## Fall 2023 Police Appreciation Awards

Our Fall 2023 Police Appreciation awards took place on September 27th Vickery at the Delray Beach Golf Club. We recognized Detective Megan Vickery and Service Population Advocate Yazmin Salguero.

Megan Vickery: In September of 2022, Det. Vickery was assigned an Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) case after receiving a cyber tip where the from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The tip stated that a nondescript user on the social blog site "Quora" had uploaded an image to the website that depicted child pornography. The tip only included the users email address, Internet Protocol (IP) address, and the name "Mike C" .

In October Det. Vickery received information from Comcast thru a subpoena that identified the home address and account holder associated with the IP address. Because IP addresses are only unique to an account and not necessarily a person, Det. Vickery began to investigate the residence and the suspected occupants.

Det. confirmed that there were only two occupants in the home



image was uploaded. The occupants were two males, a 77-year-old father and his 58-year-old son. However, Det. Vickery was unable to confirm which of the two had actually uploaded the image to Quora.

After months of investigating and reviewing records, Det. Vickery decided to approach the residence to speak with the father and son. During the visit, the 58-year-old son confirmed that he knew of the social platform Quora but denied ever using it. The son provided his email address which matched the one associated with Quora account, but he refused to provide his phone number or to allow

## Delray Beach Fire Rescue

Our program on September 20th was presented by Joe Mazzeo, Delray Beach

Assistant Fire Marshall and Dani Moschella, Public Affairs Manager.

The men and women of Delray Beach Fire Rescue are dually trained as Firefighters and Paramedics, and our services include: Fire and Safety Education, Special Operations, Plan Review, Code Enforcement, EMS Transport, Fire Inspection, Fire Investigations and Hazardous Materials Response.

Included in their programs and

Services is the residential lock box program. DBFR's Residential Lock Box program allows participants to safely leave a key on their front door in a small, safe-like box that can be accessed with a master key that only firefighters have. That means firefighters can get in quickly after a medical emergency or fall.

They also provide Home Safety Survey's, blood pressure screenings, car seat installations, CPR instruction and much more.

## Trivia Night!

On September 9th, our club was represented by **Bill & Bonnie Morse, Terrence Moore, Dave** Freeburn Rich Pollack and Sophia Youngberg. It

was a tough fight, but Kiwanis managed a 3rd place finish. More importantly, we beat Rotary!

Also there to support the team were **Ezra Krieg, Scott** Youngberg, Peggy Kelleher, and Gina & Bob Sablo.













Det. Vickery to review the contents of his device.

Det. Vickery then decided to draft a search warrant for the Quora account in hopes of refuting the son's statement and to identify potentially incriminating conversations and images. In June of 2023, Quora produced hundreds of pages of sexual online

communication with suspected minors. Det. Vickery meticulously examined the records to identify potential victims. During this

review process Det. Vickery identified communication and corresponding images with a 14-year-old child in California. The communication was sexual in nature and rose to the level of criminal solicitation of a minor.

Det. Vickery briefed the State Attorney's Office of her findings and on June 28th Det. Vickery was granted a search warrant. On June 30th, with the assistance of the Delray Beach Police Department's SWAT team, she executed the warrant resulting in the recovery of 7 cellphones, a laptop, and illicit drugs.

Det. Vickery brought the suspect back to the police department for an interview where he acknowledged ownership of the Quora account and confessed to the solicitation. The suspect was arrested and charged with obscene communication with a minor.

Fearing that other children may be at risk, Det. Vickery worked diligently to identify the suspect and prevent further sharing of sexually explicit material involving minors. Over the course of this 10-month investigation, Det. Vickery served numerous subpoenas, drafted 3 search warrants, and recovered electronic devices that contain suspected child pornography as well as illicit drugs. Det. Vickery's pursuit of justice and compassion for voiceless crime victims resulted in the incarceration of Thank you both for a a child predator and is undoubtedly a positive reflection on the Delray Beach Police Department.

**Yazmin Salguero** was hired for the position of Service Population Advocate which was funded by the Kimmel Grant. Her role was to focus on homeless prevention. Many of our housed citizens in Delray Beach are on a fixed income and one check away from homelessness.

Yazmin learned how to assist residents in utilizing the LIHEAP program (Low income home energy Program). It is a federally funded program that helps income qualified families with home heating and cooling costs.

