At our **June 16th meeting**, even though we were without our infamous program director, we heard from Susan Greenspan from the Gift of Life Bone Marrow Foundation. **Alberta Gaum** made the introduction in Ezra's absence. Their mission is to facilitate bone marrow, blood stem cell and umbilical cord blood transplants for children and adults suffering from life-threatening illnesses. They are the 11th largest bone marrow registry in the world with over 163,000 names. What's really neat is how the procedures are done. The test is nothing more than swabbing the inside of your mouth. The transfer is usually done by using blood transfusions rather than actually pulling marrow out of the hip bone. That was the message from Michael Coleman, the Veteran's Affairs Liaison and Vietnam / Coldwar vet representing **Forgotten Soldiers Outreach, Inc.** Michael spoke to our club at the **June 23rd meeting**. This is a not-for-profit corporation that sends "We Care" packages to our men and women serving our country overseas. Since October, 2003, they have sent out over 40,000 boxes that includes all sorts of toiletries, snacks, energy bars, foiled packages of food, books, cd's, sun block and more. They usually also include Letters of Encouragement written by schoolchildren. They currently have a volunteer base of 500 people that help raise money and send out the packages on a monthly basis. ## Fire Rescue Focuses on Education

David James, Fire Rescue Chief of Delray Beach addressed our club on June 30th. His department's focus is on community education, knowing what signs and symptoms to look for in an emergency medical situation. His goal is to reduce the number of medical emergencies. They had approximately 12,000 calls last year. Chief James has implemented Health & Wellness programs held at all the fire stations along with open houses. Included are eye exams, hearing tests, mammograms and aids testing. Chief James himself had a heart attack a few years ago. He refused to heed the warning signs. What turned out to be a life threatening event could have been minimized had he recognized what was going on. The message is: Pay attention and get help sooner than later.



## Don't Waste that Water!

Former Kiwanian Dick Hasko gave this message at our July 7th meeting. Having worked for the City of Delray Beach for the last 18+ years, Dick is the Director of Environmental Services. Among his duties, Dick oversees the Reclaimed Water System which currently averages 2.1 million gallons per day. His department's focus now is dealing with the barrier island. At present, there's no alternative to irrigate except by using the drinking water. His goals going forward include converting customers today with reclaimed water and removing 1 million gallons per day from the demand of drinking water.
