Join an Alzheimer's Research Study

On April 13th, our program was presented by Maria Garcia, a Patient Educator for Care Access.

Before new medications are made available to the public, they must undergo a rigorous scientific testing process. Only the few that can continue to accumulate evidence of their safety and efficacy throughout the entire process, which starts in the laboratory and proceeds up through clinical trials with patient volunteers, are allowed to continue on the path to compensation for their time and FDA approval.

Want to understand your risk for developing Alzheimer's Disease? Care Access is looking for volunteers to participate in a preclinical Alzheimer's research study sponsored by Eli Lilly & Company. The study is open to adults ages 55 to 80, who can read,

see and hear so that they can complete a memory test and who have not been diagnosed with any cognitive impairment conditions such as Dementia, Alzheimer's or other conditions that can affect memory and thinking skills.

All visits will be remote except for infusions, lab work, scans and other testing. Study participants will receive study-related care at no cost and eligible participants will receive travel expenses.





Florida Mosquito Awareness Week

Florida Mosquito Awareness Week was April 17-23, 2022. Throughout Florida, there are over 80 species of mosquitoes which vary in diversity of size, color, and behavior. This article provides information on mosquito identification and features that can distinguish them from other unrelated insects.

A primary feature that separates all mosquitoes from most other insects is the shape of its mouthparts, more commonly called a proboscis (see Image 1). The proboscis is more than a hollow



straw and contains many parts, like a toolset for collecting nectar and blood meals. Though other flies may have a proboscis, they are usually much shorter than that of a mosquito. A second characteristic unique to mosquitoes are scales that cover their exterior. These scales contribute to the colorful patterns on the mosquito's body and are essential in identification by entomologists.



The most common insect often confused with mosquitoes are crane flies (also called mosquito hawks, see Image 2). These flies are attracted to light and may end up in your home at night. They are often much bigger than Florida's largest mosquito and

are mistakenly called "giant mosquitoes". However, crane flies do not bite people or animals. In fact, many crane flies have greatly reduced mouthparts and will never feed as adults.

Another fly confused with the mosquito are midges. Non-biting midges (blind mosquitoes, see Image 3) vary greatly in size and can look identical to mosquitoes to the untrained eye. The key missing characteristic is the proboscis. Non-biting midges do not take blood meals and have reduced mouthparts. On the other hand, biting midges (see Image 4) are all extremely small and are commonly called "gnats" or "no-see-ums". Though there are some mosquitoes which are close in size and biting midges do blood feed, they can be differentiated by their much smaller mouthparts.





Whether you are seeing crane flies, midges, or actual mosquitoes, it is important to remove standing water where mosquitoes lay their eggs. You can help prevent them in your yard by getting rid of or draining all objects that may retain stagnant water. In addition, you and your family should always use repellents registered with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). You can find out more at:

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



<u> April 7:</u>

1862, Union forces led by Gen. Ulysses S. Grant and Maj. Gen. Don Carlos Buell defeated the Confederates at the Battle of Shiloh in Tennessee.

1945, during World War II, American planes intercepted and effectively destroyed a Japanese fleet, which included the battleship Yamato, that was headed to Okinawa on a suicide mission.

1949, the Rodgers and Hammerstein musical "South Pacific" opened on Broadway.

Sunriser

1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower held a news conference in which he spoke of the importance of containing the spread of communism in Indochina, saying, "You have a row of dominoes set up, you knock over the first one, and what will happen to the last one is the certainty that it will go over very quickly." (This became known as the "domino theory," although Eisenhower did not use that

1957, shortly after midnight, the last of New York's electric trolleys completed its final run from Queens to Manhattan. 1959, a referendum in Oklahoma repealed the state's ban on alcoholic beverages.

1984, the Census Bureau reported Los Angeles had overtaken Chicago as the nation's "second city" in terms of population.

