Fighting For Young Children

Our program on August 10th was presented by Sarah Turner, the Director of Community Relations for the Center For Child Counseling (CFCC). Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health have been the foundation of the Center for Child Counseling's mission in Palm Beach County since being founded in 1999. They focus on the youngest children in our community because research shows that this period of life is one of critical importance, providing the foundation for health throughout the lifespan.

Their programs and expertise are grounded in research about early brain development and the impact of adversity and trauma on development. Violence, abuse, and

neglect in the earliest years of life are forms of "toxic stress" that can fundamentally change the developing brain, in the absence of healthy relationships. Secure, stable, supportive relationships between children and caring adults in the family and community contribute significantly to children's healthy brain development by buffering the brain from the damage due to high stress.

"Adverse Childhood Experiences are the single greatest unaddressed public health threat facing our nation today," says Dr. Robert Block, former President of the American Academy of Pediatrics. CFCC programs focus on preventing and healing the effects adversity and toxic stress have on developing children. For more information, go to www.centerforchildcounseling.org

The aim of Live Fresh is to provide Palm Beach County's homeless individuals and families with a fresh shower, personal hygiene essentials and the opportunity to Live FRESH: Feeling Revitalized Encourages Sustainable Happiness.

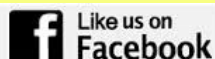
They use their premiere mobile shower / personal hygiene facility, to make sure everyone in Palm Beach County has the ability to take a Fresh Shower. They provide access to

personal hygiene essentials including: Towel Soap · Shampoo · Conditioner · Toothbrush · Toothpaste · Dental Floss · Mouthwash · Lotion · Sunscreen · Sanitary Napkins (for women) · Condoms.

By means of Genesis Community Health's "outreach/ visiting clinics", they provide healthcare that brings services to the homeless. These clinics offer various health screenings, HIV Counseling and Testing, and referral services, linking the individual to a primary care facility and overall care with other supporting and partner organizations. After her last operation, she was released from the hospital. While crossing the street on her way home, she was killed by an ambulance.

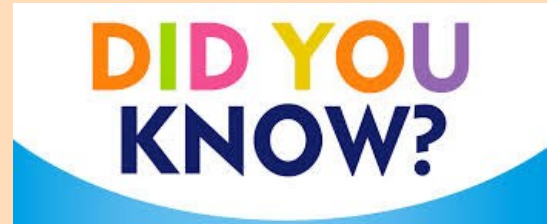
Arriving in front of God, she demanded, "I thought you said I had another 43 years? Why didn't you pull me out of the path of the ambulance?"

Nothing is more important than the safety and well-being of those we serve—and of the Kiwanians who serve them. That's why Kiwanis International annually presents Youth Protection Week.

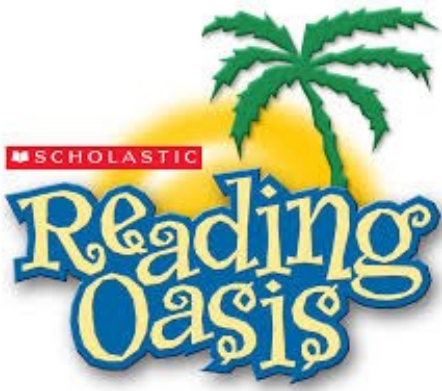

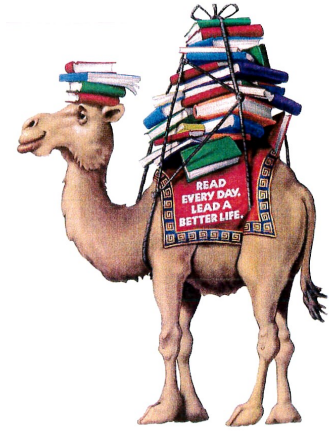

August 4:

- 1790 The Coast Guard had its beginnings as the Revenue Cutter Service.

- 1977 President Jimmy Carter signed a measure establishing the Department of Energy.
- 1987 The Federal Communications Commission voted to rescind the Fairness Doctrine, which required radio and TV stations to present balanced coverage of controversial issues.
- 2005 A mini-submarine carrying seven Russians became caught on an underwater antenna 600 feet below the surface of the Pacific Ocean; the men were rescued three days later with help from a British vessel.
- 2007 Barry Bonds of the San Francisco Giants tied Hank Aaron's 755 career home runs.

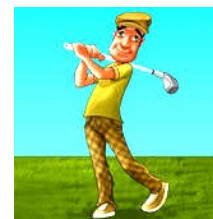

Executive Perspective

SERVE AND PROTECT

Working in an organization that is focused on serving the needs of children and empowering youth leaders is incredibly gratifying. Knowing that every day, at every hour, some child, an adolescent or a teen is benefiting from the contributions of Kiwanians in their Kiwanis clubs. From where I sit, I see many Kiwanis projects and programs that truly change lives.

Also, from where I sit, I see the need to protect the young people we serve, as well as our clubs and members from many of the liability-related issues that confront our communities today. It's all too often that we pick up a newspaper and read a horrifying story about a teacher or youth counselor or member of the clergy or even a law enforcement officer who has misused his or her position to abuse a child.

It's important to note that our track record as an organization is pretty good. We haven't had to deal with many of these incidents, and that likely attests to the character of Kiwanians. Our members are good people who care about kids in their communities. But Kiwanis, like many organizations, has not been immune to a few cases of inappropriate behavior.

We've realized that an organization focused on serving children can attract an occasional predator, looking for easy access to minors. And, I'm sad to say, we've had to deal with a few of these over the years. First and foremost, our goal is to protect the children and youth—and their families—whom we serve. The protections we've put in place as an organization are primarily designed to provide a safe space for these minors.

Additionally, we are working hard to provide the adequate liability risk management for our clubs and members, so they too will be afforded the ability to work with children and youth in their communities. Our reputation has been built over more than a century of service.

In recent years, we introduced youth protection guidelines, and we asked every district to appoint a youth protection coordinator (manager) to help communicate to and educate our clubs. We initiated the requirement that officers of the organization must complete a clear criminal history background check every two years. And, we created a comprehensive criminal history background check process managed by Kiwanis International to ensure this is administered carefully and confidentially.

In October of this year, we will introduce the next layer of protection: All Kiwanis members who serve as advisors to youth clubs should also have a clear criminal history background check every two years. We advise any Kiwanis member working with youth should also get the background check completed.

The children and youth we serve deserve the very highest level of protection we can provide. I ask you to join me in taking the extra steps necessary to protect Kiwanis and our programs for children.
