More About Kiwanis International

1. English is the official language of Kiwanis International. However, key administrative and program literature is published in up to 13 additional languages, and simultaneous translation is provided at International conventions when required by a sufficient number of members.
2. A "service project" is defined by Kiwanis International as "an activity, consistent with the Objects, objectives, and policies of Kiwanis International, which is devised or planned by a Kiwanis club or a club committee and performed by members of the club for the benefit of others."
3. The first President of Kiwanis International elected from outside the United States was the third, Henry J. Elliott of Montreal, Quebec, who served in 1919-20. Seven other International Presidents have been Canadian. The first International President elected from outside the two founding nations of the US and Canada was Ian Perdriau AM, a member of the Kiwanis Club of Melbourne, Australia, who served in 1994-95.
4. Only chartered Kiwanis clubs are members of Kiwanis International. Each Kiwanian is a member of his or her club; no individual is a member of Kiwanis International.
5. Kiwanis membership surpassed 10,000 in 1919 and reached 100,000 in 1928. Membership fell below the 100,000 mark during the economic depression years of 1931-1939, but again surpassed 100,000 in 1940. In 1952, membership passed the 200,000 mark and reached 300,000 in 1979.
6. Kiwanis International's first Worldwide Service Project was initiated in 1993 and formally launched in 1994. The project is designed to eliminate iodine deficiency disorders (IDD) as a world health problem. Iodine is an essential micronutrient in the human diet. About 1.5 billion people live in iodine-deficient areas of the world, and half of them are children.

Annie Appleseed Project



Our program on December 18th was presented by Ann Fonfa, President of The Annie Appleseed Project.

At the age of 44, Ann was diagnosed with breast cancer. She underwent several surgeries, but decided to forego chemotherapy and radiation in favor of Complementary and Alternative (CAM) therapies, which she researched exhaustively. What ensued was an 8-year cat-and-mouse game with recurring chest wall tumors, all of which were treated with

CAM therapies. On September 12, 2001, more than eight years after her diagnosis and one day after the infamous 9-11 attacks, Ann received word from her doctor: she was cancer free.

With her fighting spirit unscathed, Ann put the wealth of knowledge gained on her journey to good use, answering the questions of others who learned of her story and sought a similar approach to dealing with their own cancer diagnoses. The Annie Appleseed Project was born of this effort, and continues to this day. Billed as having been created by a woman with breast cancer and an attitude, Ann's highly regarded website, www.annieappleseedproject.org, is an extensive resource for those seeking to make the best decisions for themselves with the most complete, up-to-date, evidence-based information available on both CAM and conventional approaches to cancer.

To summarize, AAP provides information that helps everyone/anyone REDUCE their risk for cancer (and heart disease, diabetes, and more modern ailments). Their information helps people in active conventional cancer treatment, REDUCE toxicities And they provide information for anyone interested in alternative or natural therapies.

Protect Against Pet Scams

Considering buying a pet this holiday season? Make sure you do your homework before buying.

Unfortunately, there are scammers out there who will lure their victims in with the promise of a new furry friend only to defraud them of hundreds or even thousands of dollars.

In a typical pet sale scam, a consumer will see an advertisement for an animal, most commonly a dog, accompanied by heartwarming cute pictures. The seller will usually claim to be far away but will offer to ship the animal to the new owner's location. Unfortunately for the buyer, the scammer doesn't truly have any pets for sale and is just sending pictures of animals found on the Internet.

Once the buyer sends the money, the scammer will come up with extra fees like crate rentals, pet insurance, vet bills, and unexpected shipping costs that must be paid before the pet can be delivered to its new home. As long as the victim is willing to pay, the scammer will continue adding on new fees. The scammer typically uses untraceable wire transfers so once the buyer catches on, their money is long gone.

Look for the following red flags to avoid becoming a victim of a pet scam:

- **Wiring Money:** Never wire money to anyone you have met online. Also exercise caution when using peer to peer payment methods like Venmo, Google Pay, Apple Pay, Facebook Payments or Zelle.
- **Suspicious Photos:** Look out for pet images that look like stock photos. Consider doing an online image search of the photo to see if it's posted somewhere else.
- **Bogus Stories/Excuses:** Scammers will often come up with complicated reasons why they need immediate wire transfers or why they can't deliver a pet directly to you.

Additionally, the Florida Pet Law is a consumer guarantee that provides standardized health requirements for dogs and cats being sold or transported. Consumers should ask for a Health Certificate at the time of purchase of any dog or cat. A responsible breeder, shelter, or rescue organization will provide registration and veterinary health records.

According to the Pet Law, the animal should be examined by a licensed and accredited veterinarian no more than 30 days prior to the sale of the pet. The Pet Law has specific requirements, like certain vaccines, deworming, and a fecal check to look for intestinal parasites, that veterinarians must comply with prior to issuing the Health Certificate. Under certain conditions, it provides buyers with recourses if it is determined that the pet was unfit for sale at the time of purchase.

