At our September 7th meeting, we had the pleasure of listening to Molly Murphy, Volunteer Manager for Horses and the Handicapped of South Florida. "Witness the Magic" is their slogan that tells it all. Equine-Assisted Activities (EAA) are widely recognized as one of the most beneficial forms of recreational therapy that people with special needs can receive. Horses and the Handicapped has been providing this therapy for almost 30 years, helping hundreds of riders improve their self-esteem and interaction with the world around them. Using all five senses as they ride, students process visual, auditory, and tactile information which leads to significantly im-

proved muscle tone, strength, speech, balance, and coordination. The benefits of horseback riding are as numerous as the types of disabilities

and conditions served. This therapy strengthens muscles and increases mobility while building self-confidence, self-awareness and a feeling of freedom and joy for the rider. While riding horses, individuals with limited mobility experience independent movement. Non-verbal and autistic children find their voices. The Library's mission is to foster the love of reading, to encourage lifelong learning and to provide a comprehensive range of library materials, programs and services for adults, teens and children. They offer

patrons extensive book and media collections including audio books, large print books, foreign language

materials, videos, book sale bargains, an extensive Florida collection, access to electronic information and access to the Internet, meeting rooms, art exhibits, concerts, volunteer opportunities, a wide range of programming for all ages, quiet study areas, a coffee shop and community outreach programming.

If you have a Florida driver's license in good standing with a Florida address AND a clear account with other county libraries, you may get a library card free of charge. Why wait? ### "Lets All Read"

On September 21st, our program piggy-backed the Library program with a presentation from Darlene Kostrub, CEO of the Literacy Coalition of Palm Beach County. The facts are startling: 30% of public fourth graders read below grade level; 1 in 7 adults in Palm Beach County functions at the lowest level of literacy.

The Coalition distributes more than 74,000 new books a year to Palm Beach County children and families.

The people they serve include the mother who can't read a letter sent home by her daughter's teacher, the worker who claims he left his glasses at home rather than admit he can't read the instructions left by his boss, the preschool child who lives in a home that doesn't contain a single book and the family who lives in poverty because the parents don't have the literacy skills to qualify for a job that pays a family sustaining wage. Through extensive outreach and collaboration with a network of community partners, the Literacy Coalition strives to ensure that individuals who need to improve their literacy skills receive the help they need.

There are many programs they provide and they are always looking for volunteers and donations. The Literacy Coalition has earned their third consecutive 4-star rating for its ability to efficiently manage and grow its finances. This "exceptional" designation from Charity Navigator differentiates Palm Beach County Literacy Coalition from its peers and demonstrates to the public it is worthy of their trust.

### Did You Know.....?

Ben Ruby presented

#### "Little Known Facts"

at our September 8th meeting. Did you know that Aristocoles (aka Plato) proclaimed that the Sun was the center of the universe and everything revolved around it in the 300 BC era. The prevailing thought was the earth was the center, and essentially remained that way until 1530, when Copernicus completed and gave to the world his great work *De Revolutionibus*, which asserted that the earth rotated on its axis once daily and traveled around the sun once yearly: a fantastic concept for the times.

Along the same lines, Aristotle, a student of Aristocoles, provided physical and observational arguments supporting the idea of a spherical Earth. The idea that educated men at the time of Columbus still believed that the earth was flat, and that this belief was one of the obstacles to be overcome by Columbus before he could get his project sanctioned in 1490.



The question is: How does a thousand years go by before someone accepts or proves the early theories?

Inviting someone to join our Kiwanis club starts with telling the Kiwanis story. But what if you only have a minute or so to introduce Kiwanis and your club to someone new? No worries! Here are five tips to make the most of your one-minute opportunity.



**1. Practice**

Write down your speech. Edit it, too. Practice your delivery and message in front of a mirror or role play with friends. Take it slowly. Develop different versions of your presentation for different situations.

**2. Be yourself**

Your description of Kiwanis should sound effortless, conversational and natural. Adapt it to your personality. Project your passion for Kiwanis and the work you do for children.

**3. Listen**

Allow the other person with whom you're speaking to ask questions and keep the conversation going. Make sure your speech is relevant to the person on the receiving end. Pause briefly between sentences, and remember to breathe.

**4. Engage**

Include a compelling hook to engage the listener. Incorporate examples and stories to illustrate your point. Be warm, friendly, confident and enthusiastic. Maintain eye contact. Smile and use a firm voice.

**5. Take action**

End with an action request, such as inviting the prospective member to attend a breakfast meeting or participate in a project. Be prepared with a business card or club brochure to share.

## The Key Club & Builder's Club are "Back in Action"

With start of the new school year, our Key Club and Builder's Club at American Heritage are officially back in action. They currently have 130 members in their Key Club. Wow!

**Talk About "Big Time".....** The club is off to a fast start, holding a "Cruise the Intracoastal" fundraiser, which raised \$500 each for our Kiwanis club as well as the Key Club and their charity account. The club also delivered 70 cartons of food and supplies to Plumosa Elementary school.

Their Major project is to raise money to build a hospital in Uganda. Below is the information on this very worthwhile project, and deserves everyone's support.

### About Uganda...

The vision of American Heritage School to build an international hospital for children in Uganda was brought to the Key Club and National Honor Society by local philanthropist, Mrs. Linda Greenberg. Mrs. Greenberg recognized our philosophy of compassion to community service, and praised our well established and productive programs. She deemed these to be natural sources for success of her cause.



### 4Uganda Inc...

4Uganda Inc. is a non-profit organization, founded by Mrs. Linda Greenberg.

Mrs. Greenberg discovered the people of Myende Landing, Uganda when visiting the chimpanzees at the Jane Goodall Institute on Ngamba Island, Uganda. She observed that while the chimpanzees have food, clean water, safe shelter, and medical treatment, the people just across the river have none of these necessities. Mrs. Greenberg is now known as "Mama Linda" by the people of Myende Landing.



4Uganda Inc. is dedicated to assisting the children of Uganda with their education, improving health standards, promoting self sufficiency and encouraging responsible stewardship of the habitat they share with chimpanzees, Silverbacks and other wildlife.

### Why Uganda ?

Myende Landing is a small village in Koome Island, Uganda on Lake Victoria. Myende Landing has no clean water or electricity. There are no medical services for the villagers suffering from dysentery, malaria, HIV/AIDS and malnutrition. The life expectancy here is age 5.

Myende Landing has a population of 300 to 400 people. The nearest health facility is about 8 miles away. While this distance for us is minimal, it is quite a struggle for these people. Inability to travel to this health center, due to lack of money and hardship has left many children, elderly, and women suffering quietly. Myende Landing is a central location for neighboring villages and a medical facility there would serve over 4,000 people.

One of the world's best kept and hidden secrets is the atrocity of Ugandan children working in stone quarries. Children ages 4 to 18 years pound stones daily in life-threatening quarries. Without proper clothing, shoes or protective equipment, these "young Ugandan slaves" are often brutalized and raped. They then turn to prostitution due to the "horrific on job duties!" For all of this abuse, the children are paid \$1.25 per day (10 hour days), enabling them to buy 2 potatoes, bananas and tea to share with their family.

The goal of **Heritage4Uganda** is to raise money to build a hospital in Myende Landing. **Heritage4Uganda** is dedicated to reaching out to find ways to build, furnish, staff and ultimately one day, expand this medical facility. Assisting in enhancing natural resources and conditions is paramount for creating self-sufficiency of the people of Myende Landing. Furthermore, the goal of this project is to raise awareness of the atrocities upon these people, by exposing the lack of governmental protection from slavery, disease and starvation.
