"We Value What You Value"

Our program on August 11th was presented by Dorothy Jacks, Palm Beach County Property Appraiser.

Your Property Appraiser has three primary responsibilities: Determine the taxable value of more than 640,000 parcels and nearly 60,000 tangible personal property accounts in Palm Beach County; Apply tax exemptions to properties that meet certain qualifications; and Maintain the county's official map and property ownership records. The Property Appraiser's Office employs 240 qualified professionals at five service centers throughout Palm Beach County, and has more credentialed appraisal professionals than any other jurisdiction in the United States.

This time of the year, the office is preparing the Notices of Proposed Property Taxes and Non Ad Valorem Assessments.

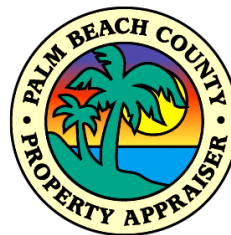
Called the TRIM for "Truth in Millage" around the office, this individualized letter shows each Palm Beach County property owner the market, assessed and taxable values of your property, as well as proposed tax rates and public hearing information if you would like to make your voice heard regarding those proposed tax rates.



These notices were mailed on August 19. It is not a bill, but rather an estimate of your taxes. Your tax bill will be mailed by the Palm Beach County Tax Collector in November.

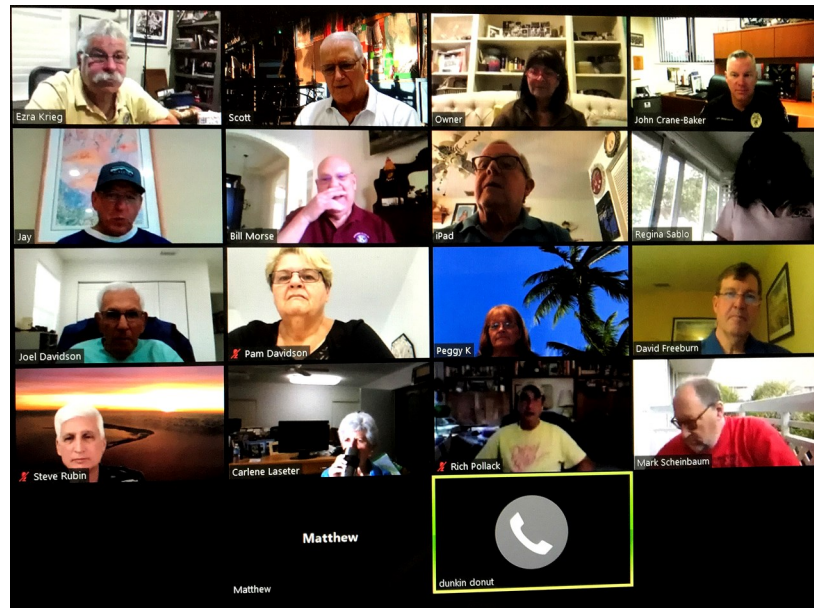

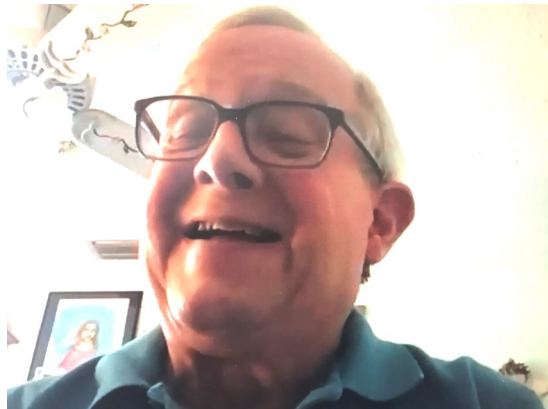

Jervonte Edmonds founded Suits for Seniors, a high school mentoring program that prepares students for their future careers. Jervonte has also worked as Executive Director of the West Palm Beach Police Athletic League, sat on the Executive Board of the Black Chamber of Commerce of Palm Beach County, and served as President of the Palm Beach Young Black Progressives. He has worked in the Florida Senate, as Legislative Assistant to State Senator Bobby Powell, 2015-2017 and Florida House of Representatives, Legislative Assistant.

Jervonte has written two children's books that teach children they can be whatever they want to be as long as they believe in themselves - To the Moon and Back and Adventures of the Rich and Famous.

Explore Morikami

Our speaker on August 25th was Diane Carter, Ambassador for Morikami Museum and Gardens.

The mission at Morikami Museum and Japanese Gardens is to engage a diverse audience by presenting Japanese cultural experiences that educate and inspire. Since opening in 1977, Morikami has been a center for Japanese arts and culture in South Florida. With rotating exhibitions, tea ceremonies performed monthly (October through May) in the Seishin-an tea house, educational outreach programs with local schools and organizations, and Japanese traditional festivals celebrated for the public several times a year, Morikami strives to spread appreciation for the living culture of Japan.

The original museum building, named the Yamato-kan, is modeled after a Japanese villa. It features a ring of exhibition rooms surrounding an open-air courtyard with a dry garden of gravel, pebbles and small boulders. The Yamato-kan offers a permanent exhibit chronicling the history of the Yamato Colony, a Japanese farming community in South Florida 100 years ago.

The principal museum building opened in 1993 to meet popular demand for more programming, more versatile facilities, and to satisfy the needs of a growing community. The museum's architecture is inspired by traditional Japanese design. The building features three exhibition galleries, a 225-seat theater, an authentic tea house with viewing gallery, classrooms, a museum store, the Cornell Cafe and lakeside terraces for a panoramic view while dining.

