## Mindful Eating Part- 4

Tracking the link between food and feeling
Eat in your usual way. Select the foods, amounts, and the times for eating that you normally do, only now add mindfulness to what you are doing.
Keep a record of all that you eat, including nibbles and snacks between meals. Don't kid yourself-you won't remember it all unless you write it all down or track it in an app!
Pay attention to your feelings-physical and emotionalfive minutes after you have eaten; one hour after you have eaten; two or three hours after you have eaten.
Notice if there has been a shift or change as the result of eating. Do you feel better or worse than before you ate? Do you feel energized or tired? Alert or sluggish?
Keeping a record on your phone or in a notebook can heighten your awareness of how the meals and snacks you eat affect your mood and well-being.

Practicing mindful eating forces you to slow down, focus on the present moment, and notice what you're really feeling. And when you repeatedly ask yourself, "How well do I feel after a meal or snack?" you'll begin the process of gaining awareness of your own specific nutritional needs. You'll measure meals and snacks in terms of how they affect your well-being. Your purpose for eating will shift from the intention of feeling full of food, to the intention of feeling full of energy and vitality. You'll become a "nutritional glutton" who wants to feel full of energy and you'll select food and combinations to achieve that goal.

## June 3:



1935, the French liner Normandie set a record on its maiden voyage, arriving in New York after crossing the Atlantic in just four days
1943, Los Angeles saw the beginning of its "Zoot Suit Riots" as white servicemen clashed with young Latinos wearing distinctive-looking zoot suits; the violence finally ended when military officials declared the city off limits to enlisted personnel
1948, the 200-inch reflecting Hale Telescope at the Palomar Mountain
Observatory in California was dedicated
1965, astronaut Edward H. White became the first American to "walk" in space during the flight of Gemini 4.
1989, Chinese army troops began their sweep of Beijing to crush student-led pro -democracy demonstrations.
2010, BP sliced off a pipe with giant shears to make way for a cap in the latest bid to curtail the worst oil spill in U.S. history.

## June 10:

1692, the first execution resulting from the Salem witch trials in Massachusetts took place as Bridget Bishop was hanged.
1963, President John F. Kennedy signed into law the Equal Pay Act of 1963, aimed at eliminating wage disparities based on gender.
1967, six days of war in the Mideast involving Israel, Syria, Egypt, Jordan and Iraq ended as Israel and Syria accepted a United Nations-mediated cease-fire. 1971, President Richard M. Nixon lifted a two-decades-old trade embargo on China.
1978, Affirmed, ridden by Steve Cauthen, won the 110th Belmont Stakes to
claim horse racing's 11th Triple Crown. (Alydar was second while Darby Creek Road came in third in a five-horse field.)
1991, 11-year-old Jaycee Dugard of South Lake Tahoe, California, was abducted by Phillip and Nancy Garrido; Jaycee was held by the couple for 18 years before she was found by authorities.

1579, Sir Francis Drake arrived in present-day northern California, naming it New Albion and claiming English sovereignty.
1775, the Revolutionary War Battle of Bunker Hill resulted in a costly victory for
the British, who suffered heavy losses
1953, U.S. Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas stayed the execution of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, originally set for the next day, the couple's 14th wedding anniversary. (They were put to death June 19.)
1967, China successfully tested its first thermonuclear (hydrogen) bomb. 1972, President Richard Nixon's eventual downfall began with the arrest of five burglars inside the Democratic headquarters in Washington, D.C.'s Watergate complex.
1994, after leading police on a slow-speed chase on Southern California freeways, O.J. Simpson was arrested and charged with murder in the slayings of his ex-wife, Nicole, and her friend, Ronald Goldman. (Simpson was later acquitted in a criminal trial but held liable in a civil trial.)

## June 24:

1497, the first recorded sighting of North America by a European took place as explorer John Cabot spotted land, probably in present-day Canada.
1947, what's regarded as the first modern UFO sighting took place as private pilot Kenneth Arnold, an Idaho businessman, reported seeing nine silvery objects flying in a "weaving formation" near Mount Rainier in Washington.
1948, Communist forces cut off all land and water routes between West Germany and West Berlin, prompting the western allies to organize the Berlin Airlift.
1957, the U.S. Supreme Court, in Roth v. United States, ruled 6-3 that obscene materials were not protected by the First Amendment.
1964, AT\&T inaugurated commercial "Picturephone" service between New York, Chicago and Washington, D.C. (the service, however, never caught on).
1975, 113 people were killed when Eastern Airlines Flight 66, a Boeing 727 carrying 124 people, crashed while attempting to land during a thunderstorm at New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport.
1983, the space shuttle Challenger [-] carrying America's first woman in space, Sally K. Ride [-] coasted to a safe landing at Edwards Air Force Base in California.
2010, Apple's iPhone 4 was released in five countries, selling a record 1.7 million units in three days despite criticism of its new antenna design.
2010, U.S. tennis player John Isner defeated Nicolas Mahut of France 70-68 at Wimbledon in the longest-ever professional match: 11 hours, 5 minutes over three days.
2015, Alabama Gov. Robert Bentley became the first southern governor to use his executive power to remove Confederate banners, as four flags with secessionist symbols were taken down from a large monument to rebel soldiers outside the state capitol in Montgomery.
