

# Drunk Driving

### Six Sobering Facts

Did you know that ...?

•Drunk driving is the most frequently committed crime in the United States.



•About 30 percent of all Americans will be involved in an alcoholrelated car crash during their lifetime.

•More than 40 percent of all fatal auto accidents are alcohol-related.

•An alcohol-related crash kills one person every 31 minutes and injures one person every two minutes.

•Auto accidents are the greatest single cause of death for young people between the ages of six and 27. Almost half of these accidents involve alcohol.

•Your chance of being involved in a drunk-driving accident increases dramatically with every two beers you drink. Have a six pack and your chances of being in a drunk-driving accident are 44 percent.

•1,700 college students die each year from alcoholrelated accidents, including car crashes.

•Approximately 600,000 college students are injured under the influence of alcohol, many of which are automobile-related.

### How much does DUI cost?

Beyond lost lives and painful injuries, alcohol-related crashes in the United States cost federal and local governments and taxpayers approximately \$51 billion each year. (Blincoe et al., 2002)

Of course, a single DUI won't cost you anywhere near that much. But getting caught driving under the influence can be an expensive. Costs vary state by state, but you could spend about \$4,000-\$5,000 on fines, impound fees, a DUI treatment program, insurance increases and other things—and that's before you hire a lawyer. Lawyers will cost another \$10,000 or so.

# Some Legal consequences of a first DUI arrest and conviction are:

•Your license will be suspended for a period of time.

•You may have to participate in a treatment program.

•You may even have to spend a weekend in jail.

# Dietary Supplements

The Dietary Supplement Health and Education Act (DSHEA) defines a dietary supplement as a product that: supplements the

food you eat; contains one or more dietary ingredient (including vitamins; minerals; herbs or other botanicals; amino acids, and other substances); comes in pill, capsule, tablet, or liquid form; and is labeled as a dietary supplement.

There are different types of dietary, or nutritional, supplements. Vitamin and mineral supplements are types of dietary supplements containing micronutrients meant to help a body function smoothly and improve mental health. Herbal (or botanical) supplements are dietary supplements that have a medicinal purpose. Herbal supplements generally support a specific area of the body's health, such as the liver, bones or skin.

Vitamins and minerals are micronutrients that serve a specific purpose and benefit the body in a unique way. For example, vitamin A supports vision and bone growth, whereas vitamin E strengthens the immune system and helps repair DNA. Vitamin and mineral deficiency can impair the body's ability to heal and protect itself. Micronutrients can also have an effect on mental health. Studies in New Zealand have shown that using micronutrients in appropriate doses can help treat depression, anxiety, stress, bipolar disorder, ADHD, autism, and PTSD and trauma.

Taking micronutrient supplements won't make up for an unhealthy diet, though. The basis of healthy eating should always be a diet rich in fresh fruits, vegetables, whole grains, healthy fats, fish and low in processed, fried, sugary, and refined foods. However, some people may benefit from extra nutrients found in a supplement. A general multivitamin and mineral supplement can also be a good safeguard against periodic nutrient shortfalls in your diet.

#### September 8:

1565 A Spanish expedition established the first

"Well," Johnny replied, "Don't f\*\*\* with Uncle Ted when he's been drinking."




# This Month's Sudoku Puzzle....
