Old School Isn't So Square

We had the privilege of having Leanne Griffith give us a presentation on Old School Square at our 1st meeting of the New Year. Leanne is the Community Outreach Volunteer Coordinator for OSS.

Discover Old School Square Cultural Arts Center and National Historic Site, where beautifully restored, early 20th century school buildings enrich the greater Delray Beach community and South Florida with visual and performing arts. This award-winning, nationally recognized cultural center successfully combined historic preservation and the arts to become the

catalyst for the 1990's renaissance of downtown Delray Beach.

The charming **Cornell Museum of Art and American Culture** (c. 1913) presents rotating local, national and international exhibits of fine art, crafts and pop culture. The intimate, 323-seat **Crest Theatre** (c. 1925) presents world-class musicals, comedy, variety, Broadway cabaret with New York's hottest stars, and lectures with nationally renowned speakers. The **Vintage Gymnasium** is used primarily as a rental facility for wedding ceremonies, receptions, meetings, craft shows, and other corporate and private events. The restored **classrooms** are used for Old School Square's art and photography classes; they are also used as rental spaces for meetings and seminars. Old School Square's Mission is to be the community's cultural center, enriching the lives of all people by presenting diverse experiences in visual and performing arts, education, and entertainment; nurturing artistic expression and involvement; providing a community gathering place; and preserving our National Historic Site. CIW - A Champion of Human Rights

Our program on January 12th was presented by Jordan Buckley and Romeo Ramierez of the Coalition of Immokalee Workers (CIW). The CIW is a community-based organization of mainly Latino, Mayan Indian and Haitian immigrants working in low-wage jobs throughout the state of Florida. They try to ensure fair wages and conditions for our Florida tomato pickers.

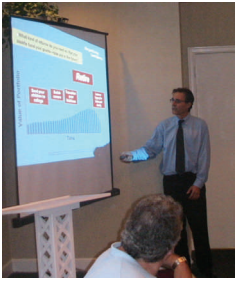
Florida tomato pickers are among this country's most exploited workers: they earn sub-poverty wages with no right to organize, no right to overtime pay, and no benefits whatsoever. Farm workers have to pick more than two tons of tomatoes to make \$50 a day.

formed an Alliance with Yum Brands, McDonalds, Burger King, Whole foods, Subway and Compass to collaborate with the CIW in developing an industry-wide third party mechanism for monitoring conditions in the fields and investigating abuses tied to their purchases.

In total, nine leading food retailers – including the four largest restaurant companies in the world and the country's three largest food service providers – have joined their voices to the growing call for a more modern, more humane agricultural industry in Florida. It is now up to the rest of the super- market industry to follow suit.

Publix has yet to get on board and they refuse to tie their purchases to the Fair Food principles. Publix spokesperson Dwaine Stevens actually said these words -- "*If there are some atrocities going on, it's not our business*" -- in response to questions about farm labor exploitation in the grocery giant's supply chain.

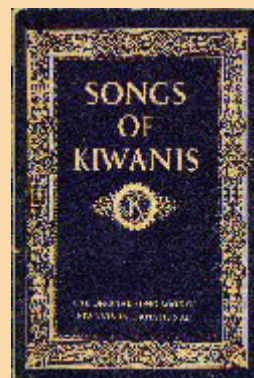

Did You Know.....?

Many Kiwanis Song Books have been published over the years. The one pictured at right, "Songs of Kiwanis," was originally compiled by the International Committee on Music in 1920-24 and revised by the same committee in 1926-27.



"The present editors have tried to make the book practical for the Kiwanians of today," wrote the editors only 12 years after Kiwanis came into existence.

The book includes suggestions for Kiwanis song leaders, and songs with those hit titles like "Onward in Kiwanis," "Kiwanis," and "I'd Rather Belong to Kiwanis," along with many old standbys. The 128-page book also includes a list of suggested songs for special occasions, including Bastille Day and Washington's Birthday. *(This really got Steve excited).*

The newest version of the book, published in 1989, is on sale in the Kiwanis International online store.

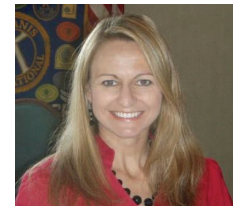

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

Why drink beer?

Who ever thought there would be health benefits to drinking beer? Well, there is! Studies have revealed that beer can produce the same benefits as drinking wine. Whether you prefer ales, lagers, stout, bitter or wheat beers, studies show that one drink a day for women or up to two drinks a day for men will reduce your chances of strokes, heart and vascular disease. It's no secret that the stroke is the 3rd leading cause of death in the U.S. and the leading cause of serious, long-term disabilities.

What's interesting is that it was proven (New England Journal of Medicine - Nov. 1999) that those who drank one beer a week compared to those who drank one beer a day experienced no variance in reducing stroke risks. It is said that light to moderate drinkers will decrease their chances of suffering a stroke by 20%.

A researcher at the Texas Southwestern Medical Center (May 1999) reported that those who consume moderate amounts of beer (one to two a day at the most) have a 30-40% lower rate of coronary heart disease compared to those who don't drink. Beer contains a similar amount of 'polyphenols' (antioxidants) as red wine and 4-5 times as many polyphenols as white wine.

Alcohol has also been attributed of its ability to increase the amount of good cholesterol (HDL) into the bloodstream as well as help to decrease blood clots.

Beer also contains vitamin B6, which prevents the build-up of amino acid called homocysteine that has been linked to heart disease. Those of us who have high levels of homocysteine are usually more prone to an early onset of heart and vascular disease. A new study performed at the TNO Nutrition and Food Research Institute in Utrecht indicates that those who drink beer had no increase in their homocysteine level but those who drank wine or liquor had an increase of up to 10%. Also noted was the fact that those who drank beer experienced a 30% increase in vitamin B6 in their blood plasma, thereby proving that beer (in moderation) is actually healthier to drink than wine and other liquor.

Did you know? - Beer is nutritious if consumed in moderation. - That beer is fat-free and cholesterol free? - Beer has a relaxing effect on the body thereby reducing stress. - It can help you sleep better. - It helps prevent heart disease and improves the blood circulation. - It has proven to have positive effects on elderly people. It helps to promote blood vessel dilation, sleep, and urination.

Now after reading all this 'good stuff' on beer, this isn't to say that you should go out and get 'boozed up' because it's good for you! Obviously the key, as was mentioned earlier, is moderation.

It's Time to Serve.....

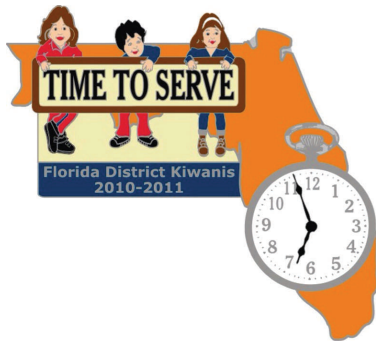
Happy New Year everyone! Carol and I want to wish each and every one of you a healthy and Happy New Year.
