Tennis is More Than Just A Game

Our program on February 8th was presented by Stefan Konowalsky, the Director of Tennis for the Delray Beach Youth Tennis Foundation (DBYTF).

One-fifth of all children in Palm Beach County live in poverty. Barely able to afford basic necessities, there is no room in these families' budgets for out-of-school enrichment activities or academic support. By offering free tennis and education programming, along with mentoring, to children of under-resourced families, DBYTF not only teaches the game of tennis but also provides opportunities for exercise, competition, and team building to become life-long character traits.

Every day their children learn life skills in their programs: perseverance, self-control, cooperation, and respect. their volunteer coaches and teachers witness profound transformations throughout the year as students bring these lessons to their classrooms and their personal lives. Since their beginning in 2015, they have reached over 1,000 youth in Delray Beach. The DBYTF operates programs at 3 sites, adding more each year in communities that need them most. 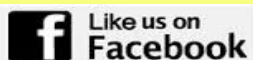


Everyone Should Have A Decent Place To Live

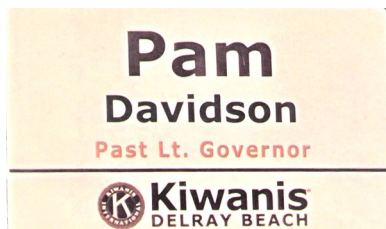

Lots To Do & Places to Go in Delray Beach

Our speaker on February 22nd was Sam Metott, the Director for Parks & Recreation of Delray Beach.

Parks and Recreation offers a variety of programs, activities and special events for everyone in the community. The department maintains over 40 parks and recreational facilities including two pools, a splash park, athletic fields, skate park, and one and a half miles of public beach that is guarded 365 days a year.

Metott discussed upcoming events which include the 2023 Delray Beach Senior Games, St. Patrick's Day Festival & Parade, and Free concerts at Old School Square. His department is also in discussions regarding the Kiwanis Storybook Trail, which we hope to add to Barwick Park later this year.

Also discussed was the \$20 million Parks General Obligation bond that will be on the next election ballot. The G.O. Bonds will pay for badly needed various improvements to city parks and recreational facilities, and are backed by the full faith and credit of the City's ad valorem tax revenues.

Did you know?

The District of Alabama-Florida was organized in the fall of 1918. Birmingham, Alabama, was the only club, having organized February 28, 1917. J. Mercer Barnett was the first governor and served until June 1919. Andrew J. Arrant was elected at the Mobile convention in 1919, and served as governor until April 11, 1921.

The Alabama-Florida District continued under that name until the Kiwanis International Board met in July of 1924. At that meeting, the Board designated the two states independent districts. The second club in the district was Mobile. Gadsden and Huntsville tied for third place.

The first club in Florida was Tampa, the third club formed in the old Alabama-Florida District. It was completed June 18, 1919. Pensacola was completed July 10, 1919; Jacksonville was completed October 23, 1919.

"I've had the opportunity for leadership training with companies like American Express, Hilton Hotels and Disney," said Kelly Pena, a Kiwanis Amplify graduate from the California-Nevada-Hawaii District. "And I will tell you that Kiwanis Amplify rates up there with these top companies' leadership programs."

More than 85% of those who responded to the post-program survey said they learned at least one new thing from every module. "This program has given us the opportunity to invest in our own club members in providing leadership knowledge and training," said Jean Long Manteufel, another graduate from the Wisconsin-Upper Michigan District. "And it is awesome."

Kiwanis Amplify is conducted online. Participants can complete their assignments at a time that's convenient for them. Eight leadership topics are covered in the course:

- The qualities of a good leader.
- Methods of communication.
- Planning engaging events.
- Promoting diversity, equity and inclusion throughout a team.
- Working with others.
- Sharing a message.
- Strategic planning.
- Self-care.

The participation fee is US\$200 for members of Kiwanis International. The fee is \$600 for non-members.