The 16 acres that surround Morikami's two museum buildings include expansive Japanese gardens with strolling paths, resting areas, their world-class bonsai collection and lakes teeming with koi and other wildlife. The wider 200-acre park features nature trails, pine forests and picnic areas. For more information, go to <https://morikami.org>.

What supplies do I need?

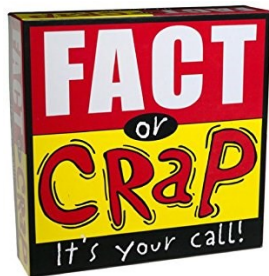

Healthy food for kids - Don't ignore weight problems

Children who are substantially overweight are at greater risk for cardiovascular disease, bone and joint problems, sleep apnea, poor self-esteem, and long-term health problems in adulthood.

Addressing weight problems in children requires a coordinated plan of physical activity and healthy nutrition.

The goal is to slow or halt weight gain (unless directed by your child's doctor), thereby allowing your child to grow into their ideal weight.

Don't fall into the low-fat trap. Because fat is so dense in calories, a little can go a long way in making kids feel full and keeping them feeling fuller for longer.

Eating a breakfast high in quality protein—from enriched cereal, yoghurt, milk, cheese, eggs, meat, or fish—can help overweight teenagers eat fewer calories throughout the rest of the day.

Encourage exercise

The benefits of lifelong exercise are abundant and regular exercise can even help motivate your kids to make healthy food choices.

- Play with your kids. Throw around a football; go cycling, skating, or swimming; take family walks and hikes.
- Help your kids find activities they enjoy by showing them different possibilities.

Krieg's Korner

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, **Ezra Krieg** brings us up to date with what happened on **"This Date in History"**. Here are a few interesting items from the past few weeks:



August 5:

1864, during the Civil War, Union Adm. David G. Farragut led his fleet to victory in the Battle of Mobile Bay, Alabama.
 1921, a baseball game was broadcast for the first time as KDKA radio announcer Harold Arlin described the action between the Pittsburgh Pirates and the Philadelphia Phillies from Forbes Field. (The Pirates won, 8-5.)
 1936, Jesse Owens of the United States won the 200-meter dash at the Berlin Olympics, collecting the third of his four gold medals.
 1954, 24 boxers became the first inductees into the Boxing Hall of Fame, including Henry Armstrong, Gentleman Jim Corbett, Jack Dempsey, Jack Johnson, Joe Louis and John L. Sullivan.
 1962, South African anti-apartheid activist Nelson Mandela was arrested on charges of leaving the country without a passport and inciting workers to strike; it was the beginning of 27 years of imprisonment.
 1964, U.S. Navy pilot Everett Alvarez Jr. became the first American flier to be shot down and captured by North Vietnam; he was held prisoner until February 1973.
 1974, the White House released transcripts of subpoenaed tape recordings showing that President Richard Nixon and his chief of staff, H.R. Haldeman, had discussed a plan in June 1972 to use the CIA to thwart the FBI's Watergate investigation; revelation of the tape sparked Nixon's resignation.
 2010, Thirty-three workers were trapped in a copper mine in northern Chile after a tunnel caved in (all were rescued after being entombed for 69 days).

1949, President Harry S. Truman nominated General Omar N. Bradley to become the first chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.
 1964, the Beatles movie "A Hard Day's Night" had its U.S. premiere in New York.
 1984, at the Los Angeles Olympics, American runner Mary Decker fell after colliding with South African-born British competitor Zola Budd in the 3,000-meter final; Budd finished seventh.
 1992, the Mall of America, the nation's largest shopping-entertainment center, opened in Bloomington, Minnesota.
 1997, President Bill Clinton made the first use of the historic line-item veto, rejecting three items in spending and tax bills. (However, the U.S. Supreme Court later struck down the veto as unconstitutional.)
 2012, Usain Bolt capped his perfect London Olympics by leading Jamaica to victory in a world-record 36.84 seconds in the 4x100 meters.
 2020, Democrat Joe Biden named California Sen. Kamala Harris as his running mate; Harris was the first Black woman on a major party's presidential ticket.

 1920, the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, guaranteeing American women's right to vote, was ratified as Tennessee became the 36th state to approve it.
 1954, during the Eisenhower administration, Assistant Secretary of Labor James Ernest Wilkins became the first Black official to attend a meeting of the president's Cabinet as he sat in for Labor Secretary James P. Mitchell.
 1969, the Woodstock Music and Art Fair in Bethel, New York, wound to a close after three nights with a mid-morning set by Jimi Hendrix.
 1993, a judge in Sarasota, Fla., ruled that Kimberly Mays, the 14-year-old girl who had been switched at birth with another baby, need never again see her biological parents, Ernest and Regina Twigg, in accordance with her stated wishes. (However, Kimberly later moved in with the Twiggs.)
 2016, At the Rio Games, Jamaica's Usain Bolt completed an unprecedented third consecutive sweep of the 100- and 200-meter sprints.

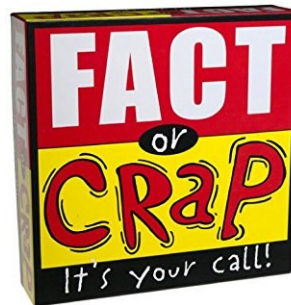

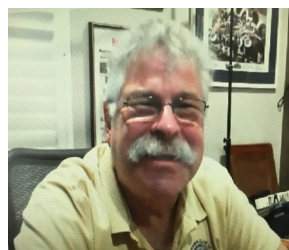
