For the past 3 weeks we have been ZOOM'in, that is, conducting our weekly Kiwanis meetings via Zoom on the internet.

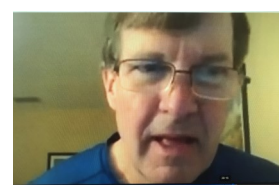
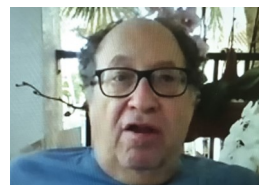
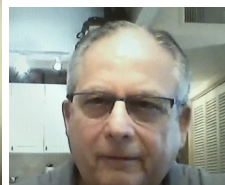
Just because we have stay at home conditions due to the Corona Virus, doesn't mean we can't keep doing the good work of Kiwanis.

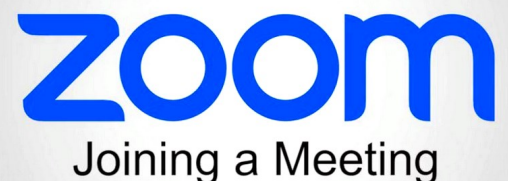
Invitations to Join our Zoom Meetings go out every week.

Taxpayers should be aware of Coronavirus-related scams

Taxpayers should be on the lookout for IRS impersonation calls, texts and email phishing attempts about the coronavirus or COVID-19 Economic Impact Payments. These scams can lead to tax-related fraud and identity theft.

Here's what taxpayers should know:

The IRS will not call, email or text you to verify or request your financial, banking or personal information.

Watch out for websites and social media attempts to request money or personal information. The official website is [IRS.gov](https://www.irs.gov).

Don't open surprise emails that look like they're coming from the IRS or click on attachments or links.

Taxpayers should not provide personal or financial information or engage with potential scammers online or over the phone.

Forward suspicious emails to phishing@irs.gov, then delete.

Go to [IRS.gov](https://www.irs.gov) for the most up-to-date information.

Here's what people should know about the Economic Impact Payments:

The IRS will automatically deposit Economic Impact Payments into the bank account taxpayers provided on their 2019 or 2018 tax return for a direct deposit of their tax refund.

Those without a direct deposit account on file may be able to provide their banking information online through a new secure tool, Get My Payment.

Anyone who is eligible for an Economic Impact Payment and doesn't provide direct deposit information will receive a payment mailed to the last address the IRS has on file.

The IRS does not charge a fee to issue the payment.

Scammers may:

Ask an individual to sign over their Economic Impact Payment check to them.

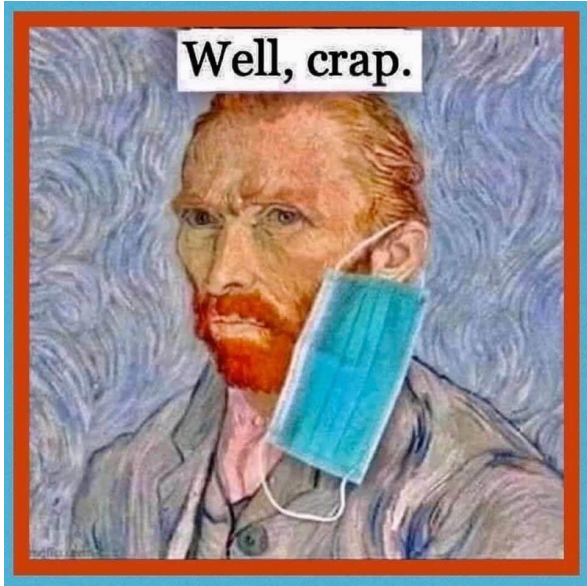
Ask for verification of personal or banking information.

Suggest that they can get someone tax refund or Economic Impact Payment faster by working on their behalf.

Issue a bogus check, often in an odd amount, then tell a person to call a number or verify information online in order to cash it.

Official IRS information about the COVID-19 pandemic and Economic Impact Payments can be found on the [Coronavirus Tax Relief](https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus) page on [IRS.gov](https://www.irs.gov). The IRS encourages people to share this information with family and friends. Many people who normally don't normally file a tax return may not realize they're eligible for an Economic Impact Payment.

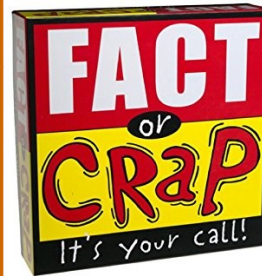

Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on **"This Date in History"**. Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



April 15:

1850, the city of San Francisco was incorporated.
 1865, President Abraham Lincoln died nine hours after being shot the night before by John Wilkes Booth at Ford's Theater in Washington; Andrew Johnson became the nation's 17th president.
 1912, the British luxury liner RMS Titanic foundered in the North Atlantic off Newfoundland more than 2 1/2 hours after hitting an iceberg; 1,514 people died, while less than half as many survived.
 1947, Jackie Robinson, baseball's first black major league player, made his official debut with the Brooklyn Dodgers on opening day at Ebbets Field. (The Dodgers defeated the Boston Braves, 5-3.)
 1955, Ray Kroc opened the first franchised McDonald's restaurant in Des Plaines, Illinois.
 1974, members of the Symbionese Liberation Army held up a branch of the Hibernia Bank in San Francisco; a member of the group was SLA kidnap victim Patricia Hearst, who by this time was going by the name "Tania" (Hearst later said she'd been forced to participate).
 2007, riot police beat and detained dozens of anti-Kremlin demonstrators in St. Petersburg, Russia, on a second day of protests against the government of President Vladimir Putin.
 2013, two bombs made from pressure cookers exploded at the Boston Marathon finish line, killing two women and an 8-year-old boy and injuring more than 260. Suspected bomber Tamerlan Tsarnaev (TAM'-ehr-luhn tsahr-NEYE'-ehv) died in a shootout with police; his brother, Dzhokhar Tsarnaev (joh-HAHR' tsahr-NEYE'-ehv), was tried, convicted and sentenced to death.
 2015, Douglas Hughes, a postal carrier from Florida, flew a one-person gyrocopter onto the West Lawn of the U.S. Capitol as a protest against money in politics; he later pleaded guilty to operating a gyrocopter without a license, a felony.
 2019, A fire swept across the top of the Notre Dame Cathedral as the soaring Paris landmark underwent renovations; the blaze collapsed the cathedral's spire and spread to one of its landmark rectangular towers, but fire officials said the church's structure had been saved.

April 22:

1864, Congress authorized the use of the phrase "In God We Trust" on U.S. coins.
 1898, with the United States and Spain on the verge of war, the U.S. Navy began blockading Cuban ports. Congress authorized creation of the 1st U.S. Volunteer Cavalry, also known as the "Rough Riders."
 1915, the first full-scale use of deadly chemicals in warfare took place as German forces unleashed chlorine gas against Allied troops at the start of the Second Battle of Ypres (EE'-preh) in Belgium during World War I; thousands of soldiers are believed to have died.
 1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson opened the New York World's Fair.
 1970, millions of Americans concerned about the environment observed the first "Earth Day."
 2000, in a dramatic pre-dawn raid, armed immigration agents seized Elian Gonzalez, the Cuban boy at the center of a custody dispute, from his relatives' home in Miami; Elian was reunited with his father at Andrews Air Force Base near Washington.
 2004, Army Ranger Pat Tillman, who'd traded in a multi-million-dollar NFL contract to serve in Afghanistan, was killed by friendly fire; he was 27.
 2010, The Deepwater Horizon oil platform, operated by BP, sank into the Gulf of Mexico two days after a massive explosion that killed 11 workers.
 2015, A federal judge in Philadelphia approved a settlement agreement expected to cost the NFL \$1 billion over 65 years to resolve thousands of concussion lawsuits.

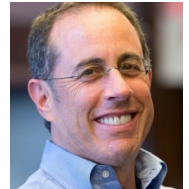
April 29:

1945, during World War II, American soldiers liberated the Dachau (DAH'-khow) concentration camp. Adolf Hitler married Eva Braun inside his "Führerbunker" and designated Adm. Karl Doenitz (DUHR'-nihtz) president.
 1946, 28 former Japanese officials went on trial in Tokyo as war criminals; seven ended up being sentenced to death.
 In 1957, the SM-1, the first military nuclear power plant, was dedicated at Fort Belvoir, Virginia.
 1961, "ABC's Wide World of Sports" premiered, with Jim McKay as host.
 1992, a jury in Simi Valley, California, acquitted four Los Angeles police officers of almost all state charges in the videotaped beating of motorist Rodney King; the verdicts were followed by rioting in Los Angeles resulting in 55 deaths.
 2000, Tens of thousands of angry Cuban-Americans marched peacefully through Miami's Little Havana, protesting the raid in which armed federal agents yanked 6-year-old Elian Gonzalez from the home of relatives.
 2010, The U.S. Navy officially ended a ban on women serving on submarines, saying the first women would be reporting for duty by 2012.
 2015, In what was believed to be the first major league game played without fans in attendance, Chris Davis hit a three-run homer in a six-run first inning and the Baltimore Orioles beat the Chicago White Sox 8-2. (The gates at Camden Yards were locked because of concern for fan safety following recent rioting in Baltimore.)
 2018, T-Mobile and Sprint reached a \$26.5 billion merger agreement that would reduce the U.S. wireless industry to three major players. (The deal would be approved by federal regulators in July 2019).

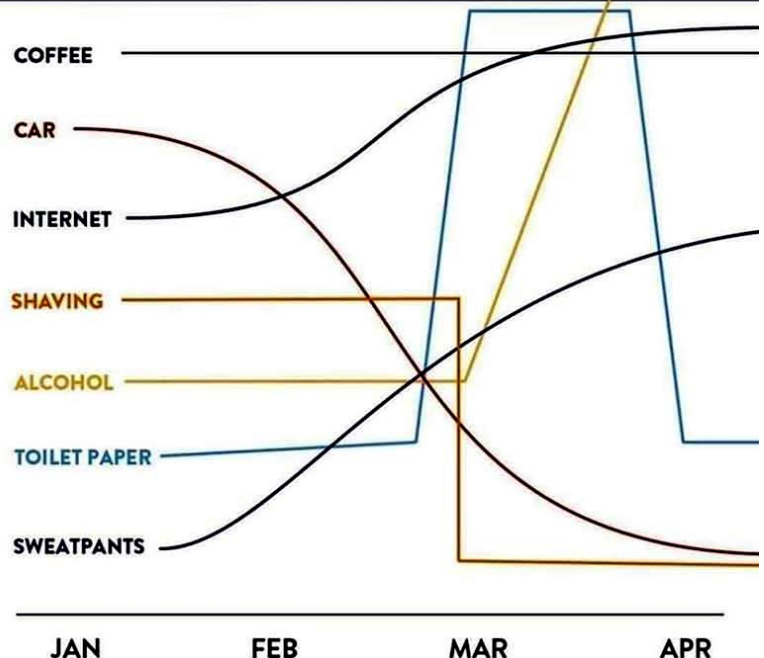

This Month's Sudoku Puzzle....

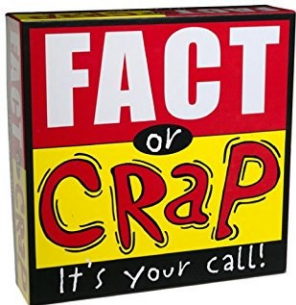
