Delray's Housing Authority Provides Affordable Options



Our program on February 28th was presented by Dorothy Ellington, the President/CEO of The Delray Beach Housing Authority. The DBHA is an organization dedicated to improving the quality of life for low and moderate income families, and providing the opportunity for self-sufficiency by guaranteeing safe, quality housing.

The DBHA has been in operation since 1973 and has rental assistance programs; the Section 8 Choice Voucher Program and the Public Housing Program and a Family Self-

Sufficiency Program as well. Eligibility for affordable housing is based on the annual income and family size. It is limited to U. S. citizens and certain categories of non-citizens.

In an effort to preserve affordable housing, they recently acquired through a Public Private partnership, Lake Delray Apartments, a 404-unit property that is currently being modernized.

Dear Ma and Pa,
I am well. Hope you are. Tell Brother Walt and Brother Elmer the Marine Corps beats working for old man Minch by a mile. Tell them to join up quick before all of the places are filled.

I was restless at first because you get to stay in bed till nearly 6 a.m. But I am getting so I like to sleep late. Tell Walt and Elmer all you do before breakfast is smooth your cot, and shine some things. No hogs to slop, feed to itch, mash to mix, wood to split, fire to lay. Practically nothing.

Men got to shave but it is not so bad, there's warm water. Breakfast is strong on trimmings like fruit juice, cereal, eggs, bacon, etc., but kind of weak on chops, potatoes, ham, steak, fried eggplant, pie and other regular food, but tell Walt and Elmer you can always sit by the two city boys that live on coffee. Their food, plus yours, holds you until noon when you get fed again.

It's no wonder these city boys can't walk much.

We go on 'route marches,' which the platoon sergeant says are long walks to harden us. If he thinks so, it's not my place to tell him different. A 'route march' is about as far as to our mailbox at home. Then the city guys get sore feet and we all ride back in trucks.



The sergeant is like a school teacher. He nags a lot. The Captain is like the school board. Majors and colonels just ride around and frown. They don't bother you none.

This next will kill Walt and Elmer with laughing. I keep getting medals for shooting. I don't know why. The bulls-eye is near as big as a chipmunk head and don't move, and it ain't shooting at you like the Higgett boys at home. All you got to do is lie there all comfortable and hit it. You don't even load your own cartridges. They come in boxes.

Then we have what they call hand-to-hand combat training. You get to wrestle with them city boys. I have to be real careful though, they break real easy. It ain't like fighting with that ole bull at home. I'm about the best they got in this except for that Tug Jordan from over in Silver Lake. I only beat him once. He joined up the same time as me, but I'm only 5'6" and 130 pounds and he's 6'8" and near 300 pounds dry.

Be sure to tell Walt and Elmer to hurry and join before other fellers get onto this setup and come stampeding in.

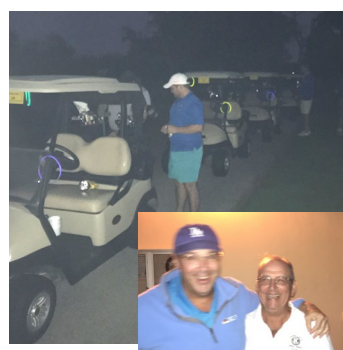

Cut down on Saturated Fat and Sugar

Saturated fat in our diet

We all need some fat in our diet, but it's important to pay attention to the amount and type of fat we're eating. There are two main types of fat: saturated and unsaturated. Too much saturated fat can increase the amount of cholesterol in the blood, which increases your risk of developing heart disease.

The average man should have no more than 30g saturated fat a day. The average woman should have no more than 20g saturated fat a day, and children should have less than adults.

Saturated fat is found in many foods, such as:

- hard cheese
- cakes
- biscuits
- sausages
- cream
- butter
- lard
- pies.

Try to cut down on your saturated fat intake, and choose foods that contain unsaturated fats instead, such as vegetable oils, oily fish and avocados.

For a healthier choice, use just a small amount of vegetable oil or reduced-fat spread instead of butter, lard or ghee. When you're having meat, choose lean cuts and cut off any visible fat.

Motor Vehicle Crash Deaths

How is the US doing?

Reducing motor vehicle crash deaths was one of the great public health achievements of the 20th century for the US. However, more than 32,000 people are killed and 2 million are injured each year from motor vehicle crashes. In 2013, the US crash death rate was more than twice the average of other high-income countries. In the US, front seat belt use was lower than in most other comparison countries. One in 3 crash deaths in the US involved drunk driving, and almost 1 in 3 involved speeding. Lower death rates in other high-income countries and a high percentage of risk factors in the US suggest that we can make more progress in reducing crash deaths.

Drivers and passengers can:

Use a seat belt in every seat, on every trip, no matter how short.

Make sure children are always properly buckled in the back seat in a car seat, booster seat, or seat belt, whichever is appropriate for their age, height, and weight.

Choose not to drive while impaired by alcohol or drugs, and help others do the same.

Obey speed limits.

Drive without distractions (such as using a cell phone or texting).

DID YOU KNOW?

Couple from opposite sides of the globe says Kiwanis brought them together.

Their eyes met across a busy room buzzing with nervous energy. The governors-elect had just arrived at the Kiwanis International office in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA, for several days of training and immersion into the Kiwanis culture. Serge Viau was the governor-elect for the Eastern Canada and Caribbean District, and Angela Liu was there to provide translation support for the governor-elect from Taiwan. When their eyes met that night in 2013, a connection happened.

A few years later, the pair was walking down the aisle hand in hand. "If it wasn't for Kiwanis, we would not have met," Liu said. Their interest in each other only grew after the

Conference ended and Liu returned to Taichung City in Taiwan and Viau went home to Sault Ste. Marie in Ontario, Canada.

They stayed in contact through WhatsApp, a free messaging and calling service. Viau talked about the fun and fellowship he's experienced at club meetings, and the passion he has about helping others. "I always believed that the more you give of yourself, the more you get back," he said. "Kiwanis provides me with an opportunity to serve others, primarily our most vulnerable people, our children."

After two years of long-distance dating, they decided to get married. "We both love Kiwanis, enjoy being Kiwanians, and Kiwanis brought us the best reward, each other," Viau said. "We decided to get married on January 21, 2017, on Kiwanis' anniversary."

Just a little more than a year after saying "I do," the two still live in their own countries, but they're awaiting permanent residence from the Canadian government. They've visited each other many times during the past year. "Thanks to the greatest invention — the internet — we maintain our relationship carefully and intentionally," Liu said.

February 8:

- 1693 A charter was granted for the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Va.
- 1837 The Senate selected Richard Mentor Johnson of Kentucky as vice president after no candidate received a majority of electoral votes.

Governor's Message

Instead of zone conferences this year which require more travel for our members, I wanted to visit you in your divisions and provide the best information possible to help you chart a path to a better future for your club. The Governor Visit-Club Summits are not your typical workshop with information you've heard before. These summits will give you an opportunity to imagine your club in a new way and provide tools to help you plan for your club's success. Please remember to show your gratitude for Kiwanis and take your responsibility to Kiwanis seriously and invest in its future by attending one of these summits. Hope to see you soon. Todd