Yazmin has been meeting with residents at the Lake Delray apartments, assessing if each resident is eligible and goes through the process of getting them paperwork

ready (which is very time consuming) and completes the application with them. If LIHEAP is approved it will save the recipient up to \$1200 yearly on the FPL bill.

Through February 2023, Yazmin has obtained LIHEAP for 35 individuals and has been able to save them a total of \$33,400. Without the assistance of Service Population Advocate Salguero many of these individuals would not be able to pay their bills monthly.



## IMPORTANT VOTER INFORMATION

## **Renew Your Mail Ballot Request Today**

All Vote-by-Mail Requests submitted prior to the November 8, 2022 General Election have **expired**. New Election Laws require voters to renew their mail ballot requests after each General Election.

Voters who wish to receive a Vote-by-Mail ballot for the 2024 elections are required to complete a new Voteby-Mail ballot request.

Updated Vote-by-Mail requests will be valid until December 31, 2024. After the next General Election, voters will need to make the request again.

Vote-by-Mail requests can be made: Online at VotePalmBeach.gov, By calling (561) 656-6208, By fax at (561) 656-6230 or In person by visiting any of their four (4) offices.

#### **Don't Wait to Get Election Ready**

#### Register to vote.

If you are not already registered, you must register at least 29 days before an election to vote in that election. Voter Registration Applications can be downloaded from VotePalmBeach.gov and are displayed at voter registration agencies throughout the county. It only takes a few minutes to fill one out and mail or deliver it to our office, the Florida Division of Elections, or any voter registration agency.

#### Is your voter information up-to-date?

Once you have registered to vote in Florida, you do not have to register again, but you do need to keep your information up-to-date. To verify your current voter registration information, status, polling place location, sample ballot, and Vote-by-Mail ballot status, visit VotePalmBeach.gov and click on the "My Status" tab, or call (561) 656-6200.

If you've recently moved, updating your address is quick and easy.

Visit RegisterToVoteFlorida.gov, call (561) 656-6200, or email info@votepalmbeach.gov. Please have your Florida driver license, Florida ID card, or the last 4 digits of your Social Security number available when updating your address.

#### Make sure to have your current signature on file.

Your handwriting may change over time, so updating your signature periodically is important. The Supervisor of Elections office uses the signatures on file to verify your identity on petitions, provisional ballots, and Voteby-Mail ballots. You may use a paper voter registration application or an online application to update your signature. If you use the online voter registration application, the most recent signature from your Florida driver's license or Florida ID card will be added to your voter record.

# **Tips for Eating Less Salt**

Sodium isn't completely bad for our bodies, but too much can increase blood pressure and cause stress on the heart and blood vessels. Because of this, it's essential to monitor your sodium intake and be aware of how much sodium is in vour foods.

If you want to tackle cutting back on sodium, choose unprocessed or minimally processed foods. Prepared foods are generally high in added sodium compared to fresh options. Cut back on sources of high sodium, such as pepperoni pizza, white bread, processed cheese, deli meat, hot dogs, and other red meat and processed foods. Instead, eat more fruits, veggies, and whole grains, all lower in sodium.

# Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



September 7:

1901, the Peace of Beijing ended the Boxer Rebellion in China. 1940, Nazi Germany began its eight-month blitz of Britain during World War II

with the first air attack on London.

1977, the Panama Canal treaties, calling for the U.S. to eventually turn over control of the waterway to Panama, were signed in Washington by President Jimmy Carter and Panamanian leader Omar Torrijos.

1986, Bishop Desmond Tutu was installed as the first Black clergyman to lead the Anglican Church in southern Africa.

1996, rapper Tupac Shakur was shot and mortally wounded on the Las Vegas

Strip; he died six days later. 2007, Osama bin Laden appeared in a video for the first time in three years, telling Americans they should convert to Islam if they wanted the war in Iraq to end.

2008, troubled mortgage giants Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac were placed in government conservatorship.

2013, Tokyo was awarded the 2020 Summer Olympics, defeating Istanbul in the final round of secret voting by the International Olympic Committee. 2020, India's increasing coronavirus caseload made the Asian giant the world's second-worst-hit country behind the United States.

**Birthdays:** Jazz musician Sonny Rollins is 93. Singer Gloria Gaynor is 80. Actor Susan Blakely is 75. Rock singer Chrissie Hynde (The Pretenders) is 72. Actor Corbin Bernsen is 69. Pianist Michael Feinstein is 67. Actor-comedian Leslie Jones (TV: "Saturday Night Live") is 56. Actor Alyssa Diaz (TV: "Ray Donovan"; "Zoo") is 38. Actor Evan Rachel Wood is 36.

