## Research Your Family History

Our program on November 22nd was presented by Marjorie Ferrer, representing the DAR, Daughters of the American Revolution.

The DAR is an organization with a deeply rich history while also being truly relevant in today's world. More than 1,000,000 women have joined the organization since it was founded over 125 years ago. They became members to honor their heritage as well as make a difference in their communities across the country and the world.

Are you just starting out on your journey to discover your family roots...or are you one document away from solving a mystery of one of your ancestors? Wherever you are in your genealogical process, DAR is here to help. The DAR Genealogical Research System (GRS) includes free online databases containing information on Revolutionary patriot ancestors, descendants of those patriots, as well as the vast array of genealogical resources from the DAR Library.

DAR members come from a variety of backgrounds and interests, but all share a common bond of having an ancestor who helped contribute to securing the independence of the United States of America. Any woman 18 years or older, regardless of race, religion or ethnic background, who can prove lineal descent from a patriot of the American Revolution is eligible to join. ## The Delray Library Has It All



Our program on November 15th was presented by member **Mykal Banta**, the Executive Director for the Delray Beach Public Library.

There's always something going on at the library. Here are a few of the services the Library provides: They bring the library to neighborhood schools and community centers with outreach programs. They are the only library in the state of Florida that provides a Lifelong Learning Institute. They provide over 4,000 free books to children during the summer camp reading programs. They offer meeting rooms (both large and small) for studying, lectures, programs and rentals.

They offer innovative after school clubs that include Weird Science, Robotics and 3D printing. They offer a state of the art recording studio for children to create audio stories, record songs, and narrate books. They provide assistance in resume writing, job searching, and public assistance programs. They provide a variety of new Technology Resources for children that include computers with educational programs, tablet kiosks, learning tech lab, and the interactive educational "cube".

They have many adult programs and they provide dedicated librarians who support local businesses with information, research, and referrals. They offer after school homework help for children with friendly and knowledgeable staff and volunteers. They provide databases for learning languages, and reading ebooks, free of charge. They offer Ukulele Classes along with seasonal music programs including the Musical Matinee Program.

## DID YOU KNOW?

### The Mail, Internet, or Telephone Order Merchandise Rule

(the "Rule") applies to most things you buy online.

Here's the upshot of the rule:

- Merchants must ship your order when they say they will. If there's a delay, they must tell you and give you two options: 1) agree to the delayed shipping or 2) cancel and get a refund.
- If you choose a refund, the refund must go back to the original form of payment. The merchant can't give you a gift card or store credit.

The Rule requires that when a merchant advertises merchandise, there must be a reasonable basis for stating or implying that the merchandise can be shipped within a certain time. If the merchant makes no shipment statement, they must have a reasonable basis for believing that they can ship within 30 days. That is why direct marketers sometimes call this the "30-day Rule."

"Reasonable basis" means that the merchant has, at the time of making the representation, such information as would under the circumstances satisfy a reasonable and prudent businessperson, acting in good faith, that the representation is true.

If, after taking the customer's order, the merchant learns that they cannot ship within the stated time or within 30 days, the merchant must seek the customer's consent to the delayed shipment. If they cannot obtain the customer's consent to the delay -- either because it is not a situation in which the merchant is permitted to treat the customer's silence as consent and the customer has not expressly consented to the delay, or because the customer has expressly refused to consent -- the merchant must, without being asked, promptly refund all the money the customer paid for the unshipped merchandise.

The "clock" on the merchant's obligation to ship or take other action under the Rule begins as soon as they receive a "properly completed" order. An order is properly completed when the merchant receives the correct full or partial (in whatever form they accept) payment, accompanied by all the information needed to fill the order. Payment may be by cash, check, money order, the customer's authorization to charge an existing account (including one the merchant created for the customer), the customer's application to the merchant for credit to pay for the order, or any other method.

It is irrelevant when the merchant posts or deposits payment, when checks clear, or when the merchant's bank credits their account. The clock begins to run when the merchant receives a properly completed order.