This IRS online tool simplifies estimating 2023 tax withholding

A few minutes spent reviewing income tax withholding early in the year helps set a taxpayer up for success all year long. The [Tax Withholding Estimator](#) on IRS.gov makes it easy to figure out how much to withhold.

This online tool helps employees withhold the correct amount of tax from their wages. It also helps self-employed people who have wage income estimate their quarterly tax payments.

The Tax Withholding Estimator does not ask for personally identifiable information, such as name, Social Security number, address and bank account numbers. The IRS doesn't save or record the information users enter in the Estimator.

Why use the Tax Withholding Estimator

Using this tool to estimate tax withholding can help taxpayers avoid unpleasant surprises. Having too little withheld can result in a tax bill or even a penalty at tax time. Having too much withheld may result in a projected refund, which could mean less money in the taxpayer's pocket during the year. The Tax Withholding Estimator can help taxpayers decide how much to withhold to get to a balance of zero or to a desired refund amount.

Taxpayers can use the results from the Tax Withholding Estimator to decide if they should: Complete a new [Form W-4, Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate](#) and submit it to their employer, or Make an additional [estimated tax](#) payment to the IRS.

Before using the tool, taxpayers may want to gather a few documents, including:

Pay stubs for all jobs. If the taxpayer married filing jointly, they would also need their spouses' pay stubs.

[Forms W-2](#) from employers to estimate their annual income.

Forms 1099 from banks, issuing agencies and other payers including [unemployment compensation](#), [dividends](#), distributions from a [pension, annuity or retirement plan](#).

Form 1099-K, 1099-MISC, W-2 or other income statement for workers in the [gig economy](#).

[Form 1099-INT](#) for [interest received](#).

Other income documents and records of [virtual currency](#) transactions.

People do not need these documents use the tool but having them will help taxpayers estimate 2023 income and answer other questions asked during the process. The Tax Withholding Estimator results will only be as accurate as the information the taxpayer enters.

The Tax Withholding Estimator isn't for taxpayers who

- Only have pension income – They can read more about [pension and annuity](#) withholding on IRS.gov.
- Have more complex tax situations – This includes taxpayers who owe certain taxes such as the alternative minimum tax and people with long-term capital gains or qualified dividends.

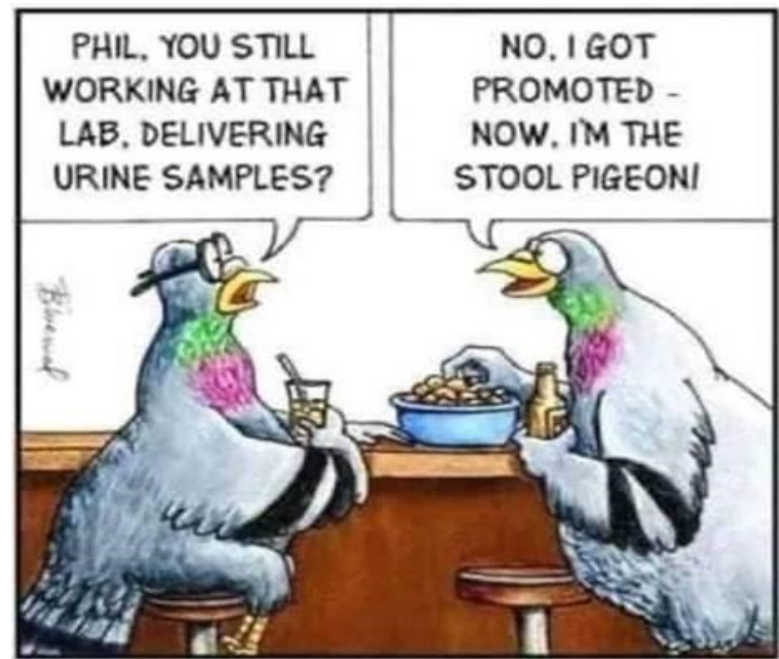

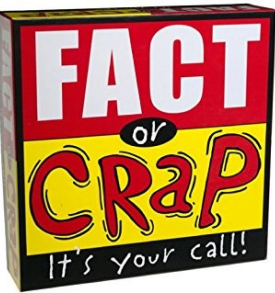

Simple ways to build a cancer-prevention diet - Part 4

GMOs, pesticides, and cancer risk

Genetically modified organisms (GMOs) are plants or animals whose DNA has been altered in ways that cannot occur in nature or in traditional crossbreeding, most commonly in order to be resistant to pesticides or produce an insecticide. While the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the biotech companies that engineer GMOs insist they are safe, many food safety advocates point out that these products have undergone only short-term testing to determine their effects on humans.

