## Horses Helping Heal Children's Hearts

Our program on April 6th was presented by Liz Olszewski of Horses Healing Hearts. A terrific program, HHH helps children whose lives have been affected by addiction heal emotionally and build life coping skills by working with horses. Horses are particularly useful in therapy with children of alcoholics and addicts because their simple presence and energy can break down walls that the child themselves may not be aware are present. In an era when immediate gratification and the easy way are the norm, horses require peo-
 ple to be engaged in physical, emotional and mental work - a valuable characteristic in all aspects of life.
Currently, HHH is operating the program on a sponsor barn basis, offering a free session weekly to the group. The HHH staff coordinates the weekly sessions, and the children are in groups of 3-4 to work with the horse. Sponsor barns are located near Lake Worth, Wellington, Delray and Loxahatchee. Focus is put on learning how the horse thinks, reacts and why. The children learn safety practices and the importance of work. Horses are 90\% work

and $10 \%$ riding. After riding, they untack, clean/ brush, and put away the horse they worked with that day. They also
 clean and put away any tack or supplies used for that day. Sessions last approximately two hours. During this time the participant can talk about anything they want to regarding how they are doing outside of the program (school, home, sports, etc.) or something they learned during the session that day. We also assist in goal setting. We teach that goals, both short and long term, should be specific and have a time frame by which they want to accomplish it. By this, we are showing the children there may be some circumstances in their life they feel are out of their control. However, they are in control of their thoughts and actions. ## PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

## From the Mayo Clinic - Aspirin is not a joke!

Dr. Virend Somers, a cardiologist from the Mayo Clinic who is lead author of the report in the July 29, 2008 issue of the Journal of the American College of Cardiology.

Most heart attacks occur in the day, generally between 6 A.M. and noon, Somers said. Having one during the night, when the heart should be most at rest, means that something unusual happened. Somers and his colleagues have been working for a decade to show that sleep apnea is to blame.

1. If you take an aspirin or a baby aspirin once a day, take it at night. The reason: aspirin has a 24 -hour "halflife" therefore, if most heart attacks happen in the wee hours of the morning, the aspirin would be strongest in your system.
2. FYI, aspirin lasts a really long time in your medicine chest for years, (when it gets old, it smells like vinegar). Please read on.

Something that we can do to help ourselves - nice to know. Bayer is making crystal aspirin to dissolve instantly on the tongue. They work much faster than the tablets.

Why keep aspirin by your bedside? It's about Heart Attacks: There are other symptoms of a heart attack besides the pain on the left arm. One must also be aware of an intense pain on the chin, as well as nausea and lots of sweating, however these symptoms may also occur less frequently. Note: There may be NO pain in the chest during a heart attack.

The majority of people (about 60\%) who had a heart attack during their sleep, did not wake up. However, if it occurs, the chest pain may wake you up from your deep sleep. If that happens, immediately dissolve two aspirins in your mouth and swallow them with a bit of water.

## Afterwards:

- call 911
- phone a neighbor or a family member who lives very close by
- say "heart attack!"
- say that you have taken 2 aspirins.
- take a seat on a chair or sofa near the front door, and wait for their arrival and...
- do NOT lie down.

A Cardiologist has stated that, if each person, passes this along to 10 people, probably one life can be saved! I have already shared the information- - What about you?
