls, emails, texts or social media messages. It's important for taxpayers to understand how the IRS contacts people, so they don't fall victim to identity thieves.

Generally, the IRS will mail a notice or letter to a taxpayer first. Taxpayers can search IRS notices by visiting [Understanding Your IRS Notice or Letter](#). However, not all IRS notices are searchable on the site. Be aware that fraudsters sometimes claim they already notified the taxpayer by mail or reference an IRS notice to make their scam seem legitimate. Taxpayers may check their [secured online account](#) or contact the IRS to confirm legitimacy of a notice.

Debt relief firms often send unsolicited tax debt relief offers through the mail.

The IRS may send taxpayers a notice about filing [past due tax returns](#). They should send their past due return to the address provided in the notice. Taxpayers can use the [prior year forms, instructions and publications](#) on IRS.gov to file past due returns or they can work with a tax professional.

After mailing a notice or letter, the IRS may call a taxpayer. IRS revenue agents or tax compliance officers may call a taxpayer or tax professional after mailing a notice to confirm an appointment or to discuss items for a scheduled audit. The IRS encourages taxpayers to review, [How to Know it's Really the IRS Calling or Knocking on Your Door: Collection](#).

The IRS does not leave pre-recorded, urgent or threatening messages. In many phone scams, victims are told if they do not call back, a warrant will be issued for their arrest.

Private debt collectors, contracted by the IRS, can call taxpayers to collect certain outstanding inactive tax liabilities, but only after the taxpayer and their representative have received written notice.

Private debt collection shouldn't be confused with debt relief firms who will call, send lien notices or email taxpayers with debt relief offers.

The IRS doesn't initiate contact with taxpayers by email to request personal or financial information.

Taxpayers shouldn't reply to a [phishing email](#) from someone who claims to be from the IRS, because the email address could be spoofed or fake. Emails from IRS employees will end in IRS.gov.

The IRS doesn't send text messages or contact people through social media.

Other than IRS Secure Access, the IRS does not use text messages to discuss personal tax issues, such as those involving bills or refunds. The IRS also will not send taxpayers messages via social media platforms.

Scammers may text a taxpayer with a phony message about COVID-19 or "stimulus payments." These messages often contain bogus links claiming to be IRS websites or other online tools.

Fraudsters also will impersonate legitimate government agents and agencies on social media and try to initiate contact with taxpayers.

IRS revenue officers and agents may make in-person visits.

IRS revenue officers and agents routinely make unannounced visits to a taxpayer's home or place of business to discuss taxes owed, delinquent tax returns or a business falling behind on payroll tax deposits.

IRS revenue officers will request payment of taxes owed by the taxpayer. However, taxpayers should remember that payment will never be requested to a source other than the U.S. Treasury.

When visited by someone from the IRS, taxpayers should always ask for credentials. IRS representatives can always provide two forms of official credentials: a pocket commission and a [Personal Identity Verification Credential](#).

