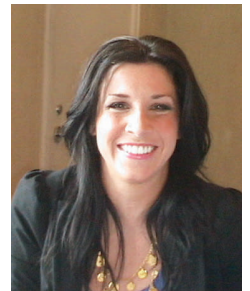

Dr. Diane Allerdyce Speaks to our Club

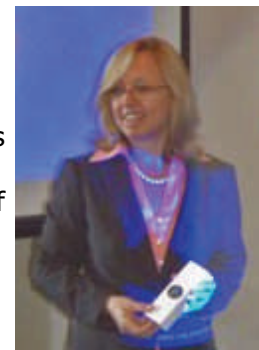
Representing Toussaint L'Ouverture High School for Arts & Social Justice (TLHS), Dr. Allerdyce gave us a great overview of the school and its history at our **June 2nd** meeting.

TLHS is an innovative charter high school originating in Delray Beach, serving 175 students in grades 9-12. Admission is open to all age-appropriate students in Palm Beach County. The students come from diverse socio-economic groups and represent the demographics of our community. They are a tuition-free, publicly funded institution.

Their mission is to provide motivated students of diverse ability levels a unique secondary school experience using arts as a vehicle for social justice and individual change. Their vision is to help youth acquire the skills they need to be successful in college and/or work and to have a voice in co-creating a world they can believe in.

Charter schools are public schools. However, they are exempt from some rules and regulations governing other public schools. But the State and the Local District holds charter schools accountable for academic achievements and financial management.

TLHS is the offspring of Center for Education, Training, and Holistic Approaches, Inc. (CETHA), a non-profit organization formed in March 2000 and incorporated in June 2000. The organization was founded by Joseph M. Bernadel, a retired US Army Officer, and former Lynn University professor/poetry therapist Diane Allerdyce, Ph.D., to provide multilingual, inter-generational, and culturally sensitive training and education that address all aspects of the whole person (intellectual, emotional, practical, physical).

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

"How To Wash The Cat"

1. Thoroughly clean the toilet.
2. Add the required amount of shampoo to the toilet water.
3. Obtain the cat and carry him to the bathroom.
4. In one smooth movement, put the cat in the toilet and close both lids (you may need to stand on the lid so that he cannot escape). CAUTION: Do not get any part of your body too close to the edge, as his paws will be reaching out for anything he can find.

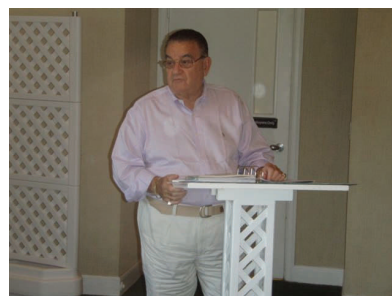
