Become a "Britsionary"



Our program on December 14th was presented by Len Gengel, the Co-Founder and President of the Be Like Brit Foundation.

Britney Gengel was a beautiful, fearless, and compassionate 19 year old when she decided to travel with her college, Lynn University, to the country of Haiti. She was inspired to send the following text to her mother: "They love us so much and everyone is so happy....I want to move here and start an orphanage myself." ~ Britney Gengel sent this text to her Mom on 1/12/2010.

Shortly after sending the text, a catastrophic 7.0 magnitude earthquake struck Haiti. It's impact killed an estimated 300,000 people, including Britney. Her family could not let her die in vain so in loving memory they started the Be Like Brit Foundation, Inc. Over the course of two years, a 19,000 sq. ft earthquake proof orphanage was built in Grand Goave, Haiti — the town where Brit was supposed to travel to the day after the earthquake.

Today, they have 33 girls and 33 boys living and thriving in the orphanage. Those who visit the orphanage to help are called Britsionarys. Tourette Syndrome is a neurological disorder characterized by repetitive, stereotyped, involuntary movements and vocalizations called tics. 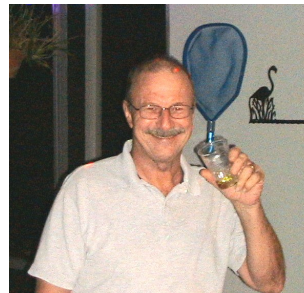

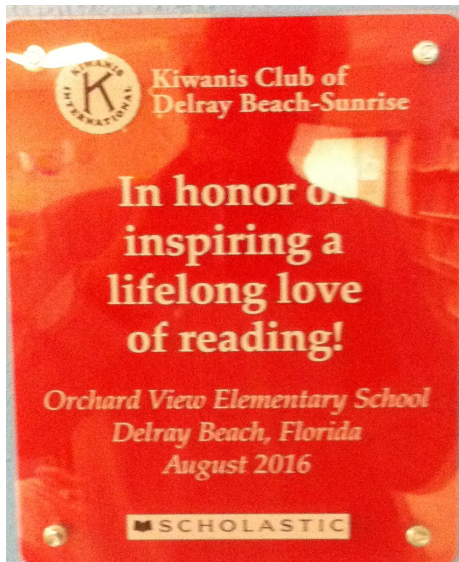

Blood Pressure Control

70% of US adults age 65 or older have high blood pressure and only about half have it under control (less than 140/90 mmHg).

Blood pressure medicine (along with a healthy diet and exercise) can protect the heart, brain, and kidneys, but only if patients take it and keep their blood pressure controlled. However, at least 25% of adults, ages 65 or older, with Medicare Part D prescription drug insurance are not taking their blood pressure medicine as directed. This means they may skip doses or stop taking it altogether. Health care systems, including providers, medical practices, pharmacies, hospitals, community health workers, and insurers can work with patients to make taking medicine easier.

Medicines don't work if people don't take them.

The reasons people don't take their blood pressure medicine as directed vary:

1. Not filling the prescription – Nearly 25% of new prescriptions for blood pressure medicine are never filled.
2. No symptoms – People with high blood pressure often don't have symptoms so some may not treat a problem they don't notice.
3. Complexity – People don't know when to take which pills when they have multiple medicines.
4. Side effects – Medicines may have unwanted side effects.
5. Forgetting – People forget to take their medicine or refill prescriptions on time.
6. Cost – Medicine costs may be too high for some people.

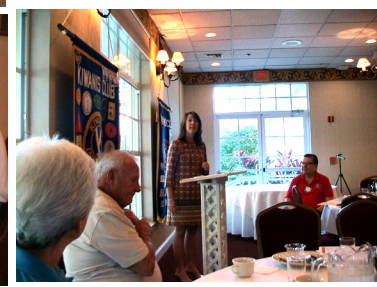
