Police Appreciation - Fall 2022



Our Fall 2022 Police Appreciation awards took place on November 16th at the Delray Beach Golf Club. We recognized Detective Michael Cianciaruli and CSS Michelle Kelly.

On May 26th, the Town of Palm Beach had a 2021 black Land Rover taken from their jurisdiction. A 2014 grey Lexus was captured via an LPR (License Plate Reader) driving onto the island just prior to the theft. Shortly thereafter, the subjects in the Lexus located the Land Rover unlocked and with the keys in it. A suspect is seen exiting the 2014 grey Lexus, entering the Land Rover then both vehicles flee the scene. As a result, the Town of Palm Beach entered the 2014 grey Lexus into FCIC (Online Crime Information Center) as a felony vehicle.

The next day, Michelle was provided information regarding the felony vehicle entered by the Town of Palm Beach as part of the supervisor briefing. It was discovered that the 2014 grey Lexus was stopped two days prior by Highland Beach PD and occupant was given a citation. Michelle conducted extensive follow up via several resources, and she also spoke with Highland Beach and Gulf Stream PD. The description and the MO of the felony vehicle matched the case in the Town of Gulfstream. The suspects are also believed to be involved in a stolen vehicle case from Delray Beach.

As a result of Michelle's diligence, extensive follow-up and effective communication, the Criminal Intelligence Unit was able to relay the information to PD personnel for situational awareness regarding the felony vehicle, the suspect and potentially a wider criminal organization involving the theft of high end or luxury vehicles.

High end vehicle thefts have been a crime trend in the City of Delray Beach as well as surrounding agencies and often leads to more serious, violent crimes.

young adults, children, and their families by educating and advocating on their behalf, and by providing health care and supportive services that meet their physical, emotional, social and psychological needs.

¹ Today, the Center provides day care for seniors with varying degrees of dementia, and adults with disabilities at three locations, while also providing services for caregivers, including counseling, support groups, and information and referral.

Last year, the Volen Center provided almost 75,000 free, hot meals at seven senior dining sites located throughout southern Palm Beach County. Additionally, the Volen Center's large fleet of buses and vans provided almost 80,000 rides to and from doctor appointments and other life sustaining destinations during the same year.

Palm Tran is There When Needed



Our program on November 30th was presented by Christian Londono, the Director of Support Services, Palm Tran.

Palm Tran currently provides three types of public transit services: fixed route bus, paratransit (Connection), and Go Glades dial-a-ride service in the Belle Glade, Pahokee, and South Bay areas of the county. A brief

summary of each of these services is provided On their website. Current fare and ridership information is also provided. Each service offers discounted fares for qualifying passengers, such as students, adults age 65 years or older, Medicare recipients, veterans with a VA card, and persons with disabilities.

Connection provides paratransit service for eligible individuals unable to ride the fixed route bus. Go Glades is a dial-a-ride service that operates anywhere within the Belle Glade, Pahokee, and South Bay service areas based solely on demand from scheduled rider trips.

They have a fleet of 159 vehicles making over 2,970 stops. The fixed-route buses have Wi-Fi for their riders' convenience. For more information, go to https:// www.palmtran.org

Michelle's ability to collect and analyze various pieces of information, connecting the incidents over different jurisdictions and dates, then relaying it to the proper personnel for distribution was outstanding.

On July 31st, the Eagle Firearms gun store was burglarized overnight. The suspect used a metal crowbar to gain entry and was successful in stealing nine (9) handguns and three (3) high-powered long gun rifles for a total of 12 firearms. Although the surveillance video was of great quality, the suspect's face was covered with a ski mask and the suspect was wearing gloves, making identification difficult.

The next day, Michael C. was assigned as a lead investigator on the case. He promptly obtained a detailed inventory list of all the stolen firearms and their serial numbers, ensuring that they were entered into the FCIC (Online Crime Information Center) without delay.

Michael then began collaborating with an agent from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF).

