Delray Beach's Sister Cities

Our program on October 27th was presented by Todd L'Herrou, President of Sister Cities of Delray Beach. Their Mission: Promote greater respect, understanding and cooperation through cultural and educational exchanges and programs for children and adults: encourage individual and community knowledge and commitment to international peace and good will.

Sister City of Delray Beach was created by the city commission in April, 1977 for the purpose of establishing a Sister City affiliation with Miyazu, Japan. In 1999, Sister Cities of Delray Beach added a partnership link with Moshi, Tanzania, East Africa. Subsequently, Sister Cities of Delray Beach has also added sister city relationships with Pesaro, Italy and Aquin,

The Status of Old School Square



On October 20th, our program was an update on the status of Old School Square by Jim Chard, OSS Board Member.

The City of Delray Beach is taking over

events at Old School Square. The decision comes after the city voted to end the lease agreement with the nonprofit that runs the historic site. Last month, a city audit report showed the organization was not in compliance with certain records outlined in their lease agreement.

Over the years, the pavilion has been home to events and concerts. including recent sellout shows for musician Jimmy Buffett.

After the decision, the Old School

Square leaders said they were forced to pause services, possibly canceling events this month.

Donor Patty Jones said the city's decision to end the lease with the nonprofit was shattering and left questions about where her donations would go if she continued to supply concerning Old School Square.

During Tuesday's commission meeting, the city's parks and recreation director said the city has the staff and experience to accommodate the upcoming events.

The non-profit owns everything except the building and grounds. So, we'll see what happens when they officially leave. In the meantime, the city will be searching for a new manager of the site. Stay Tuned!

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

HOW TO SURVIVE A HEART ATTACK WHEN ALONE?

This comes from Dr. Patrick Teefy, Cardiology Head at the Nuclear Medicine Institute University Hospital, London Ont.

- 1. Let's say it's 7:25 pm and you're going home (alone of course) after an unusually hard day on the job.
- 2. You're really tired, upset and frustrated.
- 3. Suddenly you start experiencing severe pain in your chest that starts to drag out into your arm and up into your jaw. You are only about five km from the hospital nearest your home.
- 4. Unfortunately, you don't know if you'll be able to make it that far.
- 5. You have been trained in CPR, but the guy that taught the course did not tell you how to perform it on yourself.
- 6. Since many people are alone when they suffer a heart attack without help, the person whose heart is beating improperly and who begins to feel faint, has only about 10 seconds left before losing consciousness.
- 7. However, these victims can help themselves by coughing repeatedly and very vigorously. A deep breath should be taken before each cough, and the cough must be deep and prolonged, as when producing sputum from deep inside the chest. A breath and a cough must be repeated about every two seconds without let-up until help arrives, or until the heart is felt to be beating normally again.
- 8. Deep breaths get oxygen into the lungs and coughing movements squeeze the heart and keep the blood circulating. The squeezing pressure on the heart also helps it to regain a normal rhythm. In this way, heart attack victims can get help or to a hospital.



Organic Foods: What You Need to Know

Is organic food really healthier? Is it worth the

expense? Find out what the labels mean and which foods give you the most bang for your buck.

Organic meat and milk can be richer in certain nutrients. Results of a 2016 European study show that levels of certain nutrients, including omega-3 fatty acids, were up to 50 percent higher in organic meat and milk than in conventionally raised versions.

Organic food is GMO-free. Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs) or genetically engineered (GE) foods are plants whose DNA has been altered in ways that cannot occur in nature or in traditional crossbreeding, most commonly in order to be resistant to pesticides or produce an insécticide.

Organic food vs. locally-grown food

Unlike organic standards, there is no specific definition for "local food". It could be grown in your local community, your state, your region, or your country. During large portions of the year it is usually possible to find food grown close to home at places such as a farmer's market.

The benefits of locally grown food

Financial: Money stays within the local economy. More money goes directly to the farmer, instead of to things like marketing and distribution.

<u>Transportation:</u> In the U.S., for example, the average distance a meal travels from the farm to the dinner plate is over 1,500 miles. Produce must be picked while still unripe and then gassed to "ripen" it after transport. Or the food is highly processed in factories using preservatives, irradiation, and other means to keep it stable for transport.

Freshness: Local food is harvested when ripe and thus fresher and full of flavor.

Some small local farmers use organic methods but may not be able to afford to become certified organic. Visit a farmer's market and talk with the farmers to find out what methods they use.

Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



October 6:

1683, thirteen families from Krefeld, Germany, arrived in Philadelphia to begin Germantown, one of America's oldest settlements.

1889, the Moulin Rouge in Paris first opened its doors to the public. 1927, the era of talking pictures arrived with the opening of "The Jazz Singer" starring Al Jolson, a feature containing both silent and sound-synchronized sequences.

1969, the New York Mets won the first-ever National League Championship Series, defeating the Atlanta Braves, 7-4, in Game 3; the Baltimore Orioles won the first-ever American League Championship Series, defeating the Minnesota Twins 11-2 in Game 3.

1973, war erupted in the Middle East as Egypt and Syria launched a surprise attack on Israel during the Yom Kippur holiday. (Israel, initially caught off guard, managed to push back the Arab forces before a cease-fire finally took hold in the nearly three-week conflict.)

1979, Pope John Paul II, on a week-long U.S. tour, became the first pontiff to visit the White House, where he was received by President Jimmy Carter. 1981, Egyptian President Anwar Sadat was shot to death by extremists while reviewing a military parade.

2010, social networking app Instagram was launched by Kevin Systrom and Mike Krieger.

2014, the Supreme Court unexpectedly cleared the way for a dramatic expansion of gay marriage in the United States as it rejected appeals from five states seeking to preserve their bans, effectively making such marriages legal in 30 states.

2020, The Food and Drug Administration released updated safety standards for makers of COVID-19 vaccines despite efforts by the White House to block them; the White House said the requirements could delay the availability of vaccines.

October 13:

1792, the cornerstone of the executive mansion, later known as the White House, was laid by President George Washington during a ceremony in the District of Columbia.

1775, the United States Navy had its origins as the Continental Congress ordered the construction of a naval fleet.
1845, Texas voters ratified a state constitution.
1960, John F. Kennedy and Richard Nixon held the third televised debate of their presidential campaign (Nixon was in Los Angeles, Kennedy in New York). 1972, a Uruguayan chartered flight carrying 45 people crashed in the Andes; survivors resorted to feeding off the remains of some of the dead in order to stay alive until they were rescued more than two months later. 2006, Banker Muhammad Yunus of Bangladesh won the Nobel Peace Prize for

using microcredit to lift people out of poverty.

2010, rescuers in Chile using a missile-like escape capsule pulled 33 men one by one to fresh air and freedom 69 days after they were trapped in a collapsed mine

a half-mile underground.

2011, Moammar Gadhafi, 69, Libya's dictator for 42 years, was killed as revolutionary fighters overwhelmed his hometown of Sirte (SURT) and captured the last major bastion of resistance two months after his regime fell. 2020, The Los Angeles Dodgers beat the Tampa Bay Rays 8-3 in the opening game of a World Series played before just 11,388 fans at a neutral site in Arlington, Texas because of the coronavirus pandemic.

1978, Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and Israeli Prime Minister Menachem

1986, the New York Mets won the World Series, coming from behind to defeat the Boston Red Sox, 8-5, in game 7 played at Shea Stadium. 2004, the Boston Red Sox won their first World Series since 1918, sweeping the St. Louis Cardinals in Game 4, 3-0.

Executive Perspective

Healthy children are thriving children. They're the children who enter their

school years ready to learn. With that in mind, Kiwanis begins 2021-22 with a new focus on specific causes as defined by the Kiwanis Children's Fund: health and nutrition; education and literacy; and youth leadership development.

In other words, we get kids ready to learn - and to lead. And we have an opportunity for global impact. It begins with a need that might sound familiar: iodine in kids' diets. In 1994, we launched a multiyear project to virtually eliminate iodine deficiency disorders, or IDD, the world's leading preventable cause of mental retardation. We helped increase worldwide access to iodized table salt from 18% to more than 90%. In many nations, average IQ in population groups increased some by as much as 13 points.

Iodine is the essential ingredient in brain development, which is the launchpad for learning ability. That includes reading ability. When a child learns to read, that child can read to learn for a lifetime. It's a key part of helping kids live healthy, happy lives.

And that's what Kiwanis does. Including our more recent fight against maternal and neonatal tetanus, Kiwanis has raised and leveraged more than US\$250 million for both health and brain development since 1994.

It's simple: Kids need Kiwanis. And Kiwanis needs more clubs and members. Thank you for serving and recruiting in your club. Here's to a new year of creating a world where healthy kids learn and lead.


