## Helping A Family Return Home

When the Delray Beach Kiwanis Club learned that a mother and her five children had to flee their home after a fire in a nearby apartment, members sprang into action. Little did the Kiwanians know at the time that they would also be helping a second Delray Beach family pay forward a good deed done by club members decades earlier.

The club, which supports organizations throughout the community - with an emphasis on those benefiting children and families discovered that a couple of the families displace by the blaze had children attending Orchard View Elementary School, which the club had "adopted" years before. Working with the school's principal - fellow Kiwanian Danielle Garcia - members withdrew \$300 from the club treasury to buy clothing and other items for the family which was temporarily housed in a hotel. It was when the Jenkins family was able to move back into its apartment that the club reached out to the community through Facebook and email asking for donations of clothing, furniture and furnishings.

"The response was amazing," said **Peggy Kelleher**, the club member who helped coordinate the effort. "I received



at least 50 calls and emails from people wanting to know how they could help." Club member **Ezra Krieg** also received phone calls and emails from people wanting to help.

While all of the contributions were well received and greatly appreciated, it was the donation from Laurie Zuniga and her husband Frank that really stood out. The Zuniga's were in the process of clearing out their daughter Jackie's nearby apartment following her death from COVID- related pneumonia a few weeks earlier when Laurie saw the Kiwanis' posting on Facebook.

## History of Racial Terror in PB County



Our program on February 9th was presented by Charlene Farrington, representing the PBC Remembrance Coalition.

Palm Beach County accounts for at least two of the

more than 4400 lynchings of Black citizens in the United States that were part of a regime of racial terror flourishing long after Reconstruction. One of the killings took place in Delray

Beach. The legacy of this terror continues today in a resurgent white supremacist movement aimed at fomenting a "race war" that would eliminate our Black population. To address this means to confront the sins of our past and use their very gravity to combat lingering hostility.

Palm Beach County plans public events, seeking to form a consensus about confronting past and current injustices.

It was while she was on the phone with Kelleher that Zuniga discovered the same Kiwanis group had helped the struggling family in the early 1990 by paying their electric bill for several months while Jackie was recovering from a kidney transplant that had drained the family's savings. "I just couldn't believe it," Zuniga said. "I thought what a blessing and the timing couldn't have been more perfect. Now another family could have Jackie's furniture. I was thrilled because we could pay it forward through the same organization that helped us out years ago.

Early in February a small army of volunteers led by Kiwanians loaded many of the items from the apartment – including two beds, a dining room table with chairs and several other items – onto a trailer and deliver them to Elethia Jenkins and her family. "Jackie would have been thrilled to know someone else was being helped," Laurie Zuniga said.

Other donations from the community included everything from a television set and a rug to a full living room set and small appliances. The club also received gift cards for the family. "We are so grateful to everyone who helped with donation and who made it possible for the Jenkins family to be able to move back home," Kelleher said.

In one of the more vivid acknowledgements, the county will transport a six-foot steel monument bearing the lynched men's names from the National Memorial for Peace and Justice in Montgomery, Ala.

The memorial, which opened in 2018, houses a powerful display with more than 800 rust-colored steel monuments hanging from above, one for each county in

the United States where a lynching took place. The names of each lynched person in each county, totaling more than 4,400, is engraved on the markers, which appear to float above as visitors walk underneath. For more information go to https:// pbcremembrance.org/

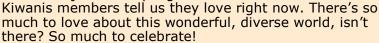

## **Avoid Tax Season** Phone Scams

Filing season is well under way, and scammers are trying to make life miserable for everyone else. While this isn't a shocking turn for anyone who has been paying attention to the evolution of identity theft tax refund fraud, it's a problem that everyone needs to be aware of nonetheless.

The Internal Revenue Service is warning that identity thieves are posing as IRS agents in a wide range of scam phone calls. According to the agency, criminals are "posing as IRS agents in hopes of stealing taxpayer money or personal information."

## How will I know if a phone call from "the IRS" is actually a scam?

Identity thieves generally try to create a sense of urgency when they contact you. Their strategy is to put you in a state of fear or anxiety through threats or by offering deals that sound too good to be true. If these criminals set the hook, you might not realize it's a scam until it's too late. That's why you must become familiar with the common types of bait in the phishing tackle hox.

