Responsible Angling Magnified

Our program on January 9th was Metropulos, the executive director of

Fishing for Families in Need. The program was started in the Fall of invasive species, overfishing, ocean 2008 with six children from the Florence Fuller Child Developmental Center in Boca Raton, FL. Since then,

the program has taught thousands of children to be ethical anglers and good stewards of the sea through hands on classes with the help of hundreds of volunteers in the United States and the Caribbean.

In addition, the organization has provided thousands of meals of fresh fish to a local soup kitchen through the fishing tournament donation

program.

The educational programs range presented by Nicholas from 2-8 weeks long during the school year and summer with children ages 5-18 years old in multiple locations. Core topics taught include: pollution, marine conservation, coastal habitats, and basic fishing knots, how to cast a fishing rod

> properly, and about what to carry in their tackle box.

They also continue to partner with local fishing tournaments and private individuals to provide local soup kitchens with any excess fish caught. The

organization has been the recipient of multiple national and local awards.

Put The Glass Down



A Closer Look at **Antioxidants**

Antioxidant is a catchall term for any compound that can counteract unstable molecules such as free radicals that damage DNA, cell membranes, and other parts of cells.

Your body cells naturally produce plenty of antioxidants to put on patrol. The foods you eat—and, perhaps, some of the supplements you take—are another source of antioxidant compounds.

Antioxidants are able to neutralize marauders such as free radicals by giving up some of their own electrons. When a vitamin C or E molecule makes this sacrifice, it may allow a crucial protein, gene, or cell membrane to escape damage. This helps break a chain reaction that can affect many other

It is important to recognize that the term "antioxidant" reflects a chemical property rather than a specific nutritional property. Each of the nutrients that has antioxidant properties also has numerous other aspects and should be considered individually. The context is also important—in some settings, for example, vitamin C is an antioxidant, and in others it can be a pro-oxidant.

Articles and advertisements have touted antioxidants as a way to help slow aging, fend off heart disease, improve flagging vision, and curb cancer. Research findings suggest little overall benefit of the antioxidants in pill form. On the other hand, many studies show that people who consume higher levels of these antioxidants in food have a lower risk of many diseases. The bottom line? Eating a healthy diet is the best way to get your antioxidants.

January 3:
