CELL PHONES: DIAL "C" FOR COLLISION!

Studies show that your collision risk increases by 400 percent every time you use your cell phone while you are driving. The most distracting (and therefore dangerous) cell phone conversation is an argument or emotional discussion. "Inattention blindness" is experienced by drivers on the phone who "see" conflicts in the road but fail to properly perceive their meaning and therefore fail to react to them in a timely manner. A cell phone is great to have for emergencies, but if you need to "just talk," pull off and park in a safe location.

Meanwhile, a study by the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute found that, unsurprisingly, it was texting that caused the real problems. The study found that truckers who send text messages while driving are 23 times more likely to crash or to get into a near-wreck than undistracted drivers. The reasons are obvious: Good luck paying attention to the road when you're staring at the display of your mobile device while mentally composing a message and manipulating a tiny keyboard!

It is against the law to operate a motor vehicle while manually typing or entering multiple letters, numbers, symbols, or other characters into a wireless communications device, or while sending or reading non -voice communications (text, email, instant message,

In a number of carefully controlled trials, scientists have demonstrated that if we




drink 1 litre of water each day, at the end of the year we would have absorbed more than 1 kilo of Escherichia coli, (E. Coli) - bacteria found in feces.

Remember: Water = Poop, Wine = Health Therefore, it's better to drink wine and talk stupid, than to drink water and be full of Shit .





Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



<u> April 7:</u>

1862, Union forces led by Gen. Ulysses S. Grant defeated the Confederates at the Battle of Shiloh in Tennessee.

1922, the Teapot Dome scandal had its beginnings as Interior Secretary Albert B. Fall signed a secret deal to lease U.S. Navy petroleum reserves in Wyoming and California to his friends, oilmen Harry F. Sinclair and Edward L. Doheny, in exchange for cash gifts.

1927, the image and voice of Commerce Secretary Herbert Hoover were transmitted live from Washington to New York in the first successful longdistance demonstration of television.

1945, during World War II, American planes intercepted and effectively destroyed a Japanese fleet, which included the battleship Yamato, that was headed to Okinawa on a suicide mission.

1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower held a news conference in which he spoke of the importance of containing the spread of communism in Indochina, saying, "You have a row of dominoes set up, you knock over the first one, and what will happen to the last one is the certainty that it will go over very quickly." (This became known as the "domino theory," although Eisenhower did not use that

1966, the U.S. Navy recovered a hydrogen bomb that the U.S. Air Force had lost

in the Mediterranean Sea off Spain following a B-52 crash. 2016, "American Idol" crowned 24-year-old Trent Harmon its 15th and final winner as the influential TV show came to an end.

1828, the first edition of Noah Webster's "American Dictionary of the English Language" was published.

1865, President Abraham Lincoln was shot and mortally wounded by John Wilkes Booth during a performance of "Our American Cousin" at Ford's Theater in Washington.

1910, President William Howard Taft became the first U.S. chief executive to throw the ceremonial first pitch at a baseball game as the Washington Senators beat the Philadelphia Athletics 3-0.

1912, the British liner RMS Titanic collided with an iceberg in the North Atlantic at 11:40 p.m. ship's time and began sinking. (The ship went under two hours and 40 minutes later with the loss of 1,514 lives.)

1935, the "Black Sunday" dust storm descended upon the central Plains, turning a sunny afternoon into total darkness.

1960, Tamla Records and Motown Records, founded by Berry Gordy Jr., were

incorporated as Motown Record Corp.

1981, the first test flight of America's first operational space shuttle, the Columbia, ended successfully with a landing at Edwards Air Force Base in California.

2004, in a historic policy shift, President George W. Bush endorsed Israel's plan to hold on to part of the West Bank in any final peace settlement with the Palestinians; he also ruled out Palestinian refugees returning to Israel, bringing strong criticism from the Palestinians.

2016, ABC canceled two of its longtime soap operas, "One Life to Live" and "All My Children

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower resigned as Supreme Allied commander in Europe; he was succeeded by Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway. 1958, the United States conducted the first of 35 nuclear test explosions in the Pacific Proving Ground as part of Operation Hardtack I.

1967, heavyweight boxing champion Muhammad Ali was stripped of his title after he refused to be inducted into the armed forces.

1986, the Soviet Union informed the world of the nuclear disaster at Chernobyl. 1988, a flight attendant was killed and more than 60 persons injured when part of the roof of an Aloha Airlines Boeing 737 tore off during a flight from Hilo (HEE'-loh) to Honolulu. 2001, a Russian rocket lifted off from Central Asia bearing the first space tourist,

California businessman Dennis Tito, and two cosmonauts on a journey to the international space station.

'Avengers: Endgame" shattered the record for biggest opening weekend with an estimated \$350 million in ticket sales domestically and \$1.2 billion globally.

Executive Perspective

It has been about a year since most Kiwanis clubs responded to the pandemic by moving meetings online. For many clubs, of course, the traditional format offers a level of camaraderie and fellowship that only in-

person gatherings can provide.

But not all was lost. Late last year, Kiwanis International collected information from more than 1,500 club secretaries and we got some surprises. For example, 66% of clubs maintained the same meeting frequency. And 41% reported the same number of members — or more — at online meetings. In fact, some members who found it difficult to attend in-person showed up more often.

Many clubs saw improvements: 45% said virtual meetings improved access to speakers. Clubs also reported increases in guests from other clubs, including Service Leadership Programs.

Ultimately, we'll move back to in-person meetings. And that's great. But I hope you'll keep the virtual option. The "hybrid" meeting has become an effective way of engaging members.

It also brings new considerations. If virtual attendees participate in discussions, you might need a fee-based tool like Zoom or GoToMeeting. If they only watch and listen, a free streaming service like Facebook Live or YouTube Live will suffice.

Either way, prepare to make a small investment in lighting, microphones and cameras. Find a member to handle set-up and production. Use multiple meetings to introduce new technology. And get resources at kiwanis.org/covid.

Done well, the virtual option can make meetings accessible to more people.