The Rule was originally issued in 1975 and covered mail and phone-based purchases. It was officially amended in 2014 to cover internet purchases and to clarify the merchant's obligation for providing refunds and refund notices to buyers.

## **PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT**

### **RECOGNIZING FRAUDULENT MESSAGES**

Fraudulent e-mails and texts come in many styles and formats, but the one thing they all have in common is their purpose: to steal money and information from consumers. These messages are designed to win a consumers trust by spoofing the identity of trusted, well-established organizations. They may appear legitimate by incorporating company brands, colors, or other legal disclaimers. Help protect yourself by becoming familiar with these methods of fraud:

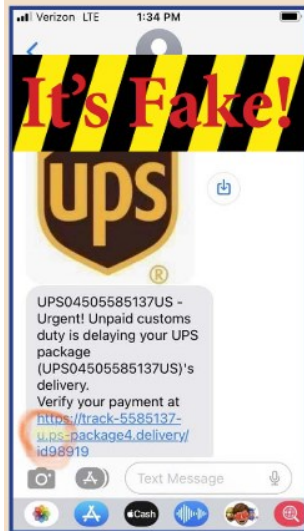
- Spam: Often referred to as "junk mail," spam consists of e-mail messages that are unsolicited by the recipient and that target the recipient with direct mail messages.
- Phishing: The term "phishing," as in fishing for confidential information, refers to a scam in which the sender attempts to fraudulently obtain and use personal or financial information.

Legitimate organizations do not request payments, personal information, financial information, account numbers, IDs, passwords, or copies of invoices in an unsolicited manner through e-mail, mail, phone, or fax or specifically in exchange for the transportation of goods or services.

Awareness and recognition of fraudulent letters, e-mails, texts, and phishing attempts is vital to protecting yourself against theft and other related crimes.

Common indicators that a message might be fraudulent include the following:

- Design Flaws: Distorted or irregularly sized logos.
- Poor Grammar: Grammatical errors and excessive use of exclamation points.
- Misspellings: Incorrectly spelled words or links to altered websites (For example, modifications or variations of a legitimate website, such as [www.ups.com](http://www.ups.com) website address being altered to [www.unitedparcelservices.com](http://www.unitedparcelservices.com)).
- Sense of Urgency: Alarming messages requesting immediate action, such as "Your account will be suspended within 24 hours." or "Contact us immediately to claim your parcel or prize."
- Unexpected Requests: A request attempting to obtain money, financial information (e.g., bank account or payment card numbers), or personal information in exchange for the delivery of a package or other article.
- Communication Gaps: An e-mail that does not provide an alternative method for communicating the requested information (i.e. telephone, mail, or physical locations).
- Deceptive Link: A link contained within an e-mail that appears to direct your browser to a known, safe site but actually directs your browser to another location, potentially to an unsafe or fraudulent site. You can detect this by hovering over the link with your cursor. This causes the actual destination of the link to display in a pop-up, the lower left of your status bar, or other location depending on your e-mail client. It is suspicious if the actual destination does not match the address in the link. Also be suspicious of links containing numbers in place of letters, abbreviations, and slight misspellings in the link.



Fraudulent e-mails often appear to come from trusted sources, with the true sender revealed only through the Internet headers (not the same as the email headers). The Internet headers can be found through your e-mail system from within the e-mail, using various methods depending upon the e-mail system you use. For example, in Microsoft Outlook, this is accomplished by opening the e-mail in a separate window, clicking on the "File" tab and then choosing "Properties." The internet headers will be shown in the box at the bottom of the window.

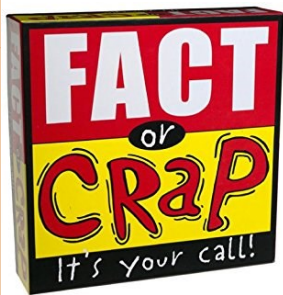

## HEALTHY LIVING TIP



### Eating To Your Heart's Content

Deciding to change your diet can feel daunting. It can be challenging to figure out which one is "best" for you. Many fad diets come and go, but a few have stuck around, the most popular being the Mediterranean diet.

