Our program on April 10th was presented by Kimberly Briard, the Mentor Coordinator for Take Stock In Children-Palm Beach. Their mission is to break the cycle of poverty for low-income, academically qualified students by providing opportunities for a post-secondary education. Through an innovative multi-year model they provide wraparound services to students, with no drop-off of services after high school completion. Students are matched with a caring volunteer mentor, equipped with academically focused intervention, awarded a college scholarship, and provided with

post-secondary retention services.

Become a Mentor. A mentor is a caring, compassionate adult who chooses to devote their time to a young person. Mentors offer support, guidance,

Helping Third Graders With Their Reading Comprehension

Our program on April 24th was presented by Ted Hoskinson, speaking to us about Project UpLift. As an additional program to Roots and Wings, Project uplift is designed to help children in third grade with their reading



comprehension. Third-graders need to pass the state-mandated FSA reading test to move on to the fourth grade. The program was highly successful last year at Pine Grove Elementary in improving the iReady test scores, and 94 percent of the students showed growth at the end of the school year. Students are encouraged to apply to the program based on their needs. Once students are accepted, they are able to help those that really want the help.

This year they added the second graders from Pine Grove and 59 students from Orchard View Elementary. Much progress has been made by the students and they have plans to add more Delray public elementary schools to the program.

Roots and Wings was established to serve children in need and their families to improve their access to education, health care, transportation and recreation, and to encourage strong, cohesive families.

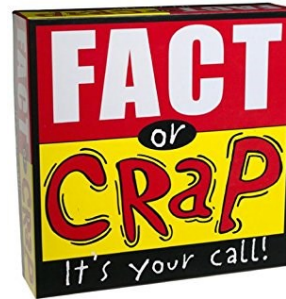

Understanding GMOs

The ongoing debate about the effects of GMOs on health and the environment is a controversial one. In most cases, GMOs are

engineered to make food crops resistant to herbicides and/or to produce an insecticide. For example, much of the sweet corn consumed in the U.S. is genetically engineered to be resistant to the herbicide Roundup and to produce its own insecticide, Bt Toxin.

GMOs are also commonly found in U.S. crops such as soybeans, alfalfa, squash, zucchini, papaya, and canola, and are present in many breakfast cereals and much of the processed food that we eat. If the ingredients on a package include corn syrup or soy lecithin, chances are it contains GMOs.

Are GMOs safe? While the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the biotech companies that engineer GMOs insist they are safe, many food safety advocates point out that no long term studies have ever been conducted to confirm the safety of GMO use, while some animal studies have indicated that consuming GMOs may cause internal organ damage, slowed brain growth, and thickening of the digestive tract.

Don't fall for myth-leading information about tax refunds

Now that the April tax-filing deadline has come and gone, many taxpayers are eager to get details about their tax refunds. When it comes to refunds, there are several common myths going around social media. Here are five of these common myths:

Myth 1: Getting a refund this year means there's no need to adjust withholding for 2019

To help avoid an unexpected tax outcome next year, taxpayers should make changes now to prepare for next year. One way for a taxpayer to do this is to adjust their tax withholding with their employer. The IRS encourages people to do a Paycheck Checkup using the [IRS Withholding Calculator](#) to determine whether their employer is withholding the right amount. This is especially important for anyone who got an unexpected result from filing their tax return this year. This could have happened because the taxpayer's employer withheld too much or too little tax from the employee's paycheck in 2018.

Myth 2: Calling the IRS or a tax professional will provide a better refund date

Many people mistakenly think that talking to the IRS or calling their tax professional is the best way to find out when they will get their refund. In reality, the best way to check the status of a refund is online through the ["Where's My Refund?"](#) tool at IRS.gov or with the [IRS2Go mobile app](#). Taxpayers without Internet access can call the automated refund hotline at 800-829-1954. "Where's My Refund?" has the same information available to IRS telephone assistants, so there is no need to call unless "Where's My Refund?" says to do so.

Myth 3: Ordering a tax transcript is a 'secret way' to get a refund date

Doing so will not help taxpayers find out when they will get their refund. ["Where's My Refund?"](#) tells the taxpayer their tax return has been received and if the IRS has approved or sent the refund.

Myth 4: 'Where's My Refund?' must be wrong because there's no deposit date yet

Updates to ["Where's My Refund?"](#) on both IRS.gov and the IRS2Go mobile app are made once each day. These updates are usually made overnight. Even though the IRS issues most refunds in less than 21 days, it's possible a refund [may take longer](#). This means that in some cases, a taxpayer who filed later may receive their refund sooner than someone who filed earlier in the season. The IRS contacts a taxpayer by mail when it needs more information to process their tax return. Taxpayers should also remember to consider the time it takes for the banks to post the refund to the taxpayer's account. Taxpayers waiting for a refund in the mail should plan for the time it takes a check to arrive.

Myth 5: 'Where's My Refund?' must be wrong because a refund amount is less than expected

There are several factors that could cause a tax refund to be larger or smaller than expected. Situations that could decrease a refund include:
The taxpayer made math errors or mistakes; The taxpayer owes federal taxes for a prior year; The taxpayer owes state taxes, child support, student loans or other delinquent federal nontax obligations; and The IRS holds a portion of the refund while it reviews an item claimed on the return.

The IRS will mail the taxpayer a letter of explanation if these adjustments are made. Some taxpayers may also receive a letter from the Department of Treasury's Bureau of the Fiscal Service if their refund was reduced to offset certain financial obligations.

April 4:

1841 President William Henry Harrison succumbed to pneumonia one month after his inaugural, becoming the first U.S. chief executive to die in office.

1850 The city of Los Angeles was incorporated.

1945 During World War II, U.S. forces liberated the Nazi concentration camp Ohrdruf in Germany. Hungary was liberated as Soviet forces cleared out remaining German troops.

1949 12 nations, including the United States, signed the North Atlantic Treaty in Washington, D.C.

2) Crap - although, beginning in 1988, it was called pork "the other white meat", pork contains as much myoglobin, an oxygen-storing pigment that contains iron, as veal does. The more myoglobin the meat has the redder the meat.

3) Fact - She did hold on to her title "Princess of Wales". As part of the 1996 settlement she received more than \$20 Million as well as \$600,000 per year but was forbidden to use her position to profit from commercial deals.

4) Fact - he survived a brutal car crash in 1954 during a drive from Las Vegas to L.A. He lost his left eye.

5) Fact - Introduced in 1961 by Procter and Gamble. They did not have fastening tabs though.

6) Fact - It was a top 20 hit in 1970.

7) Fact - In 1947 5,000 toys were distributed in Los Angeles by Marine Reservists. It was so successful it was "formed" in 1948. Walt Disney designed the logo.
