Providing Independence for the Blind



Our program on February 21st was presented by Whitney Erasmus, Development Director for Lighthouse for the Blind. Since 1946, Lighthouse for the Blind of the Palm

Beaches has been providing direct education and rehabilitation services to people who are blind or visually impaired in Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie, Indian River, and Okeechobee counties.

They serve thousands of individuals of all ages: Children and young adults, People of working age, and Our area's fasting growing population with age-related vision loss.

They provide services to family members and caregivers of those who are blind. They offer consultation and education to businesses, agencies,

institutions, and organizations in the community that employ or interact with persons who are blind or visually impaired.

Lighthouse for the Blind of the Palm Beaches provides comprehensive developmental services for babies & children who are blind or visually impaired from birth to age 13. Visually Impaired Babies do not learn about their world the same way as sighted children. Their trained staff work with babies, their parents, and caregivers to help them understand how these babies learn and prepare them for their future. They also have programs for



Four Tips to Help You **Sleep Better**

Sleep is one of the most important things we do to stay healthy and energized. Much more goes into getting a good night's sleep than simply resting your head on the pillow, so here are some tips for getting your shut-eye:

- Increase bright light exposure during the day. You probably already know that it helps to keep your room dark while you sleep, but did you know it's also beneficial to get enough bright light during the day? These contrasts tell your body when it's time to go to sleep. This natural clock is called your circadian rhythm.
- Reduce blue light exposure in the evening. The luminance from our devices (smartphones, tablets, and TVs) is called blue light and can disrupt your sleep cycle. Try to limit blue light at least two hours before bedtime. Some devices offer a setting that automatically "warms" the light to limit these blue hues.
- Try to wake up and sleep consistently, even on weekends, as this is another way to set up your body's circadian rhythm for success.

Adjust your bedroom temperature. Did you know that the temperature in your bedroom can affect your sleep? Some studies show that temperature matters even more than noise, and some sleep experts recommend keeping your bedroom at around 70 degrees.

<u>February 8:</u>

1587, Mary, Queen of Scots was beheaded at Fotheringhay Castle in England after she was implicated in a plot to murder her cousin, Queen Elizabeth I. 1693, a charter was granted for the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg in the Virginia Colony.

Sunriser

1910, the Boy Scouts of America was incorporated.

1922, President Warren G. Harding had a radio installed in the White House. 1924, the first execution by gas in the United States took place at the Nevada State Prison in Carson City as Gee Jon, a Chinese immigrant convicted of murder,

1952, Queen Elizabeth II proclaimed her accession to the British throne following the death of her father, King George VI. 1960, work began on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, located on Hollywood

Boulevard and Vine Street in Los Angeles.

1965, Eastern Air Lines Flight 663, a DC-7, crashed shortly after takeoff from New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport; all 84 people on board were

1971, NASDAQ, the world's first electronic stock exchange, held its first trading

day.
2007, model, actor and reality TV star Anna Nicole Smith died in Hollywood,
Florida, at age 39 of an accidental drug overdose.
2020, the U.S. Embassy in Beijing said a 60-year-old U.S. citizen who'd been diagnosed with the coronavirus had died on Feb. 5 in Wuhan; it was apparently the first American fatality from the virus.

2023, Rescue teams in Turkey and Syria searched for signs of life in the rubble of thousands of buildings toppled by a catastrophic earthquake. The confirmed death toll from the world's deadliest quake in more than a decade approached 12,000 and eventually would be more than 50,000.

1876, inventors Alexander Graham Bell and Elisha Gray applied separately for patents related to the telephone. (The U.S. Supreme Court eventually ruled Bell the rightful inventor.)

1912, Arizona became the 48th state of the Union as President William Howard Taft signed a proclamation.

1924, the Computing-Tabulating-Recording Co. of New York was formally renamed International Business Machines Corp., or IBM.
1929, the "St. Valentine's Day Massacre" took place in a Chicago garage as seven

rivals of Al Capone's gang were gunned down

1967, Aretha Franklin recorded her cover of Otis Redding's "Respect" at Atlantic Records in New York.

1984, 6-year-old Stormie Jones became the world's first heart-liver transplant recipient when the surgery was performed at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. 2018, a gunman identified as a former student opened fire with a semi-automatic rifle at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School near Fort Lauderdale, Fla., killing 17 people in the nation's deadliest school shooting since the attack in Newtown, Conn., more than five years earlier. (Nikolas Cruz pleaded guilty to murder in October 2021 and was sentenced in November 2022 to life in prison without the possibility of parole.)

February 21:

1885, the Washington Monument was dedicated. 1911, composer Gustav Mahler, despite a fever, conducted the New York Philharmonic at Carnegie Hall in what turned out to be his final concert (he died the following May).

1964, the first shipment of U.S. wheat purchased by the Soviet Union arrived in the port of Odessa.