Michael requested the Criminal Investigation Unit to develop a "Need to Identify" flyer and it was sent out to surrounding agencies. An intelligence analyst with Palm Beach Sheriff's Office responded with the name of a possible suspect that fit the physical description and was arrested for multiple business burglaries using a crowbar in 2018.

Michael followed up on that lead and diligently ran the suspect's criminal history and checked law enforcement databases, to develop a profile on the suspect. The suspect was a 32-time convicted felon, was recently released from jail, and had three months left on his probation.

On the morning of August 4th, while checking the suspect through FCIC once more, a reverse hit for an active warrant out of Desoto County appeared. This warrant was not in the system the day before.

Michael immediately called the Desoto County Sheriff's Office to inquire about the warrant and spoke to the Detective Sergeant, who advised that the suspect was wanted for numerous burglaries to gas stations (stealing cigarettes and lottery tickets), not only in Desoto County but in 5 other counties as well.

The Detective Sergeant advised that they just requested Broward Sheriff's Office to make contact with the suspect at his last known address in Pompano Beach. Knowing that there was a high possibility that this suspect was indeed the suspect who burglarized the firearm store, Michael called BSO without delay to warn and caution them that the suspect may be armed and dangerous.

Michael was in constant contact with the team of BSO Deputies when the suspect was apprehended. The Deputies stated that during the apprehension, they could see an AK 47 rifle in plain view within the residence; believed to be one of the firearms stolen from Eagle Firearms gun store.

Working together with BSO, Michael, and 3 other Delray detectives, responded to Pompano Beach at 1400 hrs on August 4th. Michael and the ATF agent interviewed the suspect in custody. At 2000 hrs, a BSO Judge granted a search warrant for the suspect's residence where BSO, along with Delray Detectives and Delray Crime Scene, recovered three (3) of the stolen firearms.

Michael contacted a Florida Department of Law Enforcement Agent due to the multi-agency investigation, and this case is now being prosecuted by the Office of the Attorney General Statewide Prosecutor.

Because of Det. Michael Cianciaruli's outstanding investigative work, the violent felon was identified and under arrest, along with the recovery of stolen firearms, all within five (5) days of the crime occurring.

If you suffered damage from Hurricane Ian, scammers may approach you to clean up debris, pose as a government official, or offer to help you get aid for a fee. Remember that it's always a scam when someone demands personal information or money upfront. Find more on how to deal with and recover from disasters at ftc.gov/weatheremergencies.

If you want to donate to victims of Hurricane Ian, here's how to make sure your money goes to the people you want to help:

 Visit FloridaConsumerHelp.com and use the FDACS Check-A-Charity tool to verify registration and financial information.

• Use these tools to research the organization before you give. Don't assume that familiar-sounding names or messages posted on social media are legitimate.

 Donate to charities you know and trust and with a proven record of dealing with disasters.

 Be cautious about giving to individuals on crowdfunding sites. It's safest to give to someone you personally know and trust. Review the platform's policies and procedures, not all crowdfunding sites verify postings for help after a disaster. Read Donating Through Crowdfunding, Social Media, and Fundraising Platforms.

• If someone wants donations in cash, by gift card, by wiring money or cryptocurrency, don't do it. Pay by credit card, which offers more protections, or by check.

Simple ways to build a cancerprevention diet

To lower your risk for many types of cancer—as well as

other serious disease—aim to build your diet around a variety of antioxidant-rich fruit and vegetables, nuts, beans, whole grains, and healthy fats. At the same time, try to limit the amount of processed and fried foods, unhealthy fats, sugars and refined carbs you consume.

Lower your risk with antioxidants

Plant-based foods are rich in nutrients known as antioxidants that boost your immune system and help protect against cancer cells.

- Diets high in fruit may lower the risk of stomach and lung cancer.
- Eating vegetables containing carotenoids, such as carrots, Brussels sprouts, and squash, may reduce the risk of lung, mouth, pharynx, and larynx cancers.
- Diets high in non-starchy vegetables, such as broccoli, spinach, and beans, may help protect against stomach and esophageal cancer.
- Eating oranges, berries, peas, bell peppers, dark leafy greens and other foods high in vitamin C may also protect against esophageal cancer.

