#### Abilities are Strengthened at EATSF



Our program on June 29th was presented by Molly Murphy, the Executive Director of Equine-Assisted Therapies of South Florida (EATSF).

EATSF is dedicated to providing therapeutic riding and equine activities to children and adults with special needs so that they may improve physically, mentally and emotionally. They envision a

place where abilities are strengthened, where activities lead to self-confidence, and each person can experience life without limits.

Beginning as Horses and the Handicapped of South Palm Beach County in 1982, the organization and its stewards have remained vigilant to the ever-changing special needs community and societal changes. Today, Equine-Assisted Therapies of South Florida hosts 4 different programs:

Therapeutic Riding (TR): EATSF's largest program. Horseback riding gently and rhythmically moves the rider's body in a motion like the human gait. Hippotherapy (HIPPO): A treatment strategy that

utilizes equine movement facilitated by a physical, occupational, or speech therapist.

Unmounted



Horsemanship (UH): An unmounted, learning-based program focused on teaching individuals of all ages and abilities about horsemanship and horse care.

Equine-Assisted Psychotherapy (EAP): An unmounted therapy program, open to individuals or group, starting at age 7. A licensed mental health professional works with the participant and horse to explore feelings and behaviors.

#### If You're Over 60, the FBI Has a Major New Warning for You

Getting older comes with certain risks we're well aware of, from mobility issues to health conditions like dementia. But there are other risks that are easier to overlook, including the myriad scams and cons designed to take advantage of people over a certain age. Now, a former Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) director has issued an urgent warning for older people that you'll want to heed.

In a video public service announcement (PSA) posted on the FBI website on May 10, William Webster, who previously served as director of both the FBI and the CIA, issued a warning about elder fraud. Webster instructed older adults to pay attention to warning signs of these financial schemes, which purposely target older adults in an attempt to con them out of money or property. "Each year, millions of older Americans fall victim to financial fraud schemes," Webster says in the PSA. "Criminals gain older people's trust and then prey on their desire for companionship, love, or financial security."

Webster warns older adults not to fall for "scammers' promises." These scams are often conducted over the phone or through email, according to the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) National Elder Fraud Hotline. Seniors are attractive targets, the FBI warns, particularly due to their tendency to be trusting and polite, as well as their likelihood to "have financial savings, own a home, and have good credit." "These are criminals who want to take one thing: your money," Webster says in the PSA. "You've worked hard. You've saved. Don't let criminals try to take that away from you."

Webster speaks from personal experience. In 2014, Webster himself was a victim of elder fraud. According to a press release from the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Keniel Thomas, a Jamaican national, contacted Webster and told him he was the head of the Mega Millions lottery game. He then proceeded to claim that Webster had won \$15.5 million and a 2014 Mercedes Benz. Before being awarded the prize, Thomas said Webster would need to pay \$50,000 "to cover the taxes."

Webster reported the incident to the FBI, and when he received a second call from Thomas the next day, the agency was able to record it. Thomas continued to make additional calls throughout the month, during which he said he had surveilled Webster's home. He also placed a separate call to Webster's wife, threatening violence if the Websters did not pay, the DOJ said. Thomas was identified in an investigation and arrested on Dec. 18, 2017 and sentenced to 71 months in prison in Feb. 2019.

Webster speaks of his experience during the PSA, stressing the severity of the problem. "I served in World War II and Korea. I was a federal judge. I was the director of the FBI, director of the CIA, and I was the target of an elder fraud scheme," Webster says, adding, "If it can happen to me, it can happen to you."

Officials urge older adults to report fraud when it happens. According to the National Elder Fraud Hotline, in 2018 alone, scams targeting older adults led to the loss of over \$184 million. Now, the FBI estimates that amount has surged to \$3 billion in annual losses.

In his PSA, Webster asks that anyone affected by elder fraud—whether it's you or a loved one—report it to the FBI by calling 1-800-CALL-FBI. You can also file a complaint with the FBI Internet Crime Complaint Center IC3 online at ic3.gov.

The National Elder Fraud Hotline also offers several resources on its website, assisting with the reporting process for free.




## Don't get Thirsty

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



<u>June 2:</u>

1924, Congress passed, and President Calvin Coolidge signed, a measure guaranteeing full American citizenship for all Native American's born within U.S. territorial limits.

Sunriser

1953, the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II took place in London's Westminster Abbey, 16 months after the death of her father, King George VI. 1966, U.S. space probe Surveyor 1 landed on the moon and began transmitting

detailed photographs of the lunar surface.

1979, Pope John Paul II arrived in his native Poland on the first visit by a pope to

a Communist country.

1981, the Japanese video arcade game "Donkey Kong" was released by Nintendo.
2017, Three former Penn State administrators were handed jail and house-arrest sentences ranging up to nearly two years for burying child sexual abuse allegations against Jerry Sandusky.

2021, Trainer Bob Baffert was suspended for two years by the Churchill Downs variety of Kentucky after an additional drug test of Kentucky Derby winner Medina Spirit confirmed the presence of a steroid. (Medina Spirit was later disqualified from his Derby victory; the colt collapsed and died in December 2021 following a training run at Santa Anita.)

1968, authorities announced the capture in London of James Earl Ray, the suspected assassin of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. 1978, a jury in Clark County, Nevada, ruled the so-called "Mormon will," purportedly written by the late billionaire Howard Hughes, was a forgery.

2008, the average price of regular gas crept up to \$4 a gallon.

2009, North Korea's highest court sentenced American journalists Laura Ling and Euna Lee to 12 years' hard labor for trespassing and "hostile acts." (The women were pardoned in early August 2009 after a trip to Pyongyang by former President Bill Clinton.)

2015, siding with the White House in a foreign-policy power struggle with
Congress, the Supreme Court ruled 6-3 that Americans born in the disputed city
of Jerusalem could not list Israel as their birthplace on passports.
2017, Former FBI Director James Comey, testifying before Congress, asserted
that President Donald Trump fired him to interfere with his investigation of

Russia's ties to the Trump campaign.

Washington head of the Continental Army. 1864, Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton signed an order establishing a military burial ground which became Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. 1904, more than 1,000 people died when fire erupted aboard the steamboat

General Slocum in New York's East River. 1934, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed an act making the National Guard

part of the U.S. Army in the event of war or national emergency.

1938, Johnny Vander Meer pitched his second consecutive no-hitter, leading the Cincinnati Reds to a 6-0 victory over the Brooklyn Dodgers in the first night game at Ebbets Field, four days after leaving the Boston Bees hitless by a score of 3-0.

1991, Mount Pinatubo in the northern Philippines exploded in one of the biggest

volcanic eruptions of the 20th century, killing about 800 people. 2002, an asteroid with a diameter of between 50 and 120 yards narrowly missed the Earth by 75,000 miles — less than a third of the distance to the moon. 2017, Two escaped inmates sought in the killings of two guards on a Georgia prison bus were captured after being held at gunpoint by a rural Tennessee homeowner whose vehicle they were trying to steal.

2020, the Supreme Court, in a 6-3 decision, ruled that a landmark civil rights law protects gay, lesbian and transgender people from discrimination in employment.

<u>June 22:</u>

1870, the United States Department of Justice was created.

1937, Joe Louis began his reign as world heavyweight boxing champion by knocking out Jim Braddock in the eighth round of their fight in Chicago. (A year later on this date, Louis knocked out Max Schmeling in the first round of their

rematch at Yankee Stadium.)
1944, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, more popularly known as the "GI Bill of Rights."

1945, the World War II battle for Okinawa ended with an Allied victory. 1977, John N. Mitchell became the first former U.S. Attorney General to go to

prison as he began serving a sentence for his role in the Watergate cover-up. (He was released 19 months later.)

1981, Mark David Chapman pleaded guilty to killing rock star John Lennon. 1992, the U.S. Supreme Court, in R.A.V. v. City of St. Paul, unanimously ruled that "hate crime" laws that banned cross burning and similar expressions of racial

bias violated free-speech rights. 2012, Ex-Penn State assistant coach Jerry Sandusky was convicted by a jury in Bellefonte, Pennsylvania, on 45 counts of sexually assaulting 10 boys over 15 years. (Sandusky is serving a 30- to 60-year state prison sentence.)

#### Difficulty- Very Hard. Be sure to use a pencil!



# **Executive Perspective**

Have you ever read all the Kiwanis International Bylaws? Be honest. Our bylaws consist of 29 pages with 15,689 words. They were originally drafted and

adopted in 1916 and have been amended and added to at every convention since.

So it shouldn't be a surprise that our governing document now has internal contradictions, confusing language and overly specific information. There's Article 8, Section 3, which "permits" members to wear Kiwanis-branded clothing. And there's the article on committees, which tells us — among many other things — that committee members serve for the year for which they are appointed. (Thanks, bylaws.) Oh, and that committees must have at least three members, unless they're "special" committees. Whatever those are, they apparently need only one member.

Even the process for amending the bylaws is hard to follow within the bylaws themselves. The bottom line: They often create more problems than they solve. They have become too complicated and even outdated. It's time to modernize.

During the Kiwanis International convention, we'll ask the House of Delegates to consider a new article. Yes, it will add another 152 words. But it will also give delegates the authority to revise the entire document periodically. With this article, a proposed set of modernized — and streamlined — bylaws can be considered next year.

It's always tempting to try solving problems with more rules. But our bylaws show what happens when we don't stop to look at the big picture. For Kiwanis clubs, which must abide by them, it's high time to make them easier to follow.