While the vast majority of pet breeders are legitimate, it can sometimes be difficult to spot a fraud. If you suspect that you have become a victim, report it immediately. 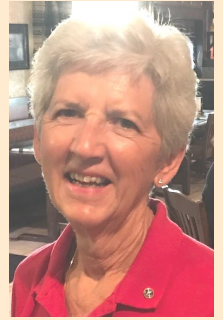

December 5:

- 1776 The first scholastic fraternity in America, Phi Beta Kappa, was organized at the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Va.

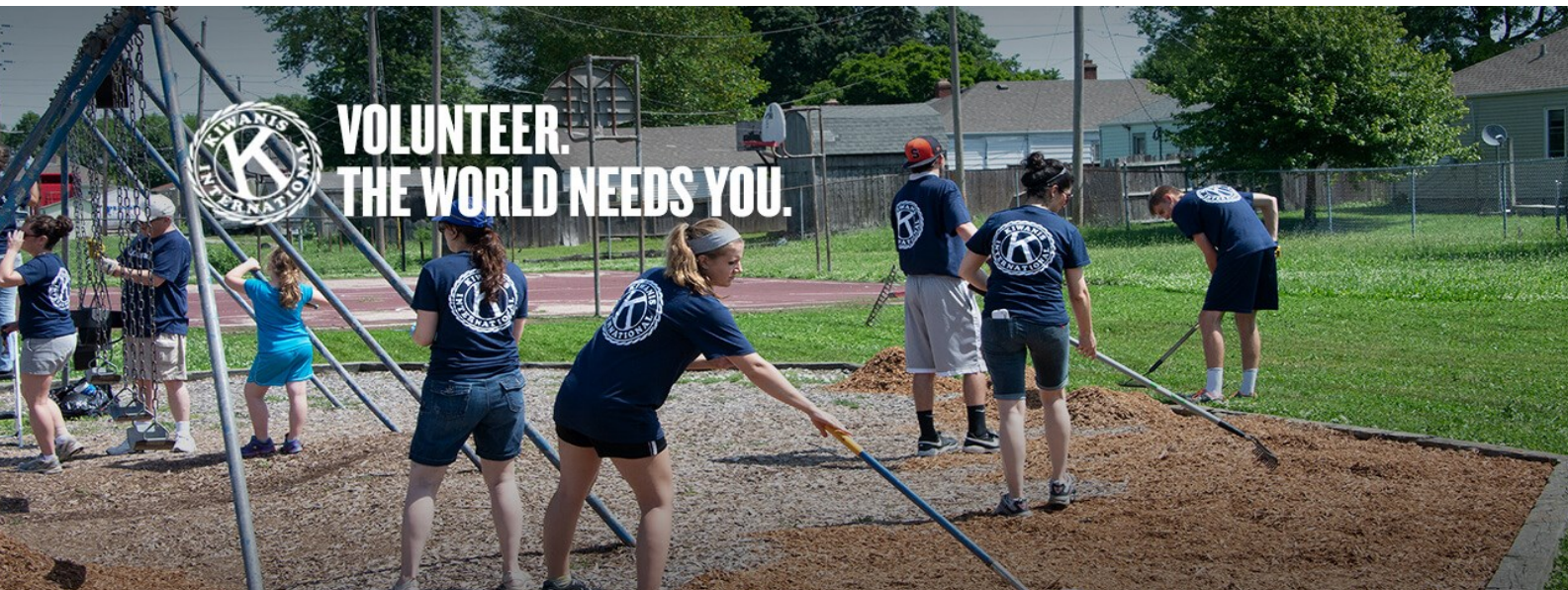

Let teens be your teachers

My work with Kiwanis allows me the good fortune to travel all over the world. Meeting new people and taking in new experiences are very enjoyable to me. Early on in my Kiwanis presidency, I had the opportunity to get involved with a special group in Kansas in the middle of the U.S.

I joined a weekend Key Leader event at Rock Springs Ranch in Junction City. The Kansas District takes great pride in this ranch. The district helped to raise US\$250,000 over five years to remodel the Heritage Hall center on the campus. It now has modern facilities and technology for campers, along with the natural beauty of the wooded camp's lake and many outdoor activities.

Key Leader offers activities to teach young people how to be community-minded, listen well, take action and be persuasive in the most positive ways. I was impressed by the level of respect shown not only to me, but to the teenagers' advisors and chaperones. And the respect was mutual.

It is always energizing to spend time with enthusiastic, bright young people. Watching these teens interact and learn in such a short period of time motivates me to encourage my Kiwanis colleagues to take a greater role in mentoring members of Key Club and CKI.