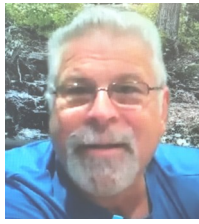
Some animal studies have indicated that consuming GMOs may cause certain types of cancer. Since most GMOs are engineered for herbicide tolerance, the use of toxic herbicides like Roundup has substantially increased since GMOs were introduced. Some studies have indicated that the use of pesticides even at low doses can increase the risk of certain cancers, such as leukemia, lymphoma, brain tumors, breast cancer, and prostate cancer. However, research into the link between GMOs, pesticides, and cancer remains inconclusive.

If you're worried about GMOs and pesticides, buy organic or local foods

In most countries, [organic crops](#) contain no GMOs and organic meat comes from animals raised on organic, GMO-free feed. Locally grown produce is less likely to have been treated with chemicals to prevent spoilage.

February 2:

1536, present-day Buenos Aires, Argentina, was founded by Pedro de Mendoza of Spain.

1653, New Amsterdam — now New York City — was incorporated.

1887, Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania, held its first Groundhog Day festival.

1914, Charles Chaplin made his movie debut as the comedy short "Making a Living" was released by Keystone Film Co.

1943, the remainder of Nazi forces from the Battle of Stalingrad surrendered in a major victory for the Soviets in World War II.

1980, NBC News reported the FBI had conducted a sting operation targeting members of Congress using phony Arab businessmen in what became known as "Abscam," a codename protested by Arab-Americans.

1990, in a dramatic concession to South Africa's Black majority, President F.W. de Klerk lifted a ban on the African National Congress and promised to free Nelson Mandela.

2017, using a backhoe to smash through a barricade of water-filled footlockers, police stormed Delaware's largest prison, ending a nearly 20-hour hostage standoff with inmates; one hostage, a guard, was killed.

2020, the Philippines reported that a 44-year-old Chinese man from Wuhan had died in a Manila hospital from the new coronavirus; it was the first death from the virus to be recorded outside of China.

2013, Former Navy SEAL and "American Sniper" author Chris Kyle was fatally shot along with a friend, Chad Littlefield, at a gun range west of Glen Rose, Texas; suspect Eddie Ray Routh was later convicted and sentenced to life in prison without parole.

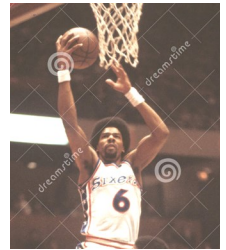

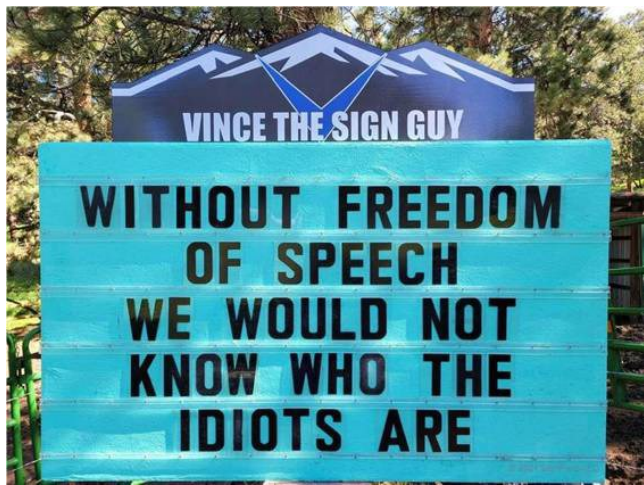