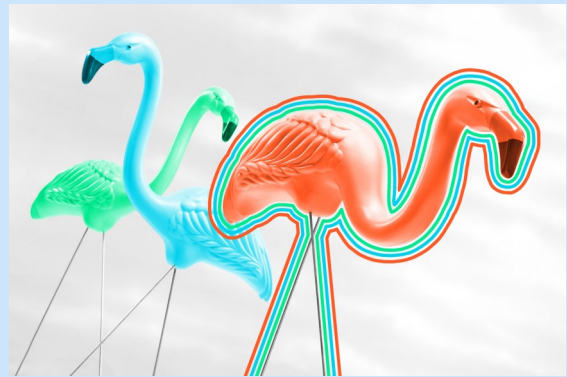

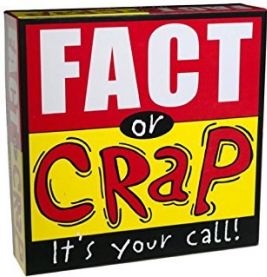

*Madison, Wisconsin's official bird...
Is a plastic flamingo.*

Wisconsinites are known for their love of cheese, so it's no surprise that the city of Madison's official bird is the invariably cheesy plastic flamingo. The lawn bird first "migrated" to town in 1979 as part of a prank on the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus. Students awoke one day that September to find the school's Bascom Hill covered with 1,008 plastic flamingos, which had been placed there by the school government's Pail & Shovel Party. The group was known for their absurdist stunts, including throwing a 10,000-person toga party and building a replica of the Statue of Liberty emerging from nearby Lake Mendota. Yet it wasn't until 2009, after a successful lobbying campaign from local newspaper columnist Doug Moe, that the Madison City Council voted 15-4 in favor of designating the plastic flamingo as the official city bird. Councilwoman Marsha Rummel defended the decision against the four dissenters by saying, "If you don't have a little fun, [life's] not worth living." These days, the prank-turned-tradition is recreated each year as a fundraiser.

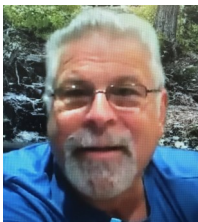

Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on "**This Date in History**". Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



July 7:

1846, U.S. annexation of California was proclaimed at Monterey after the surrender of a Mexican garrison.
1865, four people were hanged in Washington, D.C. for conspiring with John Wilkes Booth to assassinate President Abraham Lincoln.
1898, the United States annexed Hawaii.
1930, construction began on Boulder Dam (later Hoover Dam).
1948, six female U.S. Navy reservists became the first women to be sworn in to the regular Navy.
1976, the United States Military Academy at West Point included female cadets for the first time as 119 women joined the Class of 1980.
1990, the first "Three Tenors" concert took place as opera stars Luciano Pavarotti, Placido Domingo and Jose Carreras performed amid the brick ruins of Rome's Baths of Caracalla on the eve of the World Cup championship.
2013, Andy Murray became the first British man in 77 years to win the Wimbledon title, beating Novak Djokovic 6-4, 7-5, 6-4 in the final.

July 13:

1863, deadly rioting against the Civil War military draft erupted in New York City. (The insurrection was put down three days later.)
1923, a sign consisting of 50-foot-tall letters spelling out "HOLLYWOODLAND" was dedicated in the Hollywood Hills to promote a subdivision (the last four letters were removed in 1949).
1965, President Lyndon B. Johnson nominated Thurgood Marshall to be U.S. Solicitor General; Marshall became the first Black jurist appointed to the post. (Two years later, Johnson nominated Marshall to the U.S. Supreme Court.)
1973, former presidential aide Alexander P. Butterfield revealed to Senate Watergate Committee staff members the existence of President Richard Nixon's secret White House taping system. (Butterfield's public revelation came three days later.)
1985, "Live Aid," an international rock concert in London, Philadelphia, Moscow and Sydney, took place to raise money for Africa's starving people.
2011, California became the first state in the nation to add lessons about gays and lesbians to social studies classes in public schools under a measure signed by Gov. Jerry Brown.
2020, Washington's NFL franchise dropped the "Redskins" name and Indian head logo amid pressure from sponsors; the move followed decades of criticism that the name and logo were offensive to Native Americans. (As new names were considered, the team would be known as the Washington Football Team; the team was eventually renamed the Commanders.)
2021, Los Angeles Angels pitching and hitting star Shohei Ohtani unleashed his 100 mph heat while pitching a perfect inning for the win as the American League beat the National League 5-2 for its eighth straight victory in the All-Star Game.

1969, astronauts Neil Armstrong and Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin became the first men to walk on the moon after reaching the surface in their Apollo 11 lunar module.
1976, America's Viking 1 robot spacecraft made a successful, first-ever landing on Mars.
1977, a flash flood hit Johnstown, Pennsylvania, killing more than 80 people and causing \$350 million worth of damage.
