## There's Help Through Family Mentoring

Our program on August 1st was presented by Suzan Santosus, the Director of Admin Services for The Children's Healing Institute (CHI). The mission of CHI is to prevent child abuse, promote pediatric health and strengthen families.
Families are the pillars of our society and the basis for strong communities. The Children's Healing Institute believes that by strengthening each member of the family through mentoring, the family will be more effective and prepared to deal with life's challenges. Some challenges are easier than others to manage. Families may find themselves isolated, or with grandparents taking care of grandchildren, a single mother/father, teen parents, many children, or with a parental history of abuse/neglect.

Sometimes there is no one to turn to and parents do the best they can on their own. But now there is someone to count on for suggestions and guidance, a Parent Aide
 Mentor!
The Parent Aide Mentoring program is a voluntary program for families with parents who feel overwhelmed and want to ensure that they have the skills and tools necessary to have a healthy, happy and safe home.

## Learn The Art Of Digital Filmmaking

Our program on August 8th was presented by Dana Brookes, the Director of Development for the College of Motion Picture Arts at Florida State University. The school has joined with Digital Domain Media Group to provide classes in digital filmmaking. The school is starting small, with 30 students and rented space in an office building at CityPlace in West Palm Beach. For students in the new program, there will be no courses in math, science or economics - just all film, all the time. Students are told not to take part-time work, and they're
expected to be available during the summer to shoot films. "It's an immersion," said Andrew Syder, director of digital media programs at FSU's campus here. "It's like boot camp for three years." In a few years, FSU and Digital Domain hope to enroll 300 students in the bachelor's program, plus perhaps 300 more in "Essential Skills." Digital Domain has won accolades for its special effects work in such films as "Transformers" and Tron: Legacy." In addition, Digital Domain is currently looking for 300 animators for their offices in Port St. Lucie. For more

## Slot Machine Vote For Palm Beach County On Nov. 6 Ballot



Mike Jones, the Chairman for Coalition for More Jobs, Better Schools, A Stronger Economy, is encouraging us to vote Yes for slot machines in Palm Beach County in the upcoming election.

This is a referendum to allow slot machines at the Palm Beach Kennel Club. The Kennel Club is a local business, and a licensed pari-mutuel facility, that generates hundreds of jobs and millions in tax revenue for Palm Beach County's economy. However, racetracks in surrounding counties, where slot machines have already been approved by voters, are hurting the Palm Beach Kennel Club's ability to compete and also taking away jobs and revenues from our local economy.

Jones says some of the reasons why it would benefit Palm Beach County's residents and our economy includes: creating jobs and bring in more local revenue to improve our economy; Keeps Revenues in Palm Beach County; Increases revenues for public schools; and Generates Tax Dollars for Palm Beach County. ## Why Do We Belong to Kiwanis?



Kiwanis is a global organization of volunteers dedicated to changing the world one child and one community at a time.
Our members develop youth as leaders, build playgrounds and raise funds for pediatric research. We help shelter the homeless, feed the hungry, mentor the disadvantaged and care for the sick. Working together, members achieve what one person cannot accomplish alone. . . . . And along the way, club members share friendship and laughter.
Kiwanis' Worldwide Service Project is a Kiwanis family initiative to make a positive difference in the world on behalf of children. In its first Worldwide Service Project, Kiwanis worked to virtually eliminate Iodine Deficiency Disorders (IDD), the leading preventable cause of mental retardation. Today, about 70 percent of the people in the developing world have access to iodized salt, and UNICEF has hailed this project as one of the greatest public health triumphs of the 20th century.
Kiwanis' current Worldwide Service Project is "The ELIMINATE Project". With The ELIMINATE Project, Kiwanis International and UNICEF have joined forces to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus (MNT). This deadly disease steals the lives of 60,000 innocent babies and 30,000 mothers each year. The effects of the disease are excruciating - tiny newborns suffer repeated, painful convulsions and extreme sensitivity to light and touch. To eliminate MNT from the Earth by 2015, 129 million mothers and their future babies must be immunized. This requires vaccines, syringes, safe storage, transportation, thousands of skilled staff and more. It will take $\$ 110$ million - and the dedicated work of UNICEF and every member of the Kiwanis family.

## Do You Really Need a Colonoscopy?

Screening for colorectal cancer-that is, cancers of the colon (large intestine) and rectum-is a proven lifesaver. This is partly due to the fact that this is one cancer which screening can actually prevent, since it can lead to the detection and removal of polyps, some of which may progress to cancer.

Colonoscopy is a good test, though not perfect. You should know your other screening options as well. Everybody age 50 to 75 should be screened for colorectal cancer, whichever test they use. People at high risk-notably those with a family history, a known genetic risk, inflammatory bowel disease or certain other disorders-should start earlier.

Discuss the screening options with your doctor. Colonoscopy is not the only test-which is fortunate, since there aren't enough skilled practitioners to screen all eligible people. Nor is it necessarily the best. All the tests have strengths and weaknesses, which you and your doctor need to weigh.
