Horses Healing Hearts

Our program on June 20th was presented by Lizabeth Olszewski, the Founder & Executive Director of Horses Healing Hearts (HHH). HHH helps children who have been affected by a family member with addiction to heal emotionally, build self-esteem, and learn life-coping skills by working with horses. The only one of it's kind in the nation, their program is unique and made strong by the commitment of their volunteers, host barns and magnificence of the horses that help these vulnerable kids open their hearts to trust again. Some of our children have lost a parent recently to suicide, overdose and murder. They are crying out for help and guidance.

The majority of the public does not understand how devastating and deep-rooted addiction is and/or the impact it has on the entire family — most notably the children. Additionally, the general public does not understand how incredibly healing horses can be for all types of trauma. Their charity brings together the children who have been affected by addiction and the horses who offer their acceptance, love, and incredible ability to sense when someone is not "in touch" with their feelings. This is your opportunity. To shape the future of our club. To do more of what you love. More fellowship. More service. More for your community. More Kiwanis.



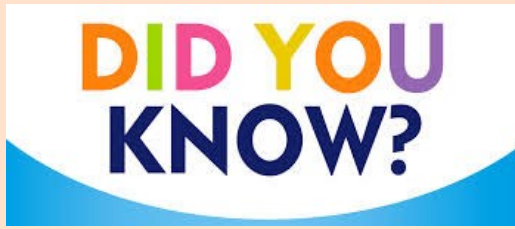

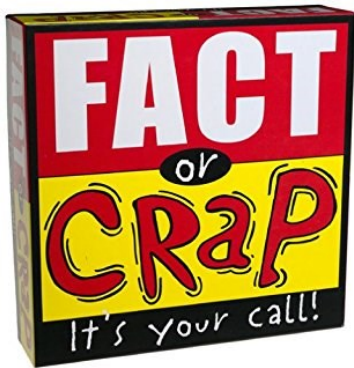

Eliminate Trans Fat

As well as raising your LDL, or "bad" cholesterol level, which can increase your risk for heart attack and stroke, trans fat also

lowers your levels of HDL or "good cholesterol, which can put you at increased cardiovascular risk. Trans fats are found in foods such as:

- Commercially-baked goods (cookies, crackers, cakes, muffins, pie crusts, pizza dough, breads like hamburger buns)
- Packaged snack foods (crackers, microwave popcorn, chips, candy)
- Solid fats (stick margarine, vegetable shortening)
- Fried foods (French fries, fried chicken, chicken nuggets, breaded fish, hard taco shells)
- Pre-mixed products (cake mix, pancake, chocolate milk)
- Anything with "partially hydrogenated" oil listed in the ingredients, even if it claims to be "trans fat-free."

June 7:

- 1654 Louis XIV was crowned king of France in Rheims.
- 1892 Homer Plessy was arrested when he refused to leave a whites-only train car in New Orleans. (The case led to the U.S. Supreme Court's landmark "separate but equal" decision in Plessy v. Ferguson in 1896.)

- 2000 A federal judge ordered the breakup of Microsoft Corp.
- 2003 In a national first, New Hampshire Episcopalians elected an openly gay man, the Rev. V. Gene Robinson, to be bishop.
- 2009 Roger Federer of Switzerland became the sixth man in tennis history to win a career Grand Slam and tied Pete Sampras' record of 14 major singles titles when he won the French Open.

Answers.....

Executive Perspective

PAINFUL DISCUSSIONS

This past year, Kiwanis hosted a youth-protection symposium for employees of several youth-serving organizations. Experts spoke on topics such as sexual exploitation, youth trafficking, child abductions, the Darknet and other threats to youth and children.

These discussions were painful. Adult predators strategically and patiently prey on unsuspecting children. They look for youth-serving organizations where they might fit in and gain the trust of those around them. Scouting, YMCAs and camps are all susceptible, and so are we.

We also learned that adult predators are not the only threat. Youth-on-youth exploitation ranges from cyberbullying to sexting and extortion. We must be equally aware of identifying and preventing this behavior as well.

For Kiwanis, the bar for youth protection is constantly being raised. We first introduced guidelines for working with youth in 2007. With time, they've evolved, anchoring to best practices for areas like transporting youth, overnight stays, exposure to alcohol or tobacco products, use of technology and privacy protection. Kiwanis has added mandatory criminal background checks for adult members who work with youth. We've identified and equipped volunteer youth protection managers (each district should have at least one) to help clubs properly protect the youth we support and serve.

Every Kiwanis advisor to a Key Club, Builders Club, K-Kids Club, any adult attending an overnight Key Club or Key Leader event or any Kiwanian who works with minors at club activities must undergo a background check at least every two years. Every club should present a youth-protection program once a year during Youth Protection Week (September 9-15, 2018).

A wide range of resources is available at kiwanis.org/protection. In addition, a youth-protection telephone and email hotline is available for confidential reporting.

We need to set a high standard for youth protection. We want school administrators, parents and community leaders to know we really care about the children and youth in our communities and we're taking extra steps to ensure they're protected. At the same time, we're protecting our own Kiwanis clubs and members. Please help this effort.

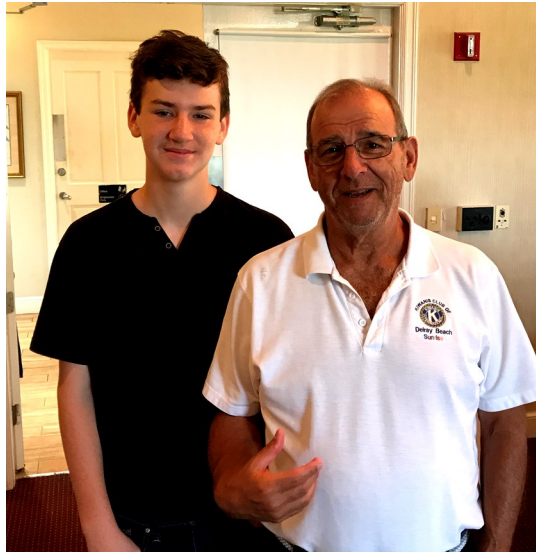
