# Wayside House Helps Women Find The Courage

On October 12<sup>th</sup>, our program was presented by Robert McCann, the Community Liaison for Wayside House. The mission of Wayside House is to treat and rehabilitate women who suffer from substance addictions and return them and their families to society as clean and productive members of the community.

The core curriculum include two levels of residential treatment that embrace

medical and mental illness care along side addiction recovery.

Structured within

the framework of the traditional 12step model, recovery also includes life and family skills. Special efforts are made to assist in healthy reunification of mothers and children. Intensive Outpatient, Aftercare, and Outpatient services are available and part of the recovery tools provided to reinforce lessons gained in residential treatment to living in the community.

The foundation of treatment at

Wayside House is treating the individual within the context of her family. In February 2008,

# **Every Child Deserves A Home**



Our speaker on October 19<sup>th</sup> was Kokie Dinnan, the Executive Director of Family Promise of South Palm Beach

County (FPSPBC). Family Promise is a charitable organization that utilizes existing resources of local faith communities. Their network churches and synagogues work together to assist

children and their families that have become homeless in our community. Hosting rotates weekly among the host congregations in the network. During a hosting week, the congregations provide food, hospitality, and lodging at the congregation to the families (guest) in the program.

## Family Promise From Page 1

At any one time, there are at most four guest families and no more than 14 people in the program. During the day, guests use the Family Promise Day Center in Delray Beach. A 15-passenger van transports guests between the Day Center and the host congregations. The Day Center is the guests' home base. It provides them with a mailing address, phone service, and computer access to enable guests to find housing and employment. Case managers and guests work together at the Day Center. Together they support the guest's steps toward self-reliance and establish the goals and strategies needed to achieve sustained independence.



Volunteers are the heart of the program. Volunteers prepare meals, provide hospitality, drive the van, staff the Day Center, help guests find jobs and housing and share their specialized skills, such as resume writing, financial planning and parenting. Family Promise collaborates with other service providers to help their guests obtain housing, job mentoring, counseling and social and health services.

Family Promise has been serving homeless families with children in Palm Beach County since November of 2008. It is the local affiliate of the national Family Promise program founded in 1988. There are over 150 affiliates in 39 states throughout the nation. For more information, go to www.familypromisespbc.org.



#### About Uganda...

The vision of American Heritage School to build an international hospital for children in uganda was brought to the Key Club and National Honor Society by local philanthropist, Mrs. Linda Greenberg. Mrs. Greenberg recognized our philosophy of compassion to

community service, and praised our well established and productive programs. She deemed these to be natural sources for success of her



4Uganda Inc...

4Uganda Inc. is a nonprofit organization, founded by Mrs. Linda

Greenberg. Mrs. Greenberg discovered the people of Myende Landing, Uganda when visiting the chimpanzees at the Jane Goodall Institute on Ngamba Island, Uganda. She observed that while the chimpanzees have food, clean water, safe shelter, and medical treatment, the people just across the river have none of these necessities. Mrs. Greenberg is now known as "Mama Linda" by the people of Myende Landing.







4Uganda Inc. is dedicated to assisting the children of Uganda with their education, improving health standards, promoting self sufficiency and encouraging responsible stewardship of the habitat they share with chimpanzees, Silverbacks and other wildlife.

#### Why Uganda?

Myende Landing is a small village in Koome Island, Uganda on Lake Victoria. Myende Landing has no clean water or electricity. There are no medical services for the villagers suffering from dysentery, malaria, HIV/AIDS and malnutrition. The life expectancy here is age 5.

Myende Landing has a population of 300 to 400 people. The nearest health facility is about 8 miles away. While this distance for us is minimal, it is quite a struggle for these people. Inability to travel to this health center, due to lack of money and hardship has left many children, elderly, and women suffering quietly. Myende Landing is a central location for neighboring villages and a medical facility there would serve over 4,000 people

One of the world's best kept and hidden secrets is the atrocity of Ugandan children working in stone quarries. Children ages 4 to 18 years pound stones daily in life-threatening quarries. Without proper clothing, shoes or protective equipment, these "young Ugandan slaves" are often brutalized and raped. They then turn to prostitution due to the "horrfic on job duties!" For all of this abuse, the children are paid \$1.25 per day (10 hour days), enabling them to buy 2 potatoes, bananas and tea to share with their family.

The goal of Heritage4Uganda is to raise money to build a hospital in Myende Landing. Heritage4Uganda is dedicated to reaching out to find ways to build, furnish, staff and ultimately one day, expand this medical facility. Assisting in enhancing natural resources and conditions is paramount for creating self-sufficiency of the people of Myende Landing. Furthermore, the goal of this project is to raise awareness of the atrocities upon these people, by exposing the lack of governmental protection from slavery, disease and starvation.

#### Mayo Clinic - Aspirin not a joke!

Dr. Virend Somers, a cardiologist from the Mayo Clinic who is lead author of the report in the July 29, 2008 issue of the Journal of the American College of Cardiology.

Most heart attacks occur in the day, generally between 6 A.M. and noon, Somers said. Having one during the night, when the heart should be most at rest, means that something unusual happened. Somers and his colleagues have been working for a decade to show that sleep apnea is to blame.

- 1. If you take an aspirin or a baby aspirin once a day, take it at night. The reason: aspirin has a 24-hour "half-life" therefore, if most heart attacks happen in the wee hours of the morning, the aspirin would be strongest in your system.
- 2. FYI, aspirin lasts a really long time in your medicine chest for years, (when it gets old, it smells like vinegar). Please read on.

Something that we can do to help ourselves - nice to know. Bayer is making <u>crystal aspirin</u> to dissolve instantly on the tongue. They work much faster than the tablets.

Why keep aspirin by your bedside? It's about Heart Attacks: There are other symptoms of a heart attack besides the pain on the left arm. One must also be aware of an intense pain on the chin, as well as nausea and lots of sweating, however these symptoms may also occur less frequently.

Note: There may be NO pain in the chest during a heart attack.

The majority of people (about 60%) who had a heart attack during their sleep, did not wake up. However, if it occurs, the chest pain may wake you up from your deep sleep. If that happens, immediately dissolve two aspirins in your mouth and swallow them with a bit of water.

#### Afterwards:

- call 911
- phone a neighbor or a family member who lives very close by.
- say "heart attack!"
- say that you have taken 2 aspirins.
- take a seat on a chair or sofa near the front door, and wait for their arrival and...
- do NOT lie down.

A Cardiologist has stated that, if each person, after receiving this notice, sends it to 10 people, probably one life can be saved!

I have already shared the information- - What about you?

It is my desire to have a training program in place soon that will allow us to bring this training to the Division level much like CLE training and train our advisors every year. We have arranged with Kiwanis International to record the training held in Cocoa Beach and will make it available as soon as possible on our website.
