Delicious Spoonfuls is all about empowering, training, and employment for people with Amazing Abilities (also known as Special Needs or Disabilities). They are serving ice



## Spring 2024 Police Appreciation

Our Spring 2024 Police Appreciation awards took place on April 10th at the Delray Beach Golf Club. We recognized Police Investigators CSI Karla Del Valle, CSI Tyler Corazzini, and CSS David Ackerman; and Detectives Teo Kyotikki and Tysen

Employee Awards: Last July, at approximately 4 o'clock in the afternoon, the Delray Beach Police Department received a call that a piece of luggage was located on the shore of the Intracoastal Waterway, north of the George Bush Bridge, with what appeared to be a human foot hanging out of the side of the case. CSI Corazzini was on duty and responded to the scene. Due to the nature of the call, CSS Ackerman and CSI Del Valle were also called in to assist with the investigation.

The investigators eventually responded to multiple locations and assisted with the removal of more pieces of luggage from the water, collecting and preserving all the evidence. It was noted that on the



first piece of luggage that was collected, there were distinct labels that would later help identify the unknown victim. This was just the beginning of all the work that was to come. The next day, Ackerman and Corazzini responded to the Medical Examiner's Office to continue to process evidence, CSI Del Valle responded to the area where the first suitcase was discovered to collect another bag related to the homicide. This time it was a tote bag containing additional human remains.

## Helping To Protect Our Water

Our program on April24th was presented by Ryan Rossi, the Director of the South Florida Water Coalition.

The SFWC is an advocate for environmental safety, where there's public concern for a number of important environmental issues including the threat of sea level rise along our coastal communities, and



the protection of our water resources. The goal of the SFWC to not only continue raising awareness to environmental matters, but to bring together a group of stakeholders that will work together to protect the water of future generations of South Floridians.

Over the last several years, how to manage Lake Okeechobee has been the center of much debate. The water levels, the discharge schedule, preventing toxic algae, and how to orient state and local water policies are all important conversations we need to have as a community - not turn communities against each other.

There is also general agreement with the science that our oceans will continue to rise as this century moves forward due to a changing climate; Florida will remain in a ground-zero scenario as this unfolds. Sealevel rise has created a water supply crisis: saltwater intrusion has infiltrated the porous Biscayne aguifer, corrupting many of South Florida's freshwater wells and threatening many more. Streets are often flooded by ordinary rain events, destroying property and creating dangerous conditions for residents. The SFWC supports protecting our freshwater aguifers, and implementing robust resiliency measures that will help prepare communities for the inevitable.

Recently, the Coalition has joined SEFLUC (Southeast Florida Utility Council) to partner with local utilities on maintaining healthy water supply for our area.

For those keeping score, Crime Scene Investigators had now collected a total of four bags all containing human remains, dismembered in some way, and decomposed to a degree. They were careful to note that each suitcase and the tote had unique identifiers

attached.



A week later, a lawful search warrant was executed on the residence of the suspect. After working their regularly scheduled shifts all day long, the Terrific Trio remained at work until approximately 7:30 in the evening and responded to

the residence where the search warrant was executed, which was now determined to be the primary homicide scene. The Trio worked nonstop through the night for the next eight hours, combing through the entire apartment, documenting, performing presumptive field testing and collecting items of evidentiary value. The only break they took during this entire process was a brief two-hour nap. When it was discovered that the suspect had access to a second apartment, the Trio spent the next twelve hours processing and dissecting not one homicide scene, but two. However, their job was not quite done just yet. During the course of the investigation, it was discovered that the suspect also had a separate storage unit, so on August 2 another lawful search warrant was executed at this location. It was here that the suspected equipment used to dismember and mutilate the victim was located. Crime Scene Investigators had to process and collect many more items, including DNA evidence.

On August 2, William Lowe Jr was arrested for premeditated murder of his wife. This summary is just a snapshot of the hard work and dedication that the Investigators poured into this case. They worked diligently and methodically to collect a record breaking 400 pieces of evidence that had to be processed and packaged appropriately, some of which had to be submitted the same day to the laboratory to confirm the victim's identification. Their work and efforts played a vital role in the imminent arrest of the suspect.

Officer Awards: On October 2nd, Detective Masi, who is assigned to the Palm Beach County South Florida Task Force, received information that a day-time burglary crew known to target vehicles in high-end neighborhoods was active in northern Palm Beach County. Det. Masi had reason to believe that these known suspects were traveling south and may possibly target the City of Delray Beach based on current crime trends and known intelligence. Det. Masi shared this knowledge with Detectives Teo Kyotikki and Tysen Sargent. The Detectives went to the Tropic Isle community which had been victimized weeks earlier. Within minutes of being in the area Detective Kyotikki located the vehicle and began conducting surveillance. Detectives, from the cover of unmarked vehicles, watched the subjects as they cased

the neighborhood. Knowing that these subjects were likely to victimize someone in the area they requested additional assets and assistance from the Palm Beach County Sheriffs Office South Florida Task Force and other agencies. Detectives and officers from multiple jurisdictions began to converge in the area to assist with surveillance. The team then followed the suspects as they cased multiple communities between Delray Beach and Parkland. The suspects were seen following people into gated communities in Parkland where they ultimately committed criminal acts.

Detectives Sargent and Kyotikki continued surveillance and observed these subjects commit 4 separate vehicle burglaries and were even able to video one of the incidents. Once the burglaries were confirmed and victim prosecution was obtained, the Broward Sheriffs Office Burglary Apprehension Team conducted a takedown on the vehicle at the Pompano Beach Turnpike service plaza

where the subjects were located and arrested inside with all the stolen property.

Many law enforcement professionals played an active role in capturing these subjects. However, due to Detective Kyotikki and Sargent's quick response to the area,



locating the suspect vehicle, excellent communication skills, extensive surveillance and observing the crimes in progress, these suspects that were involved in countless vehicle burglaries and auto thefts in Broward and Palm Beach County were apprehended, ending their ongoing crime spree.

Again, we can't thank these officers and investigators enough for their commitment and dedication, and we were pleased to present them with our Spring Recognition Awards.

## **Health-Related Social Needs** Can Keep Women from Getting **Lifesaving Mammograms**

#### 1 in 4

About 1 in 4 women ages 50 to 74 years had not received a mammogram in the past 2 years in 2022.

#### 3 in 10

About 3 in 10 women ages 50 to 74 years with 3 or more health-related social needs had not received a mammogram.

#### 2x

Women who reported cost as a barrier to access health care had about two times the odds of not getting a mammogram.

#### Screening mammograms can save lives

Breast cancer causes more than 40,000 deaths in women each year in the United States. Deaths due to breast cancer have decreased over time, yet some groups experience more deaths than others. For example, Black women, women who are uninsured, and women with low incomes are more likely to die from breast cancer. Screening mammograms have been shown to reduce breast cancer death by 22%.

#### Women face challenges to getting mammograms

The more health-related social needs a woman has in her life, the less likely she is to be up to date with mammograms that screen for breast cancer. Healthrelated social needs are adverse social conditions that can be barriers to a person's health or health care. Examples include social isolation, job loss, lack of reliable transportation, insecurity around food or housing, and cost to access health care. Cost to access health care is one of the biggest challenges.

#### Regular mammograms can find breast cancer early

Getting screening mammograms regularly can help find breast cancer early when it is easier to treat. Women ages 50 to 74 years should get a screening mammogram every 2 years, as currently recommended by the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force. The task force is a group of doctors and disease experts who look at research on the best way to prevent diseases. This group makes recommendations on how doctors can help patients avoid diseases or find them early. Women ages 40 to 49 years should talk to their health care providers about when to start and how often to get a mammogram.

As a regular feature of our weekly meetings, Ezra Krieg brings us up to date with what happened on "This Date in History" Here are a few interesting items from the past month:



#### <u> April 3:</u>

1865, Union forces occupied the Confederate capital of Richmond, Virginia. 1882, outlaw Jesse James was shot to death in St. Joseph, Missouri, by Robert Ford, a member of James' gang.

1936, Bruno Hauptmann was electrocuted in Trenton, New Jersey, for the kidnap-murder of 20-month-old Charles Lindbergh Jr. 1942, during World War II, Japanese forces began their final assault on Bataan against American and Filipino troops who surrendered six days later; the capitulation was followed by the notorious Bataan Death March.

1944, the U.S. Supreme Court, in Smith v. Allwright, struck down a Democratic Party of Texas rule that allowed only white voters to participate in Democratic primaries.

1948, President Harry S. Truman signed the Marshall Plan, designed to help European allies rebuild after World War II and resist communism.

1968, civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. delivered what turned out to be his final speech, telling a rally of striking sanitation workers in Memphis, Tennessee, that "I've been to the mountaintop" and "seen the Promised Land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight that we, as a people, will get to the Promised Land!" (About 20 hours later, King was felled by an assassin's bullet at the Lorraine Motel.)

1973, the first handheld portable telephone was demonstrated for reporters on a New York City street corner as Motorola executive Martin Cooper called Joel S.

Engel of Bell Labs.

2014, David Letterman announced during a taping of the "Late Show" on CBS that he would retire as host in 2015. (Stephen Colbert (kohl-BEHR') was named as his replacement a week later.)

#### <u> April 10:</u>

1866, the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals was incorporated.

1912, the British liner RMS Titanic set sail from Southampton, England, bound for New York on its ill-fated maiden voyage.

1947, Team President Branch Rickey called Jackie Robinson up to the Brooklyn Dodgers from their minor league affiliate the Montreal Royals. (Less than a week later, Robinson would become the first Black player in Major League Baseball when he took the field for the Dodgers.)

1963, the fast-attack nuclear submarine USS Thresher (SSN-593) sank during deep-diving tests east of Cape Cod, Massachusetts, in a disaster that claimed 129

1971, a table tennis team from the United States arrived in China at the invitation of the communist government for a goodwill visit that came to be

known as "ping-pong diplomacy."

1972, the United States and the Soviet Union joined some 70 nations in signing

an agreement banning biological warfare.

1998, the Northern Ireland peace talks concluded as negotiators reached a landmark settlement to end 30 years of bitter rivalries and bloody attacks. 2005, Tiger Woods won his fourth Masters with a spectacular finish of birdies and boaevs.

2017, Justice Neil Gorsuch took his place as the newest addition on the bench of the Supreme Court, restoring a narrow conservative majority.

2019, scientists released the first image ever made of a black hole, revealing a fiery, doughnut-shaped object in a galaxy 53 million light-years from earth.

#### <u> April 17:</u>

1521, Martin Luther went before the Diet of Worms (vohrms) to face charges stemming from his religious writings. (Luther was later declared an outlaw by

Holy Roman Emperor Charles V.)
1961, "The Apartment" won the Academy Award for best picture of 1960; Burt Lancaster was named best actor for "Elmer Gantry," while the best actress award went to Elizabeth Taylor for "Butterfield 8."

1961, some 1,500 CIA-trained Cuban exiles launched the disastrous Bay of Pigs invasion of Cuba in an attempt to topple Fidel Castro, whose forces crushed the incursion by the third day.

1964, Ford Motor Co. unveiled the Mustang at the New York World's Fair. 1969, a jury in Los Angeles convicted Sirhan Sirhan of assassinating Sen. Robert

F. Kennedy

1970, Apollo 13 astronauts James A. Lovell, Fred W. Haise and Jack Swigert splashed down safely in the Pacific, four days after a ruptured oxygen tank crippled their spacecraft while enroute to the moon.

1972, the Boston Marathon allowed women to compete for the first time; Nina Kuscsik was the first officially recognized women's champion, with a time of 3:10:26

1973, Federal Express (later FedEx) began operations as 14 planes carrying 186 packages took off from Memphis International Airport, bound for 25 U.S. cities. 1991, the Dow Jones industrial average closed above 3,000 for the first time, ending the day at 3,004.46, up 17.58.

1993, a federal jury in Los Angeles convicted two former police officers of violating the civil rights of beaten motorist Rodney King; two other officers were

acquitted.

#### April 24:

1877, federal troops were ordered out of New Orleans, ending the North's post-Civil War rule in the South.

1962, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology achieved the first satellite relay of a television signal, between Camp Parks, California, and Westford, Massachusetts.

1967, Soviet cosmonaut Vladimir Komarov was killed when his Soyuz ,1 spacecraft smashed into the Earth after his parachutes failed to deploy properly during re-entry; he was the first human spaceflight fatality.

1990, the space shuttle Discovery blasted off from Cape Canaveral, Florida, carrying the \$1.5 billion Hubble Space Telescope.
2018, former police officer Joseph DeAngelo was arrested at his home near Sacramento, California, after DNA linked him to crimes attributed to the socalled: Golden State Killer; authorities believed he committed 13 murders and more than 50 rapes in the 1970s and 1980s. (DeAngelo would plead guilty in 2020 to 13 counts of murder and be sentenced to life in prison without parole.)

2020, the Food and Drug Administration issued an alert about the dangers of using a malaria drug that President Donald Trump had repeatedly promoted for coronavirus patients. The parent company of Lysol and another disinfectant warned that its products should not be used as an internal treatment for the coronavirus, a day after Trump wondered aloud about that prospect during a White House briefing.