<u>September 13:</u>

1788, the Congress of the Confederation authorized the first national election, and declared New York City the temporary national capital.

1814, during the War of 1812, British naval forces began bombarding Fort McHenry in Baltimore but were driven back by American defenders in a battle

that lasted until the following morning. 1948, Republican Margaret Chase Smith of Maine was elected to the U.S. Senate; she became the first woman to serve in both houses of Congress.

1962, Mississippi Gov. Ross Barnett rejected the U.S. Supreme Court's order for

the University of Mississippi to admit James Meredith, a Black student, declaring in a televised address, "We will not drink from the cup of genocide."

1971, a four-day inmates' rebellion at the Attica Correctional Facility in western New York ended as police and guards stormed the prison; the ordeal and final assault claimed the lives of 32 inmates and 11 hostages.



## TELLING THE KIWANIS STORY

The Kiwanis Children's Fund helps seven clubs address kids' nutrition, physical fitness and comfort. By Erin Chandler

In the months of May, June and July, the Kiwanis Children's Fund continued to amplify Kiwanians' ability to change lives in their communities by distributing microgrants to Kiwanis clubs with 35 or fewer members. Kiwanis Children's Fund grants improve the lives of children around the world by identifying the projects that create a continuum of impact in a child's life — an impact that spans their entire childhood and sets them up for a bright future. By funding projects that target the Kiwanis causes of education and literacy, health and nutrition, and youth leadership development, whether through a Kiwanis club's local service project or through a club's partner, the Children's Fund ensures that its grantmaking has the greatest possible impact.

Recent microgrants have gone to Kiwanis clubs around the world collecting school supplies, spreading literacy through physical and virtual libraries, and updating learning spaces for children. The following five clubs received funding for projects focused on enhancing the health and nutrition of kids in need.

#### More nutritious food

At Twin Rivers Elementary School in McKeesport, Pennsylvania, U.S., 100% of the students qualify for the free lunch program. For the past two years, the Kiwanis Club of McKeesport White Oak has stepped in to make sure those students with the greatest need do not go hungry over the weekends with their Weekend Food Bag program. Kiwanis club members donate and pack food each week for the students to take home on Fridays throughout the school year. Last year, they gave a total of 1,080 bags of food to 30 students. A Kiwanis Children's Fund microgrant will help the club offer greater quantities of more nutritious food as they extend the program into the 2023-24 school year.

#### Summer meals

The Kiwanis Club of Meramec Valley Community, Missouri, U.S., is teaming up with the Valley Park School District and several other local service organizations to make sure students up to age 18 have enough food during the summer months, when school is not in session. Volunteers use school kitchen and lunchroom facilities to store and pack food into lunch bags, which they distribute three times a week at three community sites. The club estimates that 50-75 children will benefit from the program, thanks to the food they purchase with the help of a Kiwanis Children's Fund microgrant.

#### Bigger fridge, less hunger

For the past year, the Kiwanis Club of Bachten de Kupe, La Joconde, West Flanders, Belgium, has addressed both food waste and hunger in its community by turning surplus food from farms and businesses into food packages for around 1,000 children in need. Currently, one in eight children in Belgium struggle with food insecurity, and the number is growing beyond the club's ability to keep up with the demand. A microgrant from the Kiwanis Children's Fund will allow the club to purchase a larger refrigerator and double the number of children the project serves.

Fresh veggies for school lunches

The Kiwanis Club of Leisure World, Silver Spring, Maryland, U.S., has a longstanding relationship with Harmony Hills Elementary School, donating clothes and books to students there. Now members are stepping in to boost the students' nutrition as well. With help from a Kiwanis Children's Fund microgrant, the club will donate vegetables from its community garden plot to children who are eligible for free or reduced-price lunches. Eight club members will weed, water and manage the garden.

#### **Outdoor adventures**

With help from a Kiwanis Children's Fund microgrant, members of the Kiwanis Club of Corabia, Romania, will organize and run AdventureCAMP, a five-day mountain camp for children. Kids involved in the camp will spend time in the great outdoors, participating in two workshops per day on topics including personal development, first aid, road safety, reading a compass, building a campfire, hiking, climbing, ziplining and photography. Club members hope that more kids will reach their potential physically, mentally and socially thanks to their time at the camp.