 $196\overline{5}$, minister and civil rights activist Malcolm X, 39, was shot to death inside Harlem's Audubon Ballroom in New York.

1972, President Richard M. Nixon began his historic visit to China as he and his wife, Pat, arrived in Beijing.

1975, former Attorney General John N. Mitchell and former White House aides H.R. Haldeman and John D. Ehrlichman were sentenced to 2 1/2 to 8 years in prison for their roles in the Watergate cover-up (each ended up serving 1 1/2 vears).

1992, Kristi Yamaguchi of the United States won the gold medal in ladies' figure skating at the Albertville Olympics; Midori Ito of Japan won the silver, Nancy Kerrigan of the U.S. the bronze.

1995, Chicago adventurer Steve Fossett became the first person to fly solo across the Pacific Ocean by balloon, landing in Leader, Saskatchewan, Canada. 2020, a temporary truce between the United States and the Taliban in Afghanistan took effect, setting the stage for the two sides to sign a peace deal the following week.

February 28:

1849, the California gold rush began in earnest as regular steamship service started bringing gold-seekers to San Francisco. 1911, President William Howard Taft nominated William H. Lewis to be the first

Black Assistant Attorney General of the United States. 1953, scientists James D. Watson and Francis H.C. Crick announced they had discovered the double-helix structure of DNA.

1993, a gun battle erupted at a religious compound near Waco, Texas, when Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms agents tried to arrest Branch Davidian leader David Koresh on weapons charges; four agents and six Davidians were killed as a 51-day standoff began.

1996, Britain's Princess Diana agreed to divorce Prince Charles. (Their 15-year marriage officially ended in August 1996; Diana died in a car crash in Paris a year

2013, Benedict XVI became the first pope in 600 years to resign, ending an eight -year pontificate. (Benedict was succeeded the following month by Pope Francis.) 2020, the number of countries touched by the coronavirus climbed to nearly 60. The Dow Jones Industrial Average finished the week 12.4% lower in the market's worst weekly performance since the 2008 financial crisis.

- 6. Fact. The 20 or so Gbe languages are most widely spoken across the area between Ghana and Nigeria.
- 7. Fact. Driesch proved that genetic material is not lost during cell division.

These Kiwanis clubs learned that first responders can make ideal project partners. Get inspired! By Julie Saetre

When your club is considering service project possibilities, don't overlook your community's first responders. They're committed to helping families and children stay safe and well, and they encounter a diverse group of community residents. That often makes them ideal project partners. Get inspiration from these Kiwanis club projects.

Connecting cops and kids

The **Kiwanis Club of Bluftton, South Carolina, U.S.**, donated dozens of basketballs, footballs, dodgeballs and other pieces of sporting equipment to the Bluffton Police Department. Officers use the items when on routine patrols to interact with children and young people. The officers will chat with a child or teen and sometimes play a quick game of catch — and then offer the ball as a gift. They've also used the items as a distraction to divert a child's attention from an accident or other troubling incident.

"It's a great way to build trust and rapport with children in the community," says Bluffton Police Sergeant Bonifacio Perez. "It helps build fun, not fear."

In Florida, U.S., a local program called <u>Dueling Dragons</u> brings together officers from the Orlando Police Department and young community residents to form teams that compete in dragon boat competitions. The program reaches out to the area's "invisible kids": inner-city youth who strive academically but receive neither praise (which is often reserved for athletic prowess) nor intervention (which is directed toward troubled behavior). When members of the **Orlando Kiwanis Club** heard about Dueling Dragons, they donated a 10-person practice boat and volunteered to provide cookouts for team members and scholarships to students.

Supporting safety and saving lives

The **Kiwanis Club of Brantwood**, **Ontario**, **Canada**, pioneered the <u>Children's Safety Village</u>, a two-acre town simulation where kids learn about staying safe in even the most dangerous situations. The club provided CA\$25,000 for start-up funds, and members have volunteered for thousands of service hours. The village includes classrooms, a fire-hazard apartment and a miniature town with roads and working traffic signals. Instructors from the Brantford Fire Department help kids identify fire hazards in the home and learn how to escape a burning building. Community constables demonstrate proper bicycle maintenance techniques and safety checks and explain the meaning of various road signs and signals.

In Arkansas, U.S., the **El Dorado Kiwanis Club** partnered with the El Dorado Fire Department and ProMed Ambulance service to launch a local Stop the Bleed campaign. A national awareness effort, Stop the Bleed helps bystanders — also known as immediate responders — become trained, equipped and empowered to help in an emergency involving a bleeding person. In Eldorado, ProMed Ambulance and the El Dorado Fire Department conducted Stop the Bleed training sessions. The Kiwanis club also held training sessions and provided training kits with supplies for packing wounds and applying tourniquets.
