Goldman Attends FBI National Academy

Our program on October 13th was presented by member **Jeff Goldman**. His presentation was on his advanced training stint at the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Va. The National Academy, those two words have special meaning to law enforcement professionals throughout the world. It means influence can't get you in. It means money can't get you in. You have to be nominated, then invited, and after passing a background check,



you finally get the call. Less than 1 percent of all police officers nationwide will ever have a chance to attend.

The Scoop on Amendment 4

On October 27th, Jeffrey Brophy's program presented our club with the facts about Amendment 4, which is on the ballot for the upcoming election. The Amendment establishes that before a local government may adopt a new comprehensive land use plan or amend an existing plan, the proposed plan or amendment shall be subject to a vote of the electors of the local government. A recent study by the Washington Economics Group shows that Amendment 4 is likely to cost over 260,000 jobs and reduce Florida's economic output by more than \$34 billion per year. Since adopting a local version of Amendment 4, the citizens of St. Pete Beach have seen nearly a dozen lawsuits that have cost local taxpayers over half-a-million dollars in legal fees. Also, according to a review of state records, the residents of Carrabelle—a small Franklin County town—would have voted 617 times if Amendment 4 had been law in 2006! Over 200 organizations have opposed Amendment 4 because of its impacts on Florida's economy, environment and quality of life. The Key Message here is:
