GAL is There For The Kids

Our program on January 12th was presented by Christie Geltz, representing the Guardian ad Litem (GAL) Program in Palm Beach County. and permanent

The GAL Program in Palm Beach County is a partnership of trained, court appointed, community advocates and professional staff providing a powerful voice on behalf of abandoned, abused and neglected children.

Many of the children have been removed from their home and are with relatives, friends, or in foster care. Together with the support and guidance of the GAL staff and GAL attorneys, GAL Volunteers strengthen the voice of the child and ensure they do not become lost in the system.

During fiscal year 2020, GAL served 2,401 children. A child with a GAL is ... More likely to be adopted; 1/2 as

likely to re-enter foster care; More likely to find a safe home; and more apt to receive the



appropriate physical, educational and emotional care they need through available child services.

Many people ask how they can get involved. Hear about becoming a Guardian ad Litem, and find how, with as little as five hours a month, you can make a lifelong impact on the life of a local foster child. For more information go to https://galpbc.org/



CityHouse Helps Single Mothers in Need



Our program on January 26th was presented by Victoria Harris, the Lead Family Advocate for CityHouse.

CityHouse is a social impact

organization that provides hope & renewal to homeless single mothers and their children. Founded in 2014, they are a long-term, supportive, transformational living program.

CityHouse is a two to three-year program that offers safe and affordable housing, wrap-around services, daily mentoring, educational opportunities, mental health services, and skill-building opportunities. They focus on empowering their mothers to live healthier lives through education, community, and career development

offering a holistic approach to each family's multifaceted needs.

Apartments are newly renovated, fully furnished, and stocked with necessities, such as toiletries. Residents are responsible for a small number of rental expenses, equaling about 30 percent of a full-time, minimum salary. Through strategic partnerships, they have also developed a program model with lowcost services that lead to enhanced opportunities and ultimately to healthier families for generations to come. Organic Foods: What You Need to Know

Is organic food really healthier? Is it worth the

expense? Find out what the labels mean and which foods give you the most bang for your buck.

Organic food buying tips

Buy in season. Fruits and vegetables are cheapest and freshest when they are in season. Find out when produce is delivered to your market so you're buying the freshest food possible.

Shop around. Compare the price of organic items at the grocery store, the farmers' market, online, and in other venues (even the freezer aisle).

Remember that organic doesn't always equal healthy. Making junk food sound healthy is a common marketing ploy in the food industry but organic baked goods, desserts, and snacks are usually still very high in sugar, salt, fat, or calories. It pays to read food labels carefully.

Why is organic food often more expensive?

Organic food is more labor intensive since the farmers do not use synthetic pesticides, chemical fertilizers, or drugs. Organic certification is expensive and organic feed for animals can cost twice as much. Organic farms tend to be smaller than conventional farms, which means fixed costs and overhead must be distributed across smaller produce volumes without government subsidies.

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



<u>January 6:</u>

1838, Samuel Morse and Alfred Vail gave the first successful public demonstration of their telegraph in Morristown, New Jersey.

Sunriser

1912, New Mexico became the 47th state. 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt, in his State of the Union address, outlined a goal of "Four Freedoms": Freedom of speech and expression; the freedom of people to worship God in their own way; freedom from want; freedom from fear. 1974, year-round daylight saving time began in the United States on a trial basis as a fuel-saving measure in response to the OPEC oil embargo.

1994, figure skater Nancy Kerrigan was clubbed on the leg by an assailant at Detroit's Cobo Arena; four men, including the ex-husband of Kerrigan's rival, Tonya Harding, went to prison for their roles in the attack.

2021, supporters of President Donald Trump, fueled by his false claims of a stolen election, assaulted police and smashed their way into the Capitol to interrupt the certification of Democrat Joe Biden's victory, forcing lawmakers into hiding; most of the rioters had come from a nearby rally where Trump urged them to "fight like hell." Congress reconvened hours later to finish certifying the election result.