The IRS lists four things their agents will <u>never</u> do when contacting taxpayers:

- 1. Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card, or wire transfer. Generally, the IRS will first mail a bill to any taxpayer who owes taxes.
- 2. Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law enforcement groups to have the taxpayer arrested for not paying.
- 3. Demand that taxes be paid without giving taxpayers the opportunity to question or appeal the amount owed.
  - 4. Call unexpectedly about a tax refund.

While specifically cited concerning phishing calls, these tactics are also common in phishing emails and social media scams.

## What should I do if I receive a tax-related scam phone call?

If you or a client receives one of these phone calls, the IRS says step one is to write down the number and hang up. Remember, some fraudsters use what you say during one of these calls to start building a profile that they refine for future scams—in other words, do not try to emulate that TED Talk. (Though watching it is admittedly a fun way to spend ten minutes!)

Next, the agency says to report the phone call to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA) and the IRS.

That involves contacting TIGTA through their "Report a Crime or IRS Employee Misconduct" page or calling 800.366.4484, then sending an email containing the suspicious phone number—subject: "IRS Phone Scam" to Phishing@IRS.gov.



## Healing Young Children and Families

Our program on February 16th was presented by Julie Swindler, the CEO of Families First of PBC. Her discussion focused on the Child First Program.

When young children grow up in environments where there is violence, neglect, mental illness, or substance abuse, the stress can be toxic to their developing brains. But, we can intervene to prevent this damage. Scientific research demonstrates that we can make a difference if we:

Work to connect families to needed community-based services to decrease the stress, and Build strong, loving, parent-child relationships that protect and heal the brain from trauma and stress. Their goal is a young brain focused on learning rather than a brain focused on survival.

The Child First model's Theory of Change is based on scientific research which tells us that early trauma and adversity lead to biologic changes in the young child that damage the developing brain and metabolic systems, leading to long-term problems in mental health, learning, and physical health. Child First works

from two directions: prevent or ameliorate this damage, and at the same time, enhance the child's development. For more information go to www.childfirst.org

## The Promise Fund Saves Lives

Our program on February23rd was presented by Karen Patti, the COO of the Promise Fund of Florida. The mission of the Promise Fund of Florida is to help women overcome financial and cultural barriers to improve health equity and reduce deaths from late-stage breast and cervical cancer throughout South Florida.

A core part of their work starts within the community. Their Navigators conduct regular, ongoing community outreach and education at health fairs, nonprofit and community events, and with faith-based groups to raise awareness of the importance of early detection screenings, and facilitates access to quality healthcare for those requiring diagnostics and treatment.

The Promise Fund partners with local and national established organizations to streamline patient care services and determine affordable pricing for low income residents who are uninsured or underinsured so they can get access to essential healthcare needs.

"Working for the Promise Fund of Florida gives me a great sense of gratitude and inspiration as I can see that the work we are doing is making a positive impact on our community" says Patti. "Because of the Promise Fund of Florida, all women have access to early detection and screening for breast and cervical cancer in our county, which is very powerful. Each

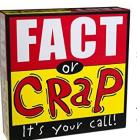

## Don't Skip Breakfast

Not hungry first thing in the morning? Pushed for time? Trying to lose weight? There are

many calorie-counted treats that will tempt you to rediscover the pleasure of breakfast. From energyboosting "apple pie" porridge and protein-packed scrambled eggs, to a nutrient-rich green smoothie and granola bars, there's something for everyone.

"Creating the habit of eating in the morning is something you can build towards," says dietitian Alison Hornby. "Start off with a light bite, such as a piece of fruit or a low-fat yoghurt. "After a while, your morning appetite will naturally increase and you'll probably find you eat less throughout the day, including snacks."

Research suggests people who eat breakfast are slimmer because they tend to eat less during the day, especially high-calorie snacks. If you're short on time in the morning, think about ways of gaining time by keeping your breakfast choice simple, either by waking up 10 minutes earlier or getting other chores out of the way ahead of time.

1945, during World War II, U.S. Marines on Iwo Jima captured Mount Suribachi, where they raised two American flags (the second flag-raising was captured in the iconic Associated Press photograph.)

1954, the first mass inoculation of schoolchildren against polio using the Salk vaccine began in Pittsburgh as some 5,000 students were vaccinated. 2013, some 30 NASCAR fans were injured when rookie Kyle Larson's car was propelled by a crash into the fence at Daytona International Speedway, and large chunks of debris flew into the grandstands.