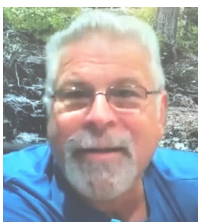
The Mediterranean diet is more of a lifestyle shift toward healthier eating patterns. Modeled after principles of Italian and Greek cuisine, which have remained relatively unchanged since the 1960s, this diet may lead to lower rates of heart disease, type 2 diabetes, and other chronic illnesses. The diet emphasizes eating more fruits, vegetables, legumes, nuts, seeds, fatty fish, whole grains, olive oil, and fewer meats and dairy products. The diet is flexible. Elimination isn't the intention, but rather favoring more nutrient-rich foods over energy-dense ones.

Food is life, and healthy choices can help support a healthier life. While the Mediterranean diet could be a good option, no single diet will ideally fit everyone's lifestyle, preferences, and health needs. So, discuss your dietary choices with your physician or registered dietitian first.

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on **"This Date in History"**. Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



### **November 2:**

1783, General George Washington issued his Farewell Address to the Army near Princeton, New Jersey.  
1917, British Foreign Secretary Arthur Balfour issued a declaration expressing support for a "national home" for the Jews in Palestine.  
1920, white mobs rampaged through the Florida citrus town of Ocoee, setting fire to Black-owned homes and businesses, after a Black man, Mose Norman, showed up at the polls to vote on Election Day; some historians estimate as many as 60 people were killed.  
1976, former Georgia Gov. Jimmy Carter became the first candidate from the Deep South since the Civil War to be elected president as he defeated incumbent Gerald R. Ford.

2016, ending a championship drought that had lasted since 1908, the Chicago Cubs won the World Series, defeating the Cleveland Indians 8-7 in extra innings.  
2020, in the closing hours of the presidential campaign, President Donald Trump charged across the nation delivering a false allegation that the election was being rigged, while Democrat Joe Biden pushed to claim states that were once seen as safely Republican.  
2021, the Atlanta Braves won their first World Series championship since 1995, hammering the Houston Astros in Game 6.

2011, an asteroid as big as an aircraft carrier zipped by Earth in the closest encounter by such a massive space rock in more than three decades.  
2012, Jared Lee Loughner was sentenced to life in prison without parole for the January 2011 shootings in Tucson, Arizona, that killed six people and wounded 13 others, including Rep. Gabrielle Giffords.  
2016, Republican Donald Trump was elected America's 45th president, defeating Democrat Hillary Clinton in an astonishing victory for a celebrity businessman and political novice.  
2018, tens of thousands of people fled a fast-moving wildfire in Northern California that would become the state's deadliest ever, killing 86 people and nearly destroying the community of Paradise.

1942, the naval Battle of Guadalcanal ended during World War II with a decisive U.S. victory over Japanese forces.

1984, Stephanie Fae Beauclair, the infant publicly known as "Baby Fae" who had received a baboon's heart to replace her own congenitally deformed one, died at Loma Linda University Medical Center in California three weeks after the transplant.  
2018, the number of confirmed dead from the wildfire that had virtually destroyed the Northern California town of Paradise reached 63. (It would eventually total 85.)

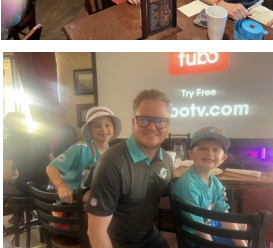

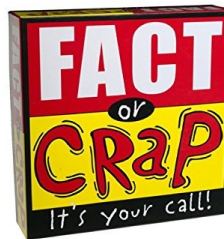

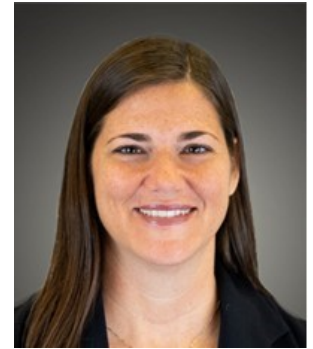