<u>Birthdays:</u>Country musician Joey Miskulin (Riders in the Sky) is 73. World Golf Hall of Famer Nancy Lopez is 65. Actor Scott Bryce is 64. TV personality Julie Chen is 52. Actor Danny Pintauro (TV: "Who's the Boss?") is 46. Actor Eddie Redmayne is 40. Actor-comedian Kate McKinnon is 38.

<u>January 12:</u>

1828, the United States and Mexico signed a Treaty of Limits defining the boundary between the two countries to be the same as the one established by an 1819 treaty between the U.S. and Spain.

1910, at a White House dinner hosted by President William Howard Taft, Baroness Rosen, wife of the Russian ambassador, caused a stir by requesting and smoking a cigarette — it was, apparently, the first time a woman had smoked openly during a public function in the executive mansion. (Some of the other women present who had brought their own cigarettes began lighting up in turn.)

1915, the U.S. House of Representatives rejected, 204-174, a proposed constitutional amendment to give women nationwide the right to vote. 1932, Hattie W. Caraway became the first woman elected to the U.S. Senate after initially being appointed to serve out the remainder of the term of her late

husband, Thaddeus. ' 1948, the U.S. Supreme Court, in Sipuel v. Board of Regents of University of Oklahoma, unanimously ruled that state law schools could not discriminate against applicants on the basis of race.

1959, Berry Gordy Jr. founded Motown Records (originally Tamla Records) in

Detroit.

1966, The TV series "Batman," starring Adam West and Burt Ward as the Dynamic Duo, premiered on ABC.

1969, the New York Jets of the American Football League upset the Baltimore

Colts of the National Football League 16-7 in Super Bowl III, played at the Orange Bowl in Miami.

1971, the groundbreaking situation comedy "All in the Family" premiered on CBS television

2017, President Barack Obama ended the longstanding "wet foot, dry foot" immigration policy that allowed any Cuban who made it to U.S. soil to stay and become a legal resident.

1861, Georgia became the fifth state to secede from the Union.

1915, Germany carried out its first air raid on Britain during World War I as a pair of Zeppelins dropped bombs onto Great Yarmouth and King's Lynn in England.

1953, CBS-TV aired the widely watched episode of "I Love Lucy" in which Lucy Ricardo, played by Lucille Ball, gave birth to Little Ricky. (By coincidence, Ball gave birth the same day to her son, Desi Arnaz Jr.)

1966, Indira Gandhi was chosen to be prime minister of India by the National Congress party.

1981, the United States and Iran signed an accord paving the way for the release of 52 Americans held hostage for more than 14 months.

2020, health officials in central China reported that 17 more people had been diagnosed with the new coronavirus, which had killed two patients and placed other countries on alert.

2021, On President Donald Trump's last full day in office, Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell placed blame on Trump for the riot at the Capitol on Jan. 6; McConnell said the mob had been "fed lies," and that Trump and others "provoked" those who were intent on overturning Democrat Joe Biden's election.

1861, Louisiana passed an Ordinance of Secession, becoming the sixth state to

break free from the United States.

1915, President Woodrow Wilson signed the Rocky Mountain National Park Act, which created America's 10th national park.

1962, the United States launched Ranger 3 to land scientific instruments on the moon. (The probe ended up missing its target by more than 22,000 miles.) 1994, a scare occurred during a visit to Sydney, Australia, by Britain's Prince Charles as college student David Kang lunged at the prince, firing two blank

shots from a starter's pistol. (Kang was later sentenced to 500 hours of community service.)

1998, President Bill Clinton forcefully denied having an affair with a former White House intern, telling reporters, "I did not have sexual relations with that woman, Miss Lewinsky

2009, Nadya Suleman gave birth at Kaiser Permanente Bellflower Medical Center in California to six boys and two girls; criticism came after the public learned that the unemployed, single mother had gotten pregnant with the octuplets and six elder children through in vitro fertilization.

2020, NBA legend Kobe Bryant, his 13-year-old daughter and seven others were killed when their helicopter plunged into a steep hillside in dense morning fog in Southern California; the former Lakers star was 41.

Hi to The Mighty Florida District. We (Harvey and first daughter Abby) hope you all had a happy holiday season and first quarter of the Kiwanis year.