2020, acting Navy Secretary Thomas Modly resigned after lambasting the officer he'd fired as the captain of the USS Theodore Roosevelt, which had been stricken by a coronavirus outbreak; James McPherson was appointed as acting Navy secretary

(Kevorkian ended up serving eight

2016, the Golden State Warriors became the NBA's first 73-win team by beating the Memphis Grizzlies 125-104, breaking the 1996 72-win record of the Chicago Bulls. Kobe Bryant of the Lakers scored 60 points in his final game, wrapping up 20 vears in thé NBA.

2020, Charles Thacker Jr., a crew member on the aircraft carrier USS Theodore Roosevelt, died at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Guam, becoming the first activeduty military member to die from the coronavirus.

1971, the Supreme Court unanimously upheld the use of busing to achieve racial

desegregation in schools.

1972, Apollo 16's lunar module, carrying astronauts John W. Young and Charles M. Duke Jr., landed on the moon.

1999, the Columbine High School massacre took place in Colorado as two students shot and killed 12 classmates and one teacher before taking their own

2008, Pope Benedict XVI celebrated his final Mass in the United States before a full house in Yankee Stadium, blessing his enormous U.S. flock and telling Americans to use their freedoms wisely.

2010, an explosion on the Deepwater Horizon oil platform, leased by BP, killed 11 workers and caused a blow-out that began spewing an estimated 200 million gallons of crude into the Gulf of Mexico. (The well was finally capped nearly three months later.)

2021, Former Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin was convicted of murder and manslaughter for pinning George Floyd to the pavement with a knee on the Black man's neck in a case that triggered worldwide protests and a reexamination of racism and policing in the U.S. (Chauvin would be sentenced to 22 1/2 years in prison.)

- Each horizontal row has every number only once.
- Each vertical column has every number only once.
- Each 3 by 3 region has every number only once.

Difficulty - Hard. Be sure to use a pencil!



Executive Perspective

If you're reading this, I hope it's because a member of your community's Kiwanis club handed it to you and invited you to learn more about Kiwanis. If so, I'd like to take a few moments to

tell you about us.

First, the basics: We are a 107-year-old organization with clubs in almost 90 nations and territories around the world. Our focus is children — because happy, healthy children are an important part of creating stronger communities everywhere.

Perhaps our greatest contribution to communities has been our youth leadership programs. In high schools, for example, Key Clubs have developed youth leadership skills in millions of students since 1925. I know, because Key Club was my first taste of leadership — and my chance to make a difference in my school and in my home city of Amarillo, Texas.

All along, Kiwanis club members were behind my growth and development. That's a crucial part of Kiwanis membership: the opportunity to serve as advisors and mentors. For me, Kiwanians weren't just early influences — they were the reason I joined a Kiwanis club as an adult.

The man who extended that invitation to me was a Dallas Kiwanian named Art Swanberg. Art told me that we're all about trying to "have a little fun while we do a lot of good." Sometimes, he acknowledged, we do a little good and have a lot of fun — but either way, members make good things happen while working with their neighbors in the community.

This brings me to you. If you want to make a positive impact in your community and get to know more of the people who live there, a Kiwanis club just might be right for you. On the other hand, your first response might be to ask, "What's in it for me?" In that case, I have to be honest: Kiwanis might not be a good match for you. Our members want to make their communities better — and they tend not to worry about contributing time, talent and treasure. More important, they realize that the best way to invest in our future is to invest in our youth.

What I can't tell you is what your Kiwanis club experience will be like. Every Kiwanis club is different. Every club chooses its own service activities, where to spend its money and with whom to partner. And every club can be as large or as small as it chooses. Some clubs have hundreds of members, and some have fewer than a couple dozen. Some meet weekly, ome meet monthly, and some meet online.

And when clubs raise money from the community, it's to support club service activities — we don't expect the community to pay for the cost of membership. Members pay annual dues to Kiwanis International, which cover the club's and organization's administrative expenses, a magazine subscription and liability insurance for you and your club.

Those are some of the basics about who we are and what we do. The next step is yours. I encourage you to visit a Kiwanis club meeting. Better yet, volunteer at a Kiwanis service project. That's the best way to get a real taste of the service, fellowship and community impact that Kiwanis is all about.
