the Housing Services of Palm Beach County Community Services Dept.

We heard about the Smart Landlord Campaign and the county's efforts to provide affordable housing. The S.M.A.R.T Landlord Campaign recruits landlords who can provide affordable units for extremely low income and homeless individuals



and families. They need efficiency, studio and multiple bedroom units. The program's ultimate goal is to end homelessness by getting homeless individuals and families into housing. The only thing that will end homelessness is housing.

Joining the community of homeless service providers is also beneficial to landlords. Landlords can save on marketing costs. There's a waiting list of people who need housing immediately. Every tenant has a case manager who provides assistance to the client and serves as the landlord's immediate point of contact. Landlords receive timely rent payments with help from the organization placing the tenant. Reduce vacancies by always having a tenant.

Caridad Serves The Children & Families of Our Community

Our program on May 31st was presented by Lisa Kronhaus, the Chief Development Officer for Caridad Center.

Caridad Center offers comprehensive medical, dental, and vision care and is the largest clinic of its kind in Florida. Their services are free for patients and their families who do not have insurance. Over 28% of Palm Beach County residents do not have medical insurance.



Volunteer doctors, dentists, nurses, dentists, dental hygienists, as well as many others contributed over \$5.1 million in patient care services. The goal of Caridad is to help the working poor population stay healthy so they can be productive individuals in our community. Last year their dispensary assisted over 1,500 patients with free prescription medication valued at over \$2 million.

Caridad Center is also a leader and advocate of Community Health Worker (CHW) programs throughout Palm Beach County. Their CHW programs provide their patients a trusted frontline public health worker that will come to their homes and serve as a liaison for them and their families. Caridad's Social Services Department dramatically increased the total services they provided for those in need this past year. Their programs for families facing financial insecurities include: providing food assistance, clothing, children & baby supplies, youth education and enrichment support, personal care items, and emergency living assistance. They seek to eliminate the cycle of poverty for the families they serve in South Florida. For more information go to www.caridad.org

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

A.I. ENHANCED SCAMS

You get a call. There's a panicked voice on the line. It's your grandson. He says he's in deep trouble — he wrecked the car and landed in jail. But you can help by sending money. You take a deep breath and think. You've heard about grandparent scams. But darn, it sounds just like him. How could it be a scam? Voice cloning, that's how.

Artificial intelligence (AI) is no longer a far-fetched idea out of a sci-fi movie. We're living with it, here and now. A scammer could use AI to clone the voice of your loved one. All he needs is a short audio clip of your family member's voice — which he could get from content posted online — and a voice-cloning program. When the scammer calls you, he'll sound just like your loved one.

So how can you tell if a family member is in trouble or if it's a scammer using a cloned voice? Don't trust the voice. Call the person who supposedly contacted you and verify the story. Use a phone number you know is theirs. If you can't reach your loved one, try to get in touch with them through another family member or their friends.

Scammers ask you to pay or send money in ways that make it hard to get your money back. If the caller says to wire money, send cryptocurrency, or buy gift cards and give them the card numbers and PINs, those could be signs of a scam.

If you spot a scam, report it to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov.

Show Your Heart Some Love

Heart disease is the number one killer of men and women in the U.S. While age, genetics, and family history are risk factors related to heart disease, some lifestyle factors are associated with better heart health. But first, discuss any medical concerns with your healthcare provider before beginning any diet or fitness regimen. The following information is not a substitute for medical advice:

- Manage your blood pressure: Make sure to check your blood pressure regularly. Hypertension is often asymptomatic.
- Maintain a healthy weight: Being overweight or obese may increase disease risk.
- Eat well and exercise: These two activities are associated with a lower incidence of heart disease.
- Drink less alcohol and don't smoke: These habits are seen more frequently in heart disease patients.
- Sleep well and reduce stress: Lower cortisol levels may reduce your risk for heart disease.

While not all risk factors are controllable, some are. The list above is not comprehensive. Give your heart some love, and talk to your doctor about the best ways to care for it.

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



May 4:

1776, Rhode Island declared its freedom from England, two months before the Declaration of Independence was adopted.

Sunriser

1886, at Haymarket Square in Chicago, a labor demonstration for an 8-hour work day turned into a deadly riot when a bomb exploded.

1904, the United States took over construction of the Panama Canal from the French.

1932, mobster Al Capone, convicted of income-tax evasion, entered the federal penitentiary in Atlanta. (Capone was later transferred to Alcatraz Island.) 1942, the Battle of the Coral Sea, the first naval clash fought entirely with carrier aircraft, began in the Pacific during World War II. (The outcome was considered a tactical victory for Japan, but ultimately a strategic one for the Allies.) 1945, during World War II, German forces in the Netherlands, Denmark and northwest Germany agreed to surrender.

1970, Ohio National Guardsmen opened fire during an anti-war protest at Kent State University, killing four students and wounding nine others.

1998, Unabomber Theodore Kaczynski (kah-ZIHN'-skee) was given four life sentences plus 30 years by a federal judge in Sacramento, California, under a plea agreement that spared him the death penalty. 2020, New York state reported more than 1,700 previously undisclosed

coronavirus deaths at nursing homes and adult care facilities.

1775, Ethan Allen and his Green Mountain Boys, along with Col. Benedict Arnold, captured the British-held fortress at Ticonderoga, New York. 1865, Confederate President Jefferson Davis was captured by Union forces in

Irwinville, Georgia.

1869, a golden spike was driven in Promontory, Utah, marking the completion of the first transcontinental railroad in the United States. 1924, J. Edgar Hoover was named acting director of the Bureau of Investigation

(later known as the Federal Bureau of Investigation, or FBI).

1933, the Nazis staged massive public book burnings in Germany.
1940, during World War II, German forces began invading the Netherlands,
Luxembourg, Belgium and France. The same day, British Prime Minister Neville
Chamberlain resigned, and Winston Churchill formed a new government. 1994, Nelson Mandela took the oath of office in Pretoria to become South Africa's first Black president.

2013, U.S government scientists said worldwide levels of carbon dioxide, the chief greenhouse gas blamed for global warming, had hit a milestone, reaching an amount never before encountered by humans.

2014, Michael Sam was picked by the St. Louis Rams in the seventh round of the NFL draft, becoming the first openly gay player drafted by a pro football team. (Sam retired after an unsuccessful stint with the Rams and the Dallas Cowboys.)

1536, Archbishop of Canterbury Thomas Cranmer declared the marriage of England's King Henry VIII to Anne Boleyn invalid after she failed to produce a male heir; Boleyn, already condemned for high treason, was executed two days

1946, President Harry S. Truman seized control of the nation's railroads, delaying but not preventing — a threatened strike by engineers and trainmen.

1954, a unanimous U.S. Supreme Court handed down its Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka decision which held that racially segregated public schools were inherently unequal, and therefore unconstitutional.

1996, President Bill Clinton signed a measure requiring neighborhood notification when sex offenders move in. ("Megan's Law," as it's known, was named for Megan Kanka, a 7-year-old New Jersey girl who was raped and murdered in

1994.)
2004, Massachusetts became the first state to allow same-sex marriages. 2020, New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo was tested for the coronavirus on live TV as he announced that all people in the state who were experiencing flu-like symptoms were eligible for tests.