Foods high in lycopene, such as tomatoes, guava, and watermelon, may lower the risk of prostate cancer.

Add more fruit and veggies to your diet

Currently, most of us fall well short of the recommended daily minimum of five servings of fruit and vegetables. To add more to your diet, focus on adding "whole" foods, as close to their natural state as possible. For example, eat an unpeeled apple instead of drinking apple juice.

November 3:

1839, the first Opium War between China and Britain broke out.

1911, the Chevrolet Motor Car Co. was founded in Detroit by Louis Chevrolet and William C. Durant. (The company was acquired by General Motors in 1918.) 1961, President John F. Kennedy established the U.S. Agency for International Development.

1979, five Communist Workers Party members were killed in a clash with heavily armed Ku Klux Klansmen and neo-Nazis during an anti-Klan protest in Greensboro, North Carolina.

1986, the Iran-Contra affair came to light as Ash-Shiraa, a pro-Syrian Lebanese magazine, first broke the story of U.S. arms sales to Iran.

1992, Democrat Bill Clinton was elected the 42nd president of the United States, defeating President George H.W. Bush. In Illinois, Democrat Carol Moseley-Braun became the first Black woman elected to the U.S. Senate.

1997, the Supreme Court let stand California's groundbreaking Proposition 209, which banned race and gender preference in hiring and school admissions.

2014, 13 years after the 9/11 terrorist attack, a new 1,776-foot skyscraper at the World Trade Center site opened for business, marking an emotional milestone for both New Yorkers and the nation. 2020, Democrat Joe Biden won the presidency in an election that saw more than

103 million Americans vote early, many by mail, amid a coronavirus pandemic that upended a campaign marked by fear and rancor, waged against a backdrop of protests over racial injustice. Kamala Harris made history as the first woman, Black person and person of South Asian descent to become vice president.


1907, Oklahoma became the 46th state of the union. 1914, the newly created Federal Reserve Banks opened in 12 cities.

2001, investigators found a letter addressed to Democratic Sen. Patrick Leahy of Vermont containing anthrax; it was the second letter bearing the deadly germ known to have been sent to Capitol Hill.

2006, Democrats embraced Nancy Pelosi as the first female House speaker in history, but then selected Steny Hoyer as majority leader against her wishes. 2021, Hospitals in Michigan and Minnesota reported a wave of COVID-19 patients not seen in months as beds were filled with unvaccinated people and health care leaders warned that staff were being worn down by yet another surge. Michelle Wu was sworn in as Boston's first woman and first person of color elected mayor in the city's long history.




This Month's Sudoku Puzzle....


- Each horizontal row has every number only once.

Executive Perspective

Several factors have kept Kiwanis International financially sound over the years - from our long-term investment policy to the disciplined oversight of our boards of trustees. The key: facing the facts in front of us.

In 2021-22, the Kiwanis International board did just that - by acknowledging the need for a dues-adjustment proposal. That proposal will be placed before the delegates at the 2023 Kiwanis International Convention in Minneapolis.

As always, several factors compose our financial situation. But in short, two years of pandemic-era economic conditions including global inflation and the investment markets' recent performance - led the board to this decision.

Kiwanis has been able to forgo a dues adjustment since 2015, thanks to our strong investment portfolio. The organization's financial reserve belongs to members, so it was only fair that the reserve's investment performance defray such adjustments. Now, market performance and inflation compel us to meet our fiduciary duty.

Of course, this proposal is hardly unprecedented. Inflation and other factors occasionally require Kiwanis to adjust member dues - as we did eight years ago. But that eight-year interval also indicates that we never propose such increases lightly.

Ultimately, Kiwanis International's financial health has resulted from the kinds of decisions we face now. In this new Kiwanis year, I'm confident we'll face this one - and continue maintaining our strength. We'll share more information with clubs in the coming months as the board finalizes a duesadjustment proposal.
